Joshua 6:1-27

nfants and toddlers naturally live in a state of vulnerability and dependency on others. They can do almost nothing for themselves and depend on parents, teachers, and even older siblings to exercise power on their behalf. Simple acts such as changing a diaper, offering a snack, or helping a child reach a toy on a shelf can be a tangible example of how someone can use his or her power for the benefit of others. And when you do that, you're laying a foundation for children to understand how God uses his power to help them, too.

God Gives Victory Over Jericho

Joshua 6:1-27



God Promises Victory at Jericho

Archaeologists have found the site of ancient Jericho but are still uncertain which city is the one delivered into the hands of the Israelites because it has been destroyed so many times. In light of the curse put upon Jericho in Joshua 6:26, the archaeological findings are interesting indeed.

Joshua Receives a Message From God

While scouting out the city, Joshua was no doubt surprised to see a man with a drawn sword in front of him (Joshua 5:13). We don't know if this was an appearance of God himself, a preincarnate appearance of Jesus, or an angel; however, we do know that he was someone sent from God. Notice how the messenger responds to Joshua's question: "Are you for us or for our enemies?" The messenger was the commander of the Lord's army. It was up to Joshua and Israel to be on the Lord's side, not for the commander to be on Joshua's side!

In the middle of God's message to Joshua, the writer stops to mention a very important fact in Joshua 6:1: The people of Jericho had closed up their city, counting on its strong fortifications to protect them. It was so firmly sealed that no one could go in or out. This meant that no one from Jericho would get in the way as the Israelites marched around the city walls!

God Fulfills the Promise

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Notice that God not only told Joshua what to do but also told him precisely what would happen (Joshua 6:5). Assuming that the word from God spread among the Israelites, imagine their increasing anticipation as the army marched silently around the city day after day and then seven times on the seventh day. The people knew that God was about to do something spectacular! Just as promised, Rahab and her family were spared because of the faith she had shown in hiding the Hebrew spies. God's power worked to save her and the Israelites, while at the same time it was working to destroy the inhabitants of Jericho for their idolatry and immorality.

The Jesus Connection

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A relationship with Jesus allows us to walk in confidence, as his power of forgiveness has given us freedom. His love for us provides us with what we need to be clean in his perfect eyes.

Take a few minutes to write down as many words of prayer as you can that show the character of God. Each day, meditate on one of these characteristics and how God has shown those characteristics in your life. Give God praise, and acknowledge God's mighty work in your life.

What You'll Do

Hold an infant on your lap. Show the baby the party horn. Say: **This is a horn.** Let the baby touch and hold the horn. Take the horn back, and hold it to your lips. Without blowing through the horn, hum into the horn the song "God Is Powerful" (see previous activity) to the tune of "Bingo."

Say: Joshua and the children of Israel marched around the city of Jericho for seven days. Whisper: On the first six days they were quiet. Hold your finger to your lips, and say: Shh. Help baby imitate you. On the seventh day, they marched around the city again and then blew their horns. Hold the party horn up to your mouth, and hum through the horn without blowing through it. God's great power knocked the wall down. ► GOD IS POWERFUL! Help baby reach his or her arms up high to show how big and powerful God is.

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WEAVING FAITH

Horn Practice

What You'll Do

Have an infant sit or lie on a blanket in front of you.

Say: God knocked the wall of Jericho down when the Israelites blew on their horns. Can you blow? Pucker your lips in an exaggerated way. Hold your lips in that position, and catch the baby's eye. While holding that position, blow puffs of air. Encourage baby to imitate you. Then gently blow on the baby's arm. This is what air feels like when it's blown. Praise the baby for trying to blow like you.

Say: Soon you'll be able to blow a horn the way the Israelites blew their horns. You'll be able to let the whole world know that ► GOD IS POWERFUL!

Flatten the Wall

What You'll Do

Place a stack of blocks in front of a baby.

Say: Let's build a wall just like Jericho's wall. Quickly stack the blocks on top of each other in a long, low wall. God's power brought the wall of Jericho down. Let's knock down this wall. Help baby knock portions of the wall over. Continue to remind him or her that ► GOD IS POWERFUL.

Cuddle the baby on your lap.

Say: Knocking down the Jericho wall was fun! Let's pray to thank God for his power. Thank you, God, for your power. You have the power to take care of us. I pray that you'll help [baby's name] see your power in [his or her] life. Thank you for being near us and for loving us. In Jesus' name, amen.

Day Seven Countdown

What You'll Do

Invite a few toddlers to join you. Open your Bible to Joshua 6:1-27, and show children the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: **The Bible says Joshua carried a horn around the wall of Jericho.** Hold up the party horn for toddlers to see. **This is a horn. God promised the people of Israel he would give them the city of Jericho. So when it was time for them to go into the city, they walked around the city wall for seven days. Let's march around our city.** Hold hands with toddlers and walk around the chair as you count to seven. It isn't necessary to actually walk around the chair seven times. Encourage children to count with you.

Say: On the seventh day, God said the people should blow their horns (blow into the party horn), and God would make the walls fall down. The Israelites obeyed God. They marched around the city one more time. Let's march around the city again, one last time, and blow the horn. Hold hands with toddlers and walk around the chair one more time. Then blow into the party horn. After you blow the horn, start to pound your hands on the chair. Encourage toddlers to join you. That big wall made a loud noise and came tumbling down! Shake the chair; then carefully turn the chair on its side, avoiding toddlers who are standing around it. Mighty God loved his children so much that he brought the wall down, just as he promised. ► GOD IS POWERFUL!

