# Joshua Sends Spies to Jericho

Joshua 2:1-24



# A Different Method

As Joshua prepared to send spies into the Promised Land, no doubt he remembered the fiasco of 40 years earlier when Moses sent a large group of spies into the land. This time Joshua sent only two and gave them a very specific mission: Investigate Jericho. He sent them "secretly," not wanting the Canaanites to know what they were doing and probably also to protect the Israelites from the distressful result of the first spy mission.

## **Good Gossip**

It may seem suspicious that the place the spies went was to the home of a prostitute. However, it's likely that this was a place where gossip would abound. In addition, the word most often translated "prostitute" can just as accurately be translated "innkeeper." Either way, it was a place where the spies were able to hear and gauge how the people of Jericho felt about the Israelites who were camped just across the Jordan River.

#### A Woman of Faith

Rahab, though she lied about hiding the spies in her house, had apparently become a believer in God through what she had heard about the Israelites' experiences and conquests. She hid the men at great personal risk. She was commended for her strong faith in the New Testament in Hebrews 11:31. Note that God did not commend her for lying but for acting in faith and hiding the spies. God blessed her for that faith.

The end of this event lies beyond the scope of today's passage. During the victory over Jericho, Rahab and her family were indeed spared from death (Joshua 6:17). Moreover, the New Testament attests to her faithfulness and includes her in the line of King David and of Jesus (Matthew 1:5)!

# The Jesus Connection

Rahab's faith landed her among Jesus' ancestors. When we venture forth with a small act of faith, God responds and shows us his much larger faithfulness. In what areas of your life would you like to show more faithfulness to God? What are some ways you've seen God's faithfulness to you? You can write your prayer asking God to use you to do big things. There's nothing too big for the God of the universe who wants to lead and guide your life.

# **Hide the Spies**

#### What You'll Do

Lay two dolls on the floor near an infant. Give the infant a blanket.

Say: Here are the spies. The spies believed in God. Rahab hid the spies. Rahab believed in God. Can you help me hide the spies? Help baby put the blanket over the dolls.

Say: The spies are hiding. Where are they? Look in several places for the spies; then help the infant pull the blanket off the dolls. You found them, safe and sound! Rahab believed in God. The spies believed in God. God kept the spies and Rahab safe. We can **BELIEVE IN GOD** and trust that he'll keep us safe, too.

# I Spy

#### What You'll Do

Lay an infant on a blanket on the floor or on a changing table, and say the following rhyme.

- I spy with my eyes a baby named [baby's name]. (look through hands like binoculars; then touch baby's tummy when you say his or her name)
- I spy with my eyes a baby God adores. (look through hands like binoculars; then gently rub baby's head)
- I spy with my eyes a baby God cares for. (look through hands like binoculars; then rub baby's hands)
- I spy with my eyes a baby God loves! (look through hands like binoculars; then hold baby's hands and clap once for each word on "a baby God loves!")

Say: God loves you, little baby, and you can ▶ BELIEVE IN GOD.

The spies believed in God. Wave the ribbon in the air. Rahab hid the spies from their enemies. Point to Rahab in the poster. Rahab believed in God. Wave the ribbon in the air. The spies climbed through the window. Point to the spies in the poster. They trusted God to take care of them. The spies believed in God. Wave the ribbon in the air. Rahab tied a red rope in her window. Point to the red ribbon taped to the poster. She trusted God to take care of her. Rahab believed in God. Wave the ribbon in the air. We can trust that God will take care of us, too. We can BELIEVE IN GOD. Wave the ribbon in the air.

Collect the ribbon strips from the toddlers for use in the next activity.





## The Window

#### What You'll Do

Give each child a "Rahab's Window" handout and a piece of string.

Say: Rahab believed in God. She helped the spies go out the window with a rope. Show children how to open their windows by folding back the flap in the window. Help each child tape one end of the string to the back of his or her handout so that the string can be dropped through the window. Then help children drop the strings through the windows. Rahab put a red rope in her window to remind people she believed in God. Give each child a red-ribbon strip. Help each child tape one end of the ribbon strip to the back of his or her handout so that the ribbon strip hangs in the window. Because Rahab put the red rope in her window, God protected Rahab and her family. The red rope reminded people that Rahab believed in God. The red ribbon can remind you to BELIEVE IN GOD, too. Set aside the completed handouts with children's names on them for kids to take home.

