Jesus Clears Merchants From the Temple John 2:13-22

F irst- and second-graders love to please adults. They love to help around the house, sing songs, put on plays, and color pictures for adults. But when it comes to God, young children may feel at a loss about how to please him. Use this lesson to show kids that God is worthy of worship and praise and that he welcomes any act of worship from a child, whether it's a song, a picture, a prayer, or an action.

Jesus Clears Merchants From the Temple

John 2:13-22

BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Temple Laws Gone Wrong

Strict regulations guided the activity that was to take place in the Temple. This was to remain a holy place, the dwelling place of God. According to Isaiah 56:7, it was to be a house of prayer.

Unfortunately, the Jewish leaders, who strictly upheld laws that were convenient for them, saw an opportunity for profit in the animals to be sacrificed at the Temple. Any animal to be offered as a sacrifice was to be perfect, free from blemish. And people bringing animals for sacrifice surely chose the best from the flocks and herds. But when Jewish pilgrims brought their animals for sacrifice, the Temple inspectors regularly found something wrong with them. Then they would conveniently offer animals they had approved—for many times the going price outside the Temple.

Merchants also were exchanging money—giving people the Temple currency in exchange for their Roman or other foreign coins. The Temple currency was required for paying the Temple tax. From Jesus' disdain of this practice, it's easy to assume that people were also being cheated in this process.

Jesus Clears the Temple

It's likely that Jesus' response, while passionate, was not a purely emotional outburst. He saw what was going on in the Temple, he took time to make a whip from some ropes, and then he took appropriate action. Jesus was angry, and rightly so, but not out of control. He told the merchants, "Stop turning my Father's house into a marketplace!"

The Merchants' Response

The Jews' response is interesting. They didn't deny that they had been doing wrong. No one asked Jesus

why he did what he did. No one angrily struck back at Jesus out of righteous indignation. Their only response was to ask, "How can you prove you have the authority to do this?" When people know they're in the wrong, they often resort to legalistic maneuvering to try to blur the plain evidence of their guilt.

The Jesus Connection

Jesus' passion in this account reveals that he desires a real relationship with his people. Nothing—no money-changers or legalism—can get in the way of his love for you!

Does Jesus need to "drive out" wrong worship from your life? How have distracting thoughts, focus on self, or efforts to appear spiritual hindered your own sincere worship? Take a moment to physically bow down before God. Spend time silently clearing out the "Temple courts" in your life and praising God with a sincere heart. You can write your prayer here.

Spring Quarter



What a Mess!

What You'll Do

Welcome kids warmly as they arrive, and ask them how their week went.

Gather everyone together.

Say: What a mess we have here! Let's clean this place up before we can listen to the Bible and learn about God. Have kids help you straighten up the room.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What went through your mind when you first walked into the room?
- What are you thinking now that the room is clean?
- Why can a messy room make us distracted?
- What things distract you from worshipping God?

Say: We came here today to learn about God. But when our room was all messy, that distracted us, didn't it? Sometimes it's like that in our lives. Sometimes things clutter up our hearts and keep us from worshipping God. And ▶ GOD WANTS SINCERE WORSHIP. Today we'll hear about a time Jesus saw things cluttering up how people worshipped God.



EXPLORATION

Jesus Clears the Temple

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to John 2:13-22, and show kids the passage. Say: In the Bible today, we'll learn about a time Jesus found people making a mess out of the Temple of God. The Temple is where the people went to worship God—it was their church.

Show the "Jesus Clears the Temple" poster, and let kids point out things on the poster that seem distracting to worshipping God. Then say: The church leaders were selling animals and exchanging money. They told the people that they needed to buy these animals in order to worship God. There were so many rules to follow. This made Jesus angry

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because the church leaders were busy buying and selling in the house of God. They weren't teaching the people how to worship. Let's hear more about what happened.

Say: We'll act out what happened to get a feel for how distracting a church like that could be. First, let's make some gold coins. Give each child a foam cup, and evenly distribute the gold foil squares. Have kids tear or cut small foam circles from the cups. Have them wrap the foam circles in the gold foil to make coins. Show kids how to write their names on their coins. Then collect all the coins in the hat.

Say: **I'll play the CD, and as you listen, act out your part.** Let each child choose one of the following parts: Jesus, doves, cattle, sheep, a man selling cows, a man selling sheep, a woman selling doves, a woman wanting to buy some cows, and a woman wanting to buy some sheep.

Have the merchants sit at a table, the animals mill about on all fours near the table, and the buyers stand in front of the table. Have the child playing Jesus wait on the other side of the room. Give him or her a piece of rope to use as a whip. Place the gold coins the kids made on the table in front of the merchants.

Cue the CD to "Jesus Clears the Temple" (track 4 on the CD). Have kids act out their parts as the CD plays. Help kids as needed.

When the segment ends, work as a group to clean the room. Then have kids gather in a group.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was it like to participate in acting out what happened in the Temple?
- Is it hard for you to concentrate on certain things, like doing your homework, if you're surrounded by mess and clutter? Why or why not?
- Why do you think God deserves undistracted worship?

