

Paul Describes Living by God's Spirit Romans 8:9-17

F irst- and second-graders are continuing to learn right from wrong. They understand that some behaviors and attitudes are not acceptable. Usually this age sees the cause-and-effect relationship of those behaviors and attitudes: If I don't clean my room, I'll get in trouble. Use this lesson, instead, to help children understand the root of spiritual living: because we love and follow Jesus, our lives reflect his love.

Paul Describes Living by God's Spirit

Romans 8:9-17

BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

The Holy Spirit Helps Us Resist Sin

In Romans 8:5-8, Paul gives a description of living by the sinful nature—which ends in death. That's where today's passage picks up: Paul describes what it looks like to live according to the Holy Spirit. He begins by making it clear that Christians have the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God, living in them. And with that Spirit within, we can resist the pull of the sinful nature (Romans 8:9).

In Romans 8:11, Paul points out that the Holy Spirit not only helps us keep from sinning but also brings us resurrection from the dead—eternal life. If God raised up Jesus and God's Spirit is dwelling in us, God can raise us up as well!

Our Response to the Holy Spirit

Paul changes gears somewhat in Romans 8:12-13, turning from what God does for us through the Holy Spirit to what our responsibility is in response to what God has done for us. If we follow the leading of the Holy Spirit in our lives rather than our sinful nature, we will live. The death to sin that God has accomplished for us doesn't mean that we don't have to worry about sin in our lives; instead it makes it possible for us to turn from sinning and even obligates us to do so!

Romans 8:15-17 turns back to what God has done for us. When we live by God's Spirit, not only are we able to turn from sin and be cleansed from sin through Jesus' sacrifice, but we also are adopted as children of God himself! And in first-century culture, an adopted child wasn't in any way inferior to a natural child. In fact, the adopted child was deliberately chosen by a father for the purpose of carrying on his name, which was a great honor.

We can call God *Abba*, an Aramaic word by which children would lovingly address their fathers.

The Jesus Connection

Great freedom comes when, after every effort imaginable, you realize nothing you do on your own can win right standing with God. It can be found only by accepting a gift with humility and gratitude. The gift? A relationship with Jesus.

Pray this prayer today: "God, you did more than forgive me. You accepted me. I can hardly believe you think of me as your child. Make this so real to me that I am changed through and through." You can write your prayer here.

Fitting Spiritually

What You'll Do

Welcome kids warmly as they arrive, and ask them how their week went.

Gather everyone together. Then line up the children in one line as a relay team, and have them see how long it takes for the whole class to put on all the clothes, one item per trip for each child. Tell kids to put on each item of clothing somehow, even if they are too big or too small. After you finish, sit in a circle for discussion.

Ask:

- What made this relay hard?
- Why didn't you want to try on the baby clothes?

Say: Some clothes, like the baby clothes, will never really fit again. Other clothes may be too big, but since we are still growing, we might wear them someday. Because we are growing, we don't stay the same and we can't always wear the same size clothes.

When we accept God's love, we don't stay the same; we become new people. We start to grow and learn how to be more like God. God's Spirit shows us how to live by teaching us to follow God.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What are some things we no longer do now because we are bigger?
- Why don't we stay the same?
- Why does God not want us to stay the same?

Say: God wants to help us grow. He sends the Spirit to help us in life. In our story, we're going to learn that ► WHEN WE LIVE BY GOD'S SPIRIT, GOD CHANGES US.





No Guesswork

What You'll Do

Gather enough pennies so each child will have one by the end of the lesson, and then have kids sit in a circle around you. Have each child take a turn guessing in which hand you are hiding a penny. Show the child if he or she is correct. If the child is correct, give up the penny; if not, continue to the next child.

Ask:

- How did you feel when you found out if you were correct or not?
- Why was guessing where the treasure was hard to do?
- What kind of treasure is God offering to us?
- How do we get that treasure?

Open your Bible to Romans 8:16-17, and read it aloud.

Have the kids who got a penny each find a child who did not receive one. Then give a penny to each child who doesn't already have one. Have pairs answer the next two questions.

Ask:

- Those of you who just received a penny from me, how do you feel now?
- Think about the treasure I just gave you for free. How is that like receiving God's treasure?

Say: God's Spirit speaks to us and for us. Not only does the Spirit lead us to follow God but the Spirit teaches us, too.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why do we need God's Spirit?
- What do you think God's Spirit wants us to do to show we are God's children?
- What do you think happens when we live by God's Spirit?

Say: In our game, you had to guess which hand held a treasure. You could only get the treasure if you guessed right. But God doesn't want us to live our lives guessing if we are his children or how we can be his children. We cannot repay God for giving Jesus, his treasure, to us. But we can know we are God's children and that he treasures us. ► WHEN WE LIVE BY GOD'S SPIRIT, GOD CHANGES US.

What You'll Do

Divide the children into groups of up to 10 kids, giving each group a different kind of fruit from the list below to dice with plastic knives. Have each group place its diced fruit into a large bowl, and allow kids to take turns stirring the fruit together with yogurt. You will need the following fresh fruit to give 10 children each a 3-ounce cup of fruit salad: 1 cup halved strawberries, 1 cup sliced peaches, ½ cup sliced bananas, and 12 ounces of fruit yogurt. Adjust the recipe to your class size.

As you serve the children and allow them to eat their fruit, read the Key Verse to them: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23).

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- How are things such as love and patience like fruit?
- Why does God want us to have this fruit?
- What happens when we live by God's Spirit?

Say: The fruit of the Spirit is wonderful, like real fruit. God's Spirit leads us to follow God and to act like his children with the fruit of the Spirit. There are different types of fruit of the Spirit, but all of the fruit is inside of us to make our lives better.

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Spirited Fruit

What You'll Do

Give each child a fruit-scented marker and a My Bible Fun page. Open your Bible to Galatians 5:22-23, and assist kids in doing the same.

Say: Our Key Verse helps us know how to live in God's Spirit. It is found in Galatians chapter 5, verses 22-23 and says, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What does it mean to have the fruit of the Spirit?
- How can you show these things, the fruit of the Spirit, in your lives?

Explain that showing the fruit of the Spirit means we show these traits. We are loving, kind, peaceful, and gentle to others because we are God's children. Have kids think about the different fruit of the Spirit and choose three that they struggle with in their lives and write or draw them on the empty fruit on the page. For example, one child might have trouble being kind to his sister.

Say: Let's remember this week that ► WHEN WE LIVE BY GOD'S SPIRIT, GOD CHANGES US.

What You'll Do

Say: Let's think about how > WHEN WE LIVE BY GOD'S SPIRIT, GOD CHANGES US.

Have kids find this week's Daily Challenges in their My Bible Fun pages and choose one to do this week. They can choose one or more of these three options:

- Turn on a fan in your bedroom, and thank God for giving you the Holy Spirit to help you!
- Retell today's Bible story to your friends at school, and explain that when we live by God's Spirit, God changes us!
- Read a Bible story with a family member, and then thank God for sending the Holy Spirit to help you understand his Word!

Make sure you choose a Daily Challenge as well, and tell kids what you chose. Kids will be more inclined to follow through on their commitments when they see you doing the same.

Talk With Kids

Lead kids in this discussion.

Ask:

What's a practical way you're going to do your Daily Challenge? Include a time, a place, and other ideas.

Say: When we believe in Jesus, God's Spirit lives in us. Let's remember that ► WHEN WE LIVE BY GOD'S SPIRIT, GOD CHANGES US, as we follow through on our Daily Challenges.
