irst- and second-graders' friendships are important to them. Self-esteem in kids is sometimes dependent upon what friends think about them. Telling their friends that they are Christians, or even that they go to church, may be difficult if kids fear they will be rejected as a result. Use this lesson to encourage kids to share their faith even when it's hard.

Apostles Defend Their Faith

Acts 5:12-42



The Jailed Apostles, Miraculously Freed, Return to the Temple

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As described in Acts 4, Peter and John had been brought before the Sanhedrin for questioning and told to stop teaching in the name of Jesus. Frustrated but finding no reason to punish them, the Sanhedrin had to let them go. Now, after performing more miraculous signs and arousing more excitement among the people, all of the apostles were brought in and locked up overnight. The Sanhedrin likely intended to punish them the next day. However, the next morning, the doors and gates to the cell were still securely locked, but the prisoners were gone. Rather than accept the supernatural release of the apostles, the authorities apparently concluded that someone in the Temple police was a sympathizer and had freed the prisoners.

When the apostles were approached in the Temple court again, no force was used to bring them back to the meeting of the Sanhedrin. Had the apostles wanted to resist, the support of the crowd would have made it difficult for the religious leaders to bring them in. But the apostles didn't resist. Notice that the high priest didn't even want to utter the name of Jesus. Perhaps the high priest was afraid that the apostles would make him and the Sanhedrin look guilty for the death of Jesus. His guilt was haunting him, and he was becoming paranoid about the disciples' motives.

Gamaliel Advises the Sanhedrin to Let the Apostles Go

Peter, responding for all the apostles, was very clear. Members of the Sanhedrin couldn't disagree with the principle; they just disagreed over what it meant to obey God. Mistaken as they were, they thought they were obeying God.

Gamaliel's response to the Sanhedrin was wise. After reminding the Sanhedrin of two people who had commanded followings and later faded away, he advised the Sanhedrin to leave the apostles alone. He said that if what the apostles were doing was simply self-manufactured it would go nowhere, but if it was of God, even the Sanhedrin wouldn't be able to stop it.

The Jesus Connection

The Holy Spirit is sometimes described as a "deposit" assuring that God will make good on his promises of what is yet to come. The Holy Spirit guides, convicts, and inspires us as we grow in our relationship with Jesus.

Bubble Up Supplies

bubble solution and wands chenille wires tape

Bubble Up Easy Prep

Set up a simple obstacle course. Use chenille wires to make loops large enough for bubbles to go through. Then tape the wire loops to a table so that the loops are about 6 inches apart and form a right, left, right, left zigzag pattern.



Bubble Up

What You'll Do

Welcome kids warmly as they arrive, and ask them how their week went.

Gather everyone together.

Say: Today we're going to play a game with bubbles. We're going to see if we can get one bubble to go through all of these loops without breaking.

Have kids form pairs and gather around the table. Give the first pair some bubble solution and two wands. Have one child in the pair blow a bubble through the first loop. The other child will try to catch it with the second wand and then blow the bubble through the second loop. The first child will then try to catch the bubble and gently blow it through the third loop.

After all pairs have had a turn, have kids answer the following questions with their partners. After each question, invite partners to share their answers with the rest of the class.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was the hardest part of this game?
- Why was this game hard?
- What are some other things you can think of that are hard to do?
- Do you think being a Christian is hard? Explain.

Say: Today we're going to learn about some hard things that the apostles had to go through because they were Christians. We'll find out what they did when they had to go through hard times. We'll also learn that we should ▶ KEEP FOLLOWING GOD, EVEN WHEN IT'S HARD.





Journey With the Apostles

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Acts 5:12-42, and show kids the passage. Explain that today's story comes from the book of Acts in the Bible. Have kids form four groups.

Say: Today we're going to follow Jesus' apostles and see what happens to them. There are four types of people in our story. First there are the apostles.

Kids in Group 1 will be the apostles. Have them say "Believe in Jesus!" whenever they hear the word *apostles* during the Bible story.

Say: Then there were the sick people who the apostles met along the way.

Have kids in Group 2 be the sick people. Have them hold their tummies and groan whenever they hear the word *sick* during the Bible story.

Say: Then there were the people who were jealous of the apostles. They were called the Sadducees.

Kids in Group 3 will be the Sadducees. Have them say "Go to jail!" whenever they hear the word Sadducees.

Say: Then there were the believers, the people who believed in Jesus because of the apostles' teachings and healing.

Kids in Group 4 will be the believers. Have this group say "I believe in Jesus!" whenever they hear the word *believed*.

Have kids sit in their groups on the floor as you prepare to tell them the story. Have each group practice its response a few times, then begin the Bible story. Pause after you read each italicized word in the story to let groups respond.

Say: I'm going to tell the story now. When you hear me say your group's word, respond the way we practiced.

The apostles had been performing many miracles for the people who believed in Jesus. And more and more people believed in Jesus all the time. Because of what the apostles were doing, people who had been sick were healed! So more and more sick people came, hoping they would be healed, too.