Say: God's Temple in the Bible was a place of worship. God wanted the people to think only of him when they went to the Temple. He didn't want them to be worried about which animals to buy and how much money they had to spend. God wants our hearts to be places of worship, too. ► GOD WANTS SINCERE WORSHIP. Just as God wanted his Temple to stay clean, he wants our hearts to be clean when we worship him.

Ways to Worship

What You'll Do

Say: We learned today that buying and selling in the Temple took the people's attention away from worshipping God. Our Key Verse today will help us understand how God wants us to worship him. Open your Bible to Psalm 95:6, and show it to kids. Say: Listen



Ways to Worship Supplies

CD player 1 copy per child of the lyrics page (at the end of the lesson) **Teacher Pack** CD: "Let Us Bow Down in Worship" (Psalm 95:6-7) (track 5)

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while I read it: "Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker" (Psalm 95:6). Have the children repeat the verse with you several times.

Say: God is so awesome that he deserves our worship! Bowing and kneeling are just two ways to show God how great we think he is. Let's do what the verse says.

Lead kids first in bowing and then in kneeling. Have kids remain kneeling as you continue.

Say: Another way is to sing to him. Let's keep kneeling as we sing a worship song to God. Hand out the lyrics pages. Then play "Let Us Bow Down in Worship" (Psalm 95:6-7) (track 5 on the CD).

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What were you thinking as you worshipped God by bowing, kneeling, and singing?
- Why do you think the Bible says to bow and kneel before God?
- What other ways can we show God how great we think he is?

Say: We can worship God by bowing and kneeling before him or singing to him. We can worship God in everything we do. There's never a time we can't worship God! When Jesus went to the Temple, he wanted the people to understand that ► GOD WANTS SINCERE WORSHIP. Let's worship God with all our hearts this week.





Clean Hearts

What You'll Do

Say: Coming to God with clean, sincere hearts is just one way we can worship God.

Distribute the Lesson 2 My Bible Fun pages. Give each child a pencil. Have kids each write inside the heart one or two ways they've disobeyed recently. Encourage them to draw symbols so they can keep their thoughts private. Kids might write about fighting with siblings, lying, or saying mean things to someone at school. Allow time.

Put kids in pairs. Say: Jesus cleaned the Temple so the people could worship God, and we get our hearts ready to worship God, too! Let's take a minute to pray with our partners and ask God to forgive us for the sins we wrote down.

Encourage kids to pray for each other, asking God to forgive them for the sins they wrote on their hearts.

Say: When we ask God to forgive us, he always does. That means that these sins we wrote down are already forgiven! So let's clean our hearts, just as Jesus cleaned the Temple.

Pass around several erasers, and let kids erase the sins they wrote.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What were you thinking when you prayed for forgiveness and then erased the sins you wrote?
- Why do you want Jesus to clean your heart?
- Why does a clean heart help you worship God?

Say: Today we heard how Jesus cleaned out the Temple. In this activity, we learned that we can ask God to forgive us and worship him with clean, sincere hearts. Our Bible Point tells us that ► GOD WANTS SINCERE WORSHIP. God loves us no matter what, but we want clean hearts as we worship him.

It's About Time

What You'll Do

Say: We learned today that SOD WANTS SINCERE WORSHIP. Let's make watches to remind us that we can worship God anytime.

Distribute the Lesson 2 pages from My Bible Fun. Have kids each cut out the "It's About Time" clock face and wristbands. As children are cutting, return to them the gold coins they made earlier. Set out staplers.

Have children work in pairs. Show kids how to staple the clock faces to the gold coins. Then have kids work together to staple their wristbands to their clock faces. Help them fit the bands around their wrists and staple the bands together loosely.

When everyone is wearing a watch, have kids kneel in a circle.

Say: One way we can worship God with a sincere heart is by asking Jesus to change our hearts and make us more like him. God sent Jesus so that we can live with him forever, and he wants to forgive us and make our hearts clean. Let's remember this week that ► GOD WANTS SINCERE WORSHIP.

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Daily Challenges

What You'll Do

Say: Let's think about how > GOD WANTS SINCERE WORSHIP.

Have kids find this week's Daily Challenges in their My Bible Fun pages and choose one to do this week. They can choose one or more of these three options:

- Sing a song to God each night before you go to bed.
- Take home your gold coins. Use them to tell your family what Jesus did in the Temple.
- When you brush your teeth each day, ask God to give you a sincere heart to worship him.

Make sure you choose a Daily Challenge as well, and tell kids what you chose. Kids will be more inclined to follow through on their commitments when they see you doing the same.



Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

What's a practical way you're going to do your Daily Challenge? Include a time, a place, and other ideas.

Say: As we heard what Jesus did in the Temple, we learned that ► GOD WANTS SINCERE WORSHIP. This week, show God you want to worship him sincerely by following through on our Daily Challenges.

Weaving Faith at Home

Encourage kids to talk with their parents about the Daily Challenges they chose and what they learned about worshipping God sincerely. Kids can also do the activities in the "HomeConnect" section of their My Bible Fun pages with their families.

Take a couple of minutes to pray with your kids, telling God you want to worship him sincerely. Help us remember this week that we can worship you anytime, anywhere. In Jesus' name, amen.**
