Numbers 22:1-38

oung children aren't ready developmentally to pay attention for long periods of time. Toddlers and twos absorb life in small bites. Longer attention spans will develop in the latter preschool and early elementary years. However, don't be surprised if a child occasionally shows great attention to a particular toy, game, or project. Try not to interrupt the child when that happens. As much as possible, let your little ones dictate the flow of activity in your nursery. By letting them remain focused on an activity of their choosing, you're encouraging them to develop the attentiveness that's necessary for listening to God.

# Balaam's Donkey Talks

Numbers 22:1-38



# The Fortuneteller

This event takes place near the end of the Israelites' time of wandering in the desert. They had defeated a few adversaries in their travels and were approaching the Promised Land again. The leader of Moab was afraid of what Israel might do to his land, so he sought the help of Balaam.

Apparently Balaam was a widely known fortuneteller, or diviner, who made his living through his divination. He probably believed in many gods and would consult anyone, including the Lord, who could help him earn his fees.

## **A Wrong Motive**

Even though Balaam called upon the Lord and spoke God's words to the people sent by Balak, Balaam's underlying motive was for selfish gain.

When God had told Balaam "no" the first time, Balaam should have taken that as a final answer. But when Balaam came back to God a second time, it was clear that Balaam's desire for financial gain was greater than his desire to do what God told him. In letting Balaam go but not letting him do anything that would please Balak, God was showing how he disliked Balaam's money-hungry attitude.

God let Balaam go with Balak's men, but God was angry because he knew that Balaam was acting from self-interest and greed.

# A Talking Donkey?

Not being able to see the angel his donkey saw must have been a huge insult to Balaam, who prided himself on knowing and seeing spiritual things. Certainly Balaam was humiliated when the donkey had to speak in order to get him to see reality. Balaam had been blinded by his desire for riches. God finally opened his eyes to the angel standing in the path and to the evil of what Balaam had been doing.

## **Speaking God's Words**

After getting Balaam's attention through the donkey and the angel, God let Balaam know that he wanted Balaam to go through with his trip but to speak only what God said. This whole event was intended to help Balaam think clearly and to know that he had to do what God told him.

#### **The Jesus Connection**

God is always doing things in us and through us, but we can sometimes forget that and stop paying attention to him. When we let our focus stay on God, we can be used more easily by him. Write the most recent thing you can remember that helped you see					
God at work. Ask God to help you pay attention to him in the big and small things in your life. You can write your prayer on the lines below.



#### What You'll Do

Have toddlers sit on the floor near the CD player. Play "Balaam's Donkey (Toddlers & 2s)" (track 12 on the CD) for toddlers. Each time you hear the donkey say "Heehaw, heehaw," encourage children to put their hands on their heads like ears, wiggle their hands, and say "heehaw."

Afterward, say: ▶ PAY ATTENTION TO GOD.

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# **Donkey Picture**

### What You'll Do

Give each child a "Donkey" handout.

Say: Balaam listened to his donkey with his ears. We can use our ears to ▶ PAY ATTENTION TO GOD. Let's glue brown construction paper to the donkey's ears. Help children glue small pieces of brown construction paper to the donkey's ears on their handouts. We can pay attention to God with our eyes, too. God opened Balaam's eyes to see the angel blocking the road. Let's color the donkey's eyes. Let children use crayons to color the donkey's eyes. We can use our noses and mouths to ▶ PAY ATTENTION TO GOD. Let's color the noses and mouths on our donkeys. Help children until everyone has finished making the picture. We can use our whole bodies to ▶ PAY ATTENTION TO GOD. Let toddlers finish coloring their pictures any way they choose.



# Where Is Balaam's Donkey?

#### What You'll Do

Gather two or three toddlers together. Use the "Balaam and His Donkey" teaching picture with the following rhyme. Start out with Balaam off the donkey. Have children take turns following the instructions in the parentheses after each line.

