

# Noah Builds the Ark

Genesis 6:5-22

ive- and six-year-olds are trying to make sense of their world. Often when adults ask young children to do something, kids don't immediately obey. Instead they ask, "Why?" Rather than getting impatient, calmly and lovingly give kids simple reasons for your requests. Noah is a great example of a man who obeyed God even when things didn't make sense. Use this lesson to help children understand they can choose to obey God, too.

# Noah Builds the Ark

Genesis 6:5-22



# A Drastic Solution to a Huge Problem

God's statement in Genesis 6:7 grew out of pain and was a sorrowful acknowledgment that to make things better, most of the earth's population would have to die. The people that God created had so turned against him that he had to start over with the few who remained faithful.

Fortunately, one righteous man still loved God. The word translated "righteous" in verse 9 indicates that Noah sought both to worship and obey God and also to live in fairness with his human neighbors who didn't share his values. Noah was a shining example of goodness in a dark world.

Consider the immensity of the task Noah undertook. The ark was one and a half times the length of a football field, as wide as a high-school basketball court is long, and as tall as a five-story building. There were to be three decks inside and many rooms to house all the different animals. All of this was to be built of a particular kind of wood (which we can't identify precisely) in an arid area where wood likely was not plentiful.

# A Unique, Sea-Worthy Vessel

Obviously no one had ever built a floating zoo of that size. Fortunately, God knew what he was doing. Modern shipbuilding experts have confirmed that the dimensions given in the Bible would be ideal to ensure that a large wooden vessel would remain intact and upright while adrift in heavy seas.

In addition to caring for his family, Noah was given the responsibility of housing and feeding two of every kind of animal in the ark (Genesis 6:19, 21). In an amazing miracle, God led all the animals to the ark at just the right time. And the reason there were seven pairs of certain animals was so that Noah would have animals

to sacrifice in worship without wiping out a species (Genesis 7:2-3).

We don't know how often Noah was discouraged or if his neighbors and family ridiculed him. But we do know that he "did everything just as God commanded him." And that's a great example of faithful obedience for all of us.

## **The Jesus Connection**

Jesus obeyed God in every turn and detail of his life. When we look to Jesus and follow his example, we're obeying God. What a beautiful way to live!

When has God directed you to do something? It can sometimes seem scary, but it's also exciting because God reveals his faithfulness and strength when we obey him in the things he asks us to do. Take comfort in knowing that when you obey, God will give everything you need to carry out his plans. Ask God what he wants you to do. You can write your prayer here.

# **Welcoming Song**

**Tip** Consistently use the same signal to announce a transition to the next activity. You could flip the lights off and on, use a train whistle, have a puppet rustling inside a bag, or sing cleanup songs. Keep it simple, consistent, and fun.

# What You'll Do

As the children arrive, greet each child and welcome him or her with a smile. When it's time to begin, use your signal to bring the children together in a circle. Lead the kids in doing the actions and singing "It's Good to Have You..." (track 14 on the CD) to the tune of "Oh Where, Oh Where Has My Little Dog Gone?"

It's good to have you in church today. (nod your head and point to everyone in the room)

**Let's sing,** (cup hands around mouth) **let's learn,** (point to your head) **and let's pray.** (make praying hands)

We'll make new friends, and we'll have so much fun. (shake someone's hand)
We're glad you've joined us today! (hold hands in a circle and swing hands back and forth)
(Repeat 2x.)

Say: Today we'll learn that ▶ GOD WANTS US TO OBEY. The Bible tells us about how Noah obeyed God and built the ark—a giant boat! Let's sing a song about Noah's adventure.

Lead the children in singing and doing the motions to "Arky, Arky" (track 13 on the CD).

The Lord told Noah, there's gonna be a floody, floody. (hold arms up; then wiggle fingers to make "rain")

Lord told Noah there's gonna be a floody, floody.

Get those animals out of the muddy, muddy, (shake index finger)

Children of the Lord.