# Hidden Spies

#### What You'll Do

Gather one or two toddlers. Say: I'm going to be Rahab and hide you. Cover the toddlers with a blanket. If toddlers resist being covered completely, keep one end of the blanket up so they can still see out. In a deep voice, ask: Where are the spies? Are the spies hiding? I can't find any spies anywhere. I might as well go away. Use your natural voice, and say: You can come out now! God protected you just as he protected the spies at Rahab's house. As the children come out of hiding, cheer with them. Yay, God! You kept us safe. We believe in you!

Point to Rahab in the poster. Rahab believed in God. Have children say, "Believe in God" and wave the ribbon. The spies climbed out through the window. Point to the spies in the poster. They trusted God to keep them safe. The spies believed in God. Have children say, "Believe in God" and wave the ribbon. Rahab tied a red rope in her window so Joshua and the soldiers would remember that Rahab believed in God. Point to the red ribbon taped to the poster. Have children say, "Believe in God" and wave their ribbon. Rahab trusted God to keep her safe. We can trust God to take care of us and keep us safe, too. We can ▶BELIEVE IN GOD. Have children repeat, "Believe in God" and wave their ribbons.

## Rahab's Window

#### What You'll Do

Give each child a "Rahab's Window" handout. Say the following rhyme, stopping to help children tape the string and ribbon to the back of their windows at the appropriate times. Tape both pieces on the back of the handout so that they can be dropped out of the window.

Say: **Here is Rahab's window. She can look out at the sky.** (show children how to open their windows)

Rahab believed in God. She helped God's spies hide.

Here is the rope that helped them get away. (give each child a piece of string)

She lowered it out the window, late in the day. (tape the string on the back of each paper so it can hang out the bottom of the window)

Here is the red rope she hung for all to see. (give each child a red-ribbon strip)

The red rope was a sign to keep them safe—Rahab and her family. (tape the ribbon on the back of each paper so it can hang out the top of the window)

Read the rhyme several times, allowing children to lower the string and the ribbon at the appropriate times.

Say: ▶ BELIEVE IN GOD.

# Rahab's Rope Bracelets

## What You'll Do

Work with one 2-year-old at a time to make a special rope-bracelet reminder of Rahab's belief in God. Have a child hold the center of a 2-foot-long piece of red yarn. As the child holds the yarn, begin twisting the ends together.

Say: Rahab believed in God. She may have thought about God often. Then one day some other people who believed in God came to visit. They were spies. They needed a place to hide. She hid them because she believed in God. Continue twisting until the yarn is wound tight.

When it was time for the spies to leave, they said, "Take this red rope (show the child the rope that's been created), and hang it in your window. Then you and your family will be safe when we come back." Let's tie this red rope on your wrist to show that you ▶BELIEVE IN GOD, too.

# Growing Faith

Children believe in what they experience, what we talk about with them, and what they observe in us. Try adopting the following practices to help your child see the significance your belief in God has to you.

- Make your times of sharing God brief and spontaneous rather than long and structured. It's more important that your children hear you recognizing God in your daily conversations than see you praying for long stretches.
- Let your child hear you talk to God on his or her behalf as you snuggle and cuddle.

In a deep voice, ask: Where are the spies? Are the spies hiding? I can't find any spies anywhere. I might as well go away. Use your natural voice, and say: You can come out now! God protected you just as he protected the spies at Rahab's house. As your child comes out of hiding, cheer with him or her. Yay, God! You kept us safe. We believe in vou! We believe in God.

#### 2-YEAR-OLD

#### Rahab's Rope Bracelets

As your child holds the center of a 2-foot-long piece of red yarn, begin twisting the ends together.

Say: Rahab believed in God. One day some spies who believed in God came to visit. They needed a place to hide. She hid them because she believed in God. Continue twisting until the yarn is wound tight.

When it was time for the spies to leave, they said, "Take this red rope (show your child the rope that's been created), and hang it in your window. Then you and your family will be safe when we come back." Let's tie this red rope on your wrist to show that you believe in God, too.

#### Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Use the cardboard tube from a roll of paper towels as a spyglass. Play I Spy with the spyglass to find things in your house. Talk about how we can find things we can't see but we believe in and we know are there, such as your love for God.
- Pray this simple prayer together:

I believe in you, God, and I know that pleases you. I believe in you, God, because you asked me to. In Jesus' name, amen.