Say: Where is Balaam's donkey? Is she going for a walk? (have a child point to the donkey)

Where is Balaam's donkey? The Lord God made her talk. (have a child point to the donkey's mouth)

God used Balaam's donkey to help Balaam hear. (have a child point to Balaam's ears)
God used Balaam's donkey to make his point so clear. (have a child point to his or
her own ears)

The donkey spoke to Balaam, and then Balaam heard. (help a child put Balaam on the donkey's back)

The donkey spoke to Balaam. Balaam heard every word. (have a child point to his or her own ears)

Afterward, say: **We** ▶ **PAY ATTENTION TO GOD.**



# Sing and Celebrate

### What You'll Do

# Hear the Donkey!

#### What You'll Do

Have 2-year-olds sit on the floor near the CD player. Play "Balaam's Donkey (Toddlers & 2s)" (track 12 on the CD). Each time you hear the donkey say "Heehaw, heehaw," encourage children to put their hands on their heads like ears, wiggle their hands, and say "heehaw."

Afterward, say: Let's pretend to be Balaam's donkey. Have children crawl around the room on all fours, pretending to be Balaam's donkey. Designate an object, such as a chair, to be Balaam. Place the chair in the middle of the room. Tell children that each time they pass by "Balaam," they should say, "Heehaw. PAY ATTENTION TO GOD."



# **Balaam's Donkey Puppet**

#### What You'll Do

Say: We can pay attention to God with our ears; we can listen to God. Balaam listened to his donkey speak when God allowed the donkey to talk. Let's glue the donkey's ears on the bottom of the sack. Help each child glue the ears in the correct spot on their puppets.

Say: We can PAY ATTENTION TO GOD with our eyes by reading the Bible and looking at how others live. God opened Balaam's eyes to see the angel blocking the road. Let's glue the donkey's eyes in place. Help children glue the eyes in the correct spot on their puppets.

Say: We can use our nose and mouth to PAY ATTENTION TO GOD. Balaam used his mouth to talk to the donkey. Help children glue the nose and mouth on their donkey puppets. Let children use crayons to decorate their puppets in any way they choose.

Have children put the puppets on their hands and say this rhyme, repeating each line after you and doing the actions in parentheses.

The donkey saw God's angel, and she stopped in her tracks. (have a child point to his or her own eyes)

Balaam was so angry, he got off his donkey's back. (have a child take Balaam off the donkey's back)

Balaam was so angry that he gave the donkey a smack. (have a child show a mean face)

The donkey opened her mouth and asked, "Do you mind? (have a child point to the donkey's mouth)

"Why are you being so mean and unkind?" (have a child pet the donkey)

God used Balaam's donkey to make Balaam hear. (have a child point to Balaam's ears)

God used Balaam's donkey to make his message clear. (have a child put Balaam back on the donkey)

"Pay attention when God speaks to you," said God to the man.

"Pay attention when God speaks to you. Now do you understand?"

Afterward, say: ▶ PAY ATTENTION TO GOD.

# **Growing With Jesus**



### Building Attention Skills

The technology of our time seems to cause us to rush through life at an ever-quickening pace. As a result, we rarely pay attention to any one task for very long. Paying attention is the single most important skill our children need for learning. Just as God had to get Balaam's attention before he could speak to him, we must get our children's attention before we can teach them anything of lasting value. Help your child pay attention by playing simple games that require him or her to concentrate, such as Simon Says or a memory card game.



Your child learned to pay attention to God (from Numbers 22:1-38). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

Get on the floor on all fours with your infant. Pretend to be a donkey.

Say: Here is Balaam's donkey. Can you see her walk?

Afterward, say: We pay attention to God.

Encourage your child to pretend to be a donkey and say this rhyme, repeating each line after you and doing the actions in parentheses.

Say: I can pay attention with my eyes—blink, blink. (blink eyes twice on "blink, blink")

I can pay attention with my mind—think, think. (tap forehead twice on "think, think")

I can pay attention with my hands—watch this. (pat leg twice on "watch this")

I can pay attention with my nose—sniff, sniff. (point to nose on "sniff, sniff")

I can pay attention with my ears—listen now. (cup hand around ear on "listen now")

I can pay attention to God—oh wow! (jump up and down on "oh wow!")

### Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Help your child use his or her ears to pay attention to the sounds of God's world. Sit with your child outside with your eyes closed. What sounds do you hear?
- Say a simple prayer, thanking God for ears to hear. Ask God to help you always pay attention to him.




