The Israelites Build the Tabernacle

Exodus 35:4-36:38



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Generous Offerings

It was time for the Israelites to build a portable dwelling place for the worship of God. When Moses asked for contributions, the people gave generously. Apparently the events of the previous months inspired them to give to God. They may have realized how they had wronged God in worshipping the golden calf and wanted to do what they could to make amends for the damage done. They gave so generously that eventually they had to be told to stop bringing more materials (Exodus 36:6-7)!

One might wonder where these former slaves got gold and fine cloth to donate to the Tabernacle. The answer lies in the generosity of the Egyptians as the Israelites were escaping. God told the Hebrews to ask for things from the Egyptians; the Egyptians responded with silver, gold, and clothing (Exodus 12:35-36).

Talented Workers

Not only did the Hebrews give things, but they gave time and talents as well. This passage singles out Bezalel and Oholiab as the leaders of the workers and also mentions women skilled in spinning goat hair (Exodus 35:26) and other skilled and willing people (Exodus 36:2).

Willing Worship

What can we learn from this event? Serving God involves all kinds of different tasks and abilities. If you can't build a structure, maybe you can spin cloth. If you can't sing, maybe you can tell a co-worker about Jesus. Each one of us has God-given abilities and spiritual gifts. God wants us to use what he's given us to serve and honor him in whatever ways we can. God can use anyone to serve him and to further his kingdom here on earth. The only thing stopping our service to him is ourselves.

The Jesus Connection

Our relationship with Jesus gives us daily opportunities to serve him. He is our friend, our Creator, and our Savior. Service is a choice we make on a daily basis. But how often do you analyze your motives for serving? Wrong motives can rob us of blessings and limit our effectiveness in service.

For the Christian, service comes out of thankfulness for salvation and devotion to honor our Creator. If we are not serving for those reasons, perhaps we're really self-serving. Write a prayer here asking God to refine and hone your heart as you serve today and each day going forward.

What Did They Bring?

The people had many things they could give to help make this wonderful place. Hand out the cutouts from the teaching picture and the fabric squares to children. These are the kinds of things the people brought. Let children hand you the things they're holding.

Say: Some people gave pretty fabric to help. Some people gave silver and gold to help. Describe each object a child gives you. Everyone served God by giving things to help build a special house for God. ▶ WE ALL CAN SERVE GOD and be helpers in God's house, too.



Ball Pickup

Gather two or three toddlers around a basket full of balls. Help the toddlers tip the basket over and watch the balls roll away. Encourage the children to be helpers by gathering the balls back into the basket. For more of a challenge, you can direct the children to get a big ball or to get a small ball and put it into the basket. Clap each time a child gets a ball back into the basket.

Say: Who has a shape just like this one? Have the children look carefully at the shape each person is holding. Which shape is the same? When the children match the shapes, praise their efforts. Repeat for the other two shapes.

Hold up the gems. Say: These are precious gems. God asked the Israelites to serve him by bringing gems like these to a special building. Show the "Special Building for God" teaching picture. ▶ WE ALL CAN SERVE GOD, too. Find the place your gems belong on this picture. Lay the teaching picture on the floor. Help toddlers place the gems over the matching shapes on the picture. You're serving by bringing your gems to church just as the Israelites did.

Give the envelopes with the paper gems to parents as they pick up their children.

Bright Colors

What You'll Do

Give each child one piece of red, blue, yellow, or brown construction paper, distributing at least one of each color. Keep a stack of the same colors with you. Hold up the corresponding color of construction paper each time that color is mentioned when you tell about building the Tabernacle. Direct the children to hold up their papers when their colors match what you're holding up.

Say: Very long ago there were people who wanted to build a wonderful place to worship God. God told them exactly how to build it. They had many things they wanted to give to build that beautiful place. God asked the people who had red cloth to bring red cloth. Hold up the red paper. God asked the people who had blue cloth to bring blue cloth. Hold up the blue paper. God asked the people who had lots of gold jewelry to give the gold jewelry. Hold up the yellow paper. Some people wanted to give brown animal skins. Hold up the brown paper. All the people served God, making the beautiful building from the things they gave to God. WE ALL CAN SERVE GOD in our church, too.

Show children "The Israelites Build the Tabernacle" poster (from the Big Bible Poster Pack). Cut the colored paper into small enough pieces so that each child has a piece of each color. Help children tape their pieces of paper to the poster to make it beautiful, just as the Israelites decorated the Tabernacle to make it beautiful for God.



Personal Space


God gave exact instructions for the design of his Tabernacle. It was to be a place that reflected his grandeur. Children love places that are designed to reflect who they are, too, Perhaps your child has the luxury of his or her own room. Or your child's "spot" might be a place to put his or her things, such as a carpet square next to a bin of toys, or a cardboard box. A baby as young as 9 or 10 months old can benefit from a unique space. Let your child develop a sense of pride in arranging and organizing his or her special space. Encourage other members of the family to respect it.










Gem Shapes