The Lord told Noah to build him an arky, arky. (pretend to hammer) Lord told Noah to build him an arky, arky.
Build it out of gopher barky, barky,

The animals, the animals they came in by twosies, twosies. (hold up two fingers and march to the beat)

**Elephants and kangaroosies, 'roosies,** (swing arms like an elephant's trunk; then hop like a kangaroo)

It rained and poured for 40 daysies, daysies. (wiggle fingers to make "rain") Rained and poured for 40 daysies, daysies.

Almost drove those animals crazies, crazies, (put hands on either side of your face, open eyes wide)

Children of the Lord.

The sun came out and dried up the landy, landy. (make a big circle with arms) Look, there's the sun—it dried up the landy, landy.

Everything was fine and dandy, dandy, (nod your head and smile) Children of the Lord.

So rise and shine and give God the glory, glory. (raise arms, and spread fingers wide like sunshine)

Say: God told Noah to prepare for a big flood, and Noah obeyed God. By obeying God, Noah saved his family and many animals—and Noah showed that he loved God with his whole heart. ▶ GOD WANTS US TO OBEY, too. Let's see how we can show God we love him with our whole hearts.



# All of Me!

#### What You'll Do

Have the children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to Deuteronomy 6:5, and show children the words. Tell kids the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Our Key Verse from the Bible, Deuteronomy 6:5, says, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:5). That means to love God with all of you. Let's say our Key Verse together. Lead the children in repeating the simplified Key Verse after you: Love God with your whole heart (Deuteronomy 6:5).



All of Me! Supplies

Say: Loving God isn't just a feeling. It can be acting and doing. Loving God with your whole heart means loving God with every part of you: the thinking part, the moving part, the talking part, and the feeling part. Every single part of us can show love to God.

Let's play a game to practice loving God with our whole heart. When I say a body part, you act out a way you can use it to love God.

Show me how you can love God with your whole heart by using your hands. Allow children time to respond, and if they need help suggest making praying hands. Ask the kids to think of ways to show they love God using their feet, voice, arms, and other body parts as you continue. Make suggestions as needed.

#### Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

#### Ask:

What's your favorite way to show you love God? Why?

Say: God loves us so much! And GOD WANTS US TO OBEY to show our love for him. We can show God that we love him with our whole heart when we obey God every day. The Bible tells us that Noah showed love to God by obeying God and building a big boat called an ark. Let's say our Key Verse together one more time. Lead children in repeating the simplified Key Verse with you: Love God with your whole heart. (Deuteronomy 6:5).

# Theo's News

# What You'll Do

Say: Friends, it's time for Theo's News!

Have the children sit in a circle. Then begin "Here, Theo" (track 5 on the CD). When the CD segment ends, bring out the Surprise Box, and put Theophilus the FaithRetriever puppet on your hand. Then follow along with the script.

Theo: Hi, everybody!

**Teacher:** Hello, Theo! Tell us what interesting news you've dug up about the Bible today.

**Theo:** I hid it in the Surprise Box.

**Teacher:** Let's look inside to see what Theo dug up for us today.

(Invite a child to open the Surprise Box, and have the kids pass the hammer around the circle so everyone can see it up close. Give kids time to guess what they'll learn from the Bible today.)

**Teacher:** Friends, what can you do with a hammer?

(Pause for kids to answer your question.)

Teacher: Theo, why did you hide this hammer in the Surprise Box?

**Theo:** Well, you can use a hammer to build all sorts of things!

**Teacher:** Yes, Theo, we can use a hammer to build things. ▶ **GOD WANTS US TO OBEY.** The Bible tells us Noah obeyed God and worked hard to build an ark, which is a

really big boat.

Theo: Noah probably used a tool like a hammer.

Teacher: That's right, Theo! Friends, let's read the Bible to find out more about Noah

and his ark!

**Theo:** Have fun, boys and girls!

Teacher: Friends, say goodbye to Theo.

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe place for next week's use.

# Bible Time: Noah's Ark

## What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Genesis 6, and show children the words. Tell kids the Bible is God's special book.

Invite a child to act out Noah's actions as you tell kids about Noah's obedience. Have the other children form groups to act out and make noises for the following people and animals: men, women, pigs, hens, snakes, mice, and owls.

Say: Today the Bible tells us that GOD WANTS US TO OBEY. But in Noah's day, people fought and thought mean things about each other. God wanted people to obey him.