Then the Sadducees had the apostles arrested!



Journey With the Apostles Supplies

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Journey With the Apostles Easy Prep

Form a simple "jail" by placing several chairs in a circle.



Have kids from Group 1, the apostles, go sit in jail.

Say: The Sadducees didn't like that the apostles were telling people about Jesus. The Sadducees didn't like that the apostles were healing people who were sick. So the apostles sat in jail.

Then an angel of the Lord came and opened the doors of the jail. The angel told the *apostles* to go tell more people about Jesus. The *apostles* did what the angel said, and people *believed*!

Have kids in Group 1 leave jail and return to the rest of the group.

Say: The Sadducees didn't like this at all. So they had guards bring the apostles to the courthouse so they could be questioned. The high priest of the Sadducees said, "We told you not to tell people about Jesus! Why do you continue to do it?" The apostles replied, "We must obey God rather than men. You sent Jesus to the cross, but God raised Jesus from the dead so people can be forgiven for the things they've done wrong. We must tell everyone about Jesus! Even sick people!"

The Sadducees became very angry and wanted to have the apostles killed. But another man, a Pharisee, convinced the Sadducees to let the apostles live. The Sadducees had the apostles beaten and then let them go. The apostles were told not to speak in the name of Jesus. The apostles left and were very happy because they knew they had done what God wanted them to do, even though it was hard for them. They left and went to tell more people—even sick people—about Jesus!

Have kids answer the following questions in their groups. After each question, invite volunteers to share their answers with the rest of the class.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why were the apostles telling people about Jesus?
- Why should you tell people about Jesus?
- What made it hard for the apostles to tell others about Jesus?
- What makes it hard for you to tell other kids about Jesus?
- What should we do when it's hard to be a Christian?

Say: The apostles told people about Jesus, even when it was hard. We should also ► KEEP FOLLOWING GOD, EVEN WHEN IT'S HARD. Let's take a look at our Key Verse for today. It will help us know what to do when it's hard for us to be Christians.





Consider It Joy

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to James 1:2-3, and read it aloud for the class: "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance" (James 1:2-3). Have kids repeat the verse with you several times.

Ask:

- What are trials?
- What do you think perseverance means?

Say: Trials are things that are hard for us to do.

Ask:

- What is something hard you had to do this week?
- Why was it hard to do?
- What do you think would've helped make it easier?

Say: Sometimes we have to do things that are hard, like working out a new math problem or learning how to spell a new word. But sometimes we have to do things that are hard because we're Christians. God tells us to be joyful, or happy, when this happens. He tells us to persevere.

Perseverance means to be persistent and patient. It means to keep on going even when it's hard.

Ask:

- When has it been hard for you to be a Christian?
- What do you do when it's hard to be a Christian?

Say: God will help us when it's hard to be Christians, just as he helped the apostles. We can have joy, even when it's hard to be Christians, because God knows what's best for us and will help us. Let's sing our Key Verse song to help us remember what to do when it's hard to be Christians.

Cue your CD to "Persevere!" (James 1:2-3) (track 9 on the CD), and play the song once for the kids. Then lead them in singing the song two or three times.

After the song, have kids turn to the "Consider It Joy!" activity in their My Bible Fun pages.

Say: On your page, you'll see four different pictures of situations in which it might be hard to be a Christian. I'm going to read to you what each picture is about. Then you can talk about what you would do if you were in that situation, and you can draw smiles on the blank faces.

Remember that our Key Verse, James 1:2-3, tells us to "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance." Have kids repeat the Key Verse with you. Remember our Key Verse as you draw the face in each picture!

In the first situation, Jeremy is being teased about going to Sunday school. He'd just been invited to go to a baseball game, but he told his friends he couldn't go because he was going to church.

Have kids draw smiles and talk about what they would do in the situation.

Say: In the second situation, Amanda is being teased because she isn't allowed to watch a certain cartoon with her friends because it makes fun of God.

Have kids draw smiles and talk about what they would do in this situation.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was the hardest thing about each of these situations?
- Do you think you could be joyful in each situation? Why or why not?
- What should we do when it's hard to be a Christian?

Say: Now let's make a yummy snack to remind us of today's Bible story and Key Verse.

Joyful Jails

What You'll Do

Set out small paper plates, bread, jelly in squeeze bottles, string licorice, scissors, and plastic wrap. Explain that kids will be making Joyful Jails to remind them that the apostles had joy, even when they were in jail and it was hard to be Christians. Tell kids that first they'll each make a snack to cover and take home. They can use their snacks to tell their families the Bible story and Key Verse. Then they'll each make a snack to enjoy in class.

Give each child a paper plate with a slice of bread on it. Show kids how to make a smiley face on the bread with the jelly. Then show kids how to cut and place pieces of string licorice over the bread to look like a jail. Use plastic wrap to cover the first snack each child makes. Then let kids each make another snack to enjoy in class.

Cue your CD to "Persevere!" (James 1:2-3) (track 9 on the CD). As kids are working, softly play the song.
