God Sends Quail and Manna

Exodus 16:1-26



The People Become Hungry in the Wilderness

Approximately 30 days had passed since the Hebrew people left Egypt. Apparently the food they had brought with them had run out, and they began complaining. How quickly they had forgotten the oppression of the Egyptians! The people were just starting to get to know God, and they had very little framework to realize God would provide for them. This event marks a learning point for the Israelites.

God's Glory Shown to the People

We don't know exactly what "the glory of the Lord" was that the Israelites saw in the morning, but it was a visible sign to them (perhaps like the cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night mentioned in Exodus 13). God wanted Israel to know that he was still there, that he was aware of their need, and that he was going to provide for them.

God Provides for the People

When the manna appeared the first morning, the Hebrews' question "What is it?" apparently caught on as its name because manna means "What is it?" Though some have suggested various possibilities for what manna was, nothing we know of today is a good match for the description given in Exodus 16:31: "It was white like coriander seed and tasted like wafers made with honey."

The miraculous nature of manna is further exhibited in what happened to it over the course of a Sabbath as opposed to a weekday. The Israelites were not to work on the Sabbath but to keep it as a day for worship. Gathering manna on the Sabbath would have been work, so God simply didn't make it appear. If anyone tried to keep manna from one weekday to the next, it would spoil. However, if anyone kept it

from the morning before the Sabbath, it would stay good through the Sabbath.

The Jesus Connection

God is our provider. Everything we have is from God, and he has provided a way for us to have a relationship with him through Jesus.

What do you find yourself wanting more than anything? How often do you view this desire as a need? It's important to recognize the difference. God allowed the Hebrews to live as slaves for many years. When God decided they needed to leave Egypt, he provided the miraculous opportunity to do so.

Our greatest need is to honor and glorify God. Regardless of our wants, we're fulfilled when living in God's will. Write a prayer here to glorify God for giving you what you need.

Feather Tickles

What You'll Do

Have an infant sit or lie on a blanket in front of you. Hold the feather out to the baby.

Say: This is a feather. Birds have feathers. God gave birds feathers to keep them warm and dry. God sent me to you to help keep you warm and dry. ▶ GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED.

Gently stroke baby's chin, arms, and tummy with the feather. Say: God knows what your chin needs. God knows what your arms need. God knows what your tummy needs. ▶ GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED.

When You Need...

What You'll Do

Lay a baby on a blanket for this activity, or do the activity during changing time.

Say: When you need food, God provides. (gently touch baby's lips)

When you need a smile, God provides. (smile at baby)

When you need to be washed, God provides. (flutter fingers down to baby's tummy like rain)

When you need calm and quiet, God provides. (speak in a whisper)

When you need love, God provides. (gather baby in a hug)

Hold baby in your arms. Say: God loves us very much. ► GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED. I'm glad God gave me you!

God Provides Quail

What You'll Do

Gather one or two toddlers together. Place the feather and round crackers behind your back. Open your Bible to Exodus 16:1-26, and point to the words.

Say: The Bible tells of a time the Israelites were very hungry. Slightly bend over, and hold your tummy while you talk. They walked a long way in the hot, dry desert. They didn't stop to eat. Some of them were so hungry that they began crying. Trace imaginary tears down your cheeks.

Say: Moses prayed to God, "The people are hungry, God." God heard Moses and gave the people food. God sent yummy quail to eat for dinner. Pull out the feather. This feather is from a bird like a quail. The Israelites had to catch the birds. Can you catch this feather? Drop the feather, giving each child a chance to catch it.

Say: God also sent the Israelites food to eat for breakfast and lunch. The food might have tasted like these yummy crackers. Would you like to taste a cracker? Let each child have a cracker. These crackers remind us that ▶ GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED, too. Thank you, God!

Feed the Birds

What You'll Do

Say: God provided the food the Israelites needed. God provides what we need, too. Let's make bird feeders that'll provide for the birds' needs just as God provides for our needs.

Give each child a cardboard circle on a sheet of wax paper. Spread one side of the cardboard circles with nontoxic glue. Help children stick bread cubes onto the glue. Watch carefully that bread cubes covered with glue don't go into toddlers' mouths. As they work, play the song "He Cares for You" (1 Peter 5:7) (track 4 on the CD) in the background.

When a toddler is finished, put his or her name on the completed bird feeder, and set it aside for the glue to dry. Wash and dry each child's hands. Remind toddlers that **GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED.**

Say: Watch my fingers and hands. Do what I do as we thank God for giving us what we need.

Say: Plants need water.

Thank you, God, for rain. (flutter fingers from sky)

Thank you, God, for shady trees. (hold hands over head)

Birds need food to eat.