If children enjoyed the activity, you may wish to retell a shortened version of what happened and knock the chair over again.

3 WEAVING FAITH



Paper-Cone Horns

What You'll Do

Say: Today we're going to make horns to remind us of the horns Joshua and the people of Israel blew around Jericho. Give each toddler a "Paper-Cone Horn" handout to color with crayons. As each child finishes, tape the page into a cone-shaped horn.

Say: You can use this horn to make noises just as the Israelites did. Try saying, "Toot, toot, toot" with me. Show toddlers how to hold the horns to their lips and say "toot, toot, toot" into them. Toot, toot, toot! Our **GOD IS POWERFUL! Toot, toot**, toot! God broke that wall down.

Jericho Knockdown

What You'll Do

Call two or three toddlers over to you. Say: God cared for the Israelites by showing his power. He knocked over the wall of Jericho. The wall around the city of Jericho was big and thick. Let's build Jericho's wall around these people and animals. Have toddlers help you build a block wall around the toy people and animals. Encourage toddlers to make the wall thick and strong with lots of blocks.

Say: These animals and people must feel safe and protected by this wall. I bet they think no one can get to them, just as the people of Jericho must've felt. God's power knocked over the wall of Jericho. Let's show God's power by knocking over this wall when I count to three. Count to three, and help toddlers knock over the wall. Say: **GOD IS POWERFUL!**

Quiet and Loud in Jericho

What You'll Do

Gather a group of 2-year-olds together. Lay the "God Gives Victory Over Jericho" poster on the floor, and let children look at it. Ask children to help you build a wall on top of the poster. Once the wall is built, open your Bible to Joshua 6:1-27, and show children the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: The Bible says when Joshua and the Israelites came to the city of Jericho, they were stopped by the wall of the city. Lead children in marching around the room, eventually coming back up to the wall. Once you reach the wall, come to a stop. Oh no! We're stopped by this wall, just as the Israelites were. What should we do? God promised he would give the Israelites the city of Jericho. He told them to march around the city. On the seventh day, God said to blow horns.

I have a horn for us to blow. Let's march! Six days we'll march without a sound. Shh! March in a wide circle around the poster and the wall. Don't get too close, however. It isn't necessary to actually march around the wall six times. As you march, say: This is the first day around the city. Whisper: We must be very quiet. This is the second day around Jericho and the third day. Now we're marching into the fourth day and the fifth day. We must stay quiet to obey what God said. Now it's the sixth day, and we're still marching quietly. Stop marching, and look around. Now it's the seventh day. Do you hear the horns? Blow on the party horn. Start marching again. This time march very closely to the wall as you blow the horn. Carefully touch a bottom block with your foot. That wall fell down flat! God is so powerful that he knocked down that strong wall with one horn blast! Hooray! ► GOD IS POWERFUL! Encourage children to cheer for God's power.

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3 WEAVING FAITH

Celebration Horns

What You'll Do

Say: Today we're going to make horns to remind us of the horns the Israelites blew as they marched around Jericho. These are celebration horns to praise God for his power. Celebration horns are colorful and fancy! Give each child a "Paper-Cone Horn" handout and markers. Encourage children to color the handout any way they choose. When a child is finished coloring, tape the handout into a cone-shaped horn. Let children tape crepe paper strips to the outer edge of their horns. When children are finished, show them how to hold the horns to their lips and blow hard to send the crepe paper streamers flying.

Say: You're blowing powerfully to make the streamers fly. Let's see if our blowing can knock blocks down. Place one block in front of each child. Have him or her blow through the horn to try to move the block. It wasn't the air from the Israelites' horns that knocked down the wall at Jericho. It was God's power that caused the wall to fall. ▶ GOD IS POWERFUL, and he'll use his power to help you just as he used it to help the Israelites.

Say: We can march around the room blowing our horns just as Joshua and the Israelites marched around Jericho. I'll be the leader. Blow your horns and follow me.

Help children form a line behind you and blow into the paper horns they made during the "Celebration Horns" activity. Play "Oh, When We March" (track 17 on the CD). Lead children in a Follow the Leader–type march around the room. As you march, encourage children to freely vocalize into their horns. At the end of each stanza of the song, stop to have everyone shout, "► GOD IS POWERFUL!"

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Power and Power Struggles

In your child's quest for independence, he or she is bound to try to engage you in a struggle for power. The only way to win that war is to refuse to play. As a parent you're the most powerful figure in your child's life. However, your goal needs to be to assert your authority, not your power. As often as possible, offer your child acceptable options from which to choose. Doing so allows you to exercise your authority while letting your child have a sense of power over his or her life.

Say: God cared for the Israelites by showing his power, knocking over the wall of Jericho. Let's build Jericho's wall around these people and animals. God's power knocked over the wall of Jericho. Let's show God's power by knocking over this wall on three. Count to three, and help your toddler knock over the wall. God is powerful!

2-YEAR-OLD

Say: We can march around the room blowing our horns just as Joshua and the Israelites marched around Jericho. I'll be the leader. Blow your horn and follow me.

Cup your hands around your mouth and pretend to blow a horn. Lead your child in a Follow the Leader-type march around the room. As you march, encourage your child to stop every few feet and shout, "God is powerful!"

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Build block walls with your child. Enjoy the fun of building and then knocking down the walls. As you play, say this rhyme:
 - God sent Joshua marching around,
 - And by God's power that wall fell down!
- As you dress your child in the morning, feel his or her arm muscles. Talk about how strong he or she is becoming. Then remind your child that God is stronger and more powerful than anyone!