Thank you, God, for wiggly worms. (wiggle index finger like a worm)

Children need lots of love.

Thank you, God, for loving families. (wrap arms around self in hug)

Afterward, say: ► GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED. Thank you, God! Lead children in standing and saying, "Yay, God!"



What You'll Do

Sing or listen to "God Gives Me What I Need" (track 3 on the CD) to the tune of "The Farmer in the Dell" anytime during the lesson. Before singing, practice hopping and jumping skills. As you sing, lead children in hopping and jumping in time to the first verse and twirling around to the second verse.

Afterward, say: ▶ GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED.

Food and Fun

What You'll Do

Put two round crackers on a paper towel for each child, and spread the paper towels on the floor in one area of the room. Invite 2-year-olds to sit on the floor with you away from the crackers. Open your Bible to Exodus 16:1-26, and show children the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Today we're learning about how the Israelites wandered in the desert. The desert was different from their old home in Egypt. Nothing grew there...no lettuce, apples, bananas, or other good food. The Israelites were running out of the food they carried with them. They were hungry. Let's pretend we're hungry. Have children imitate you by holding their tummies and saying, "I'm hungry." Some of the children were so hungry that they even cried. Let's pretend to cry from hunger. Have children pretend to cry and wipe tears from their eyes.

Say: Moses heard the children crying. He asked God for food. God heard Moses' prayer and answered by sending birds called quail. The quail landed on the ground around the Israelites. Shine a flashlight on the floor near the children. Pretend there's quail landing near you! Try to catch the quail so you can eat it for dinner. Encourage each child to "catch" the beam of light before you move on to another child. God provided quail for the Israelites to eat.

God also gave the Israelites food called manna to gather off the ground each day. The manna tasted a little like our crackers. Hold up one cracker for the children to see. Each day the Israelites gathered manna to feed their families. Would you like to gather some pretend manna? Point out the crackers on the paper towels. Tell children they can gather two crackers each. Before we eat our crackers, let's thank God and remember that

GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED. When I count to three, we'll say, "Thank you, God." One, two, three...Thank you, God.

Call several 2-year-olds to come sit in front of the box of items you gathered ahead of time.

Say: God gave the Israelites quail and manna when they needed food.
GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED, too. I have several surprises in my box. Each one is something we might need. Help me figure out when we would use each of the surprises. Hold up the umbrella. When do we need to use an umbrella? Allow time for kids to respond. Hold up the plate. When do we need to use a plate? Allow time for kids to respond. Hold up the shoe. When do we need to use a shoe? Allow time for kids to respond. Hold up the mittens. When do we need to use mittens? Allow time for kids to respond. Hold up the toothbrush. When do we need to use a toothbrush? Allow time for kids to respond.

Say: We need food to eat, shelter from rain, and clothes to wear. I'm glad ▶ GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED.

Match the Need

What You'll Do

Say: The Israelites needed food to eat because they were hungry. God gave them quail and manna to meet their needs. God meets the needs of every creature. Let's play a game that matches something God created with how God meets that thing's need. Spread the pieces from the puzzle on the floor where each child can see them. Hold up the picture of the bear.

Ask:

Who can tell me what this is?

When the bear is correctly identified, ask:

Which picture shows what the bear needs?

Let children see the pictures of the watering can, the cave, and the nest. Affirm with the children that the bear needs a cave to sleep in. Match the bear and cave pieces, and set them aside.

Say: Thank you, God, for giving the bear what it needs. ▶ GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED, too. Thank you, God. Repeat the game for each of the pictures. Then give each 2-year-old his or her envelope with the puzzle pieces inside. Let children move far enough apart to work on their own puzzles.

While twos are working, play the song "He Cares for You" (1 Peter 5:7) (track 4 on the CD).

How Does God Meet a Parent's Needs?

The responsibility of caring for your child's needs 24 hours a day, seven days a week, can be a heavy one... especially in the first few months of your child's life. God planned for your needs by programming babies to respond to your efforts first with eye contact, then with smiles and coos, and finally with sticky hugs and kisses. When you're feeling particularly stressed by the demands of care giving, take a step back to really focus on what your child brings to your life.



Your child learned God gives us what we need (from Exodus 16:1-26). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

When do we use a toothbrush? Allow time.

Say: We need food to eat, shelter from rain, and clothes to wear. God gives us what we need.

Sing "Thank You for the Food We Eat" to the tune of "This Old Man" as a mealtime prayer:

Thank you for the food we eat.
Thank you for the world so sweet.
Thank you, God, for all the things you do.
And, dear Jesus, I love you.


Recognize your child's emotional needs as well as his or her physical ones by identifying times your child needs a hug. Celebrate the fact that God gave you each other to fulfill this need.