Have the groups line up in this order: men, women, pigs, hens, snakes, mice, owls, and Noah.

Say: When you hear me talk about the person or animal you're pretending to be, make the animal noise or repeat what the people say.

As I was saying, back in Noah's day, people did bad things. God asked, "Who'll say they're sorry and be kind?"

"Not I," shouted the men. Pause and allow children to repeat.

"Not I," yelled the women. Pause and repeat.

"Not I," grunted the pigs. Pause and allow kids to make animal sounds.

"Not I," clucked the hens. Pause for animal sounds.

"Not I." hissed the snakes. Pause for animals sounds.

"Not I," squeaked the mice. Pause for animal sounds.

"Not I." hooted the owls. Pause for animal sounds.

"I will-God wants me to obey," said Noah. Pause and allow Noah to repeat.



# Bible Time: Noah's Ark Supplies

#### **Teacher Pack**

"Noah's Ark" poster (from the Big Bible Poster Pack)



God said, "I'll send a flood of water because people are disobeying me and being mean to each other. But Noah obeys me. I want Noah to build a huge boat so Noah, his family, and some animals will live. Who'll help me build the ark?" Repeat the sequence given earlier. Set out the "Noah's Ark" poster.

Say: So Noah obeyed God and built the ark. Noah worked hard for a long time building the ark. Noah cut and sawed and sanded and pounded until finally the ark was done. Lead kids in acting out the motions of building the ark. God asked, "Who'll help load food onto the ark for the animals?" Repeat the sequence given earlier.

Say: **Noah loaded food onto the ark.** Lead kids in acting out the motions of carrying heavy loads of food. **Then God sent the animals, two of each. Onto the ark galloped horses and zebras. Onto the ark pounded elephants and hippos.** Lead kids in acting out the motions and sounds of horses, zebras, elephants, and hippos. Allow the kids to get noisy, and then guiet them with your signal.

Finally this squeaking, squawking zoo was ready to go. When Noah and his family were safely inside the ark, God shut the door. It started to rain and rain and rain. Squirt water from a water bottle over the kids in a fine mist. I wonder who wanted to be on the ark now. Lead kids through this new sequence of responses in their groups.

- "I wish I was," shouted the men. Pause and allow children to repeat.
- "I wish I was," yelled the women. Pause and repeat.
- "I wish I was," grunted the pigs. Pause and allow kids to make animal sounds.
- "I wish I was." clucked the hens. Pause for animal sounds.
- "I wish I was," hissed the snakes. Pause for animal sounds.
- "I wish I was," squeaked the mice. Pause for animal sounds.
- "I wish I was," hooted the owls. Pause for animal sounds.
- "I was on the ark-I obeyed God," said Noah. Pause and allow Noah to repeat.

#### Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- What do you think about what Noah did to obey God?
- Why do you think Noah and his family obeyed God even though it was hard?
- Tell about a time someone told you to do something that was hard.

Say: Noah obeyed God, and everyone on the ark was safe from the flood. ▶ GOD WANTS US TO OBEY. When we obey God, we live as God wants us to. We can be like Noah and obey God, too.



Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're



ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. Then circulate among the children as they create and explore. Encourage them to make connections between their activities and the Bible by asking them the questions included with each center's description.

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#### CENTER 1:

# Noah Obeys, I Obey

## What You'll Do

Help kids write their names on their My Bible Playground pages. Then have children form pairs, and ask them to describe to each other how the people or animals in the pictures are obeying.

Say: Draw in the blank square a picture of a time you obeyed. Then show your picture to your partner and tell who you were obeying.

## Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- Who are people you obey?
- What makes it easy or difficult to obey adults?

Say: ► GOD WANTS US TO OBEY. Noah obeyed God when he listened to him and built an ark. It took Noah a long time but he obeyed God every day. We can obey God, too.

#### CENTER 2:

# **Edible Arks**

#### What You'll Do

Have children clean their hands and then find partners. Give each child a paper plate and a handful of pretzel sticks and animal crackers.

Say: Use the pretzels to outline an ark on a paper plate and to make paths leading to the ark. Pause. Work with your partner to figure out which animal cracker shapes there are and find each animal a matching partner. Pause and allow kids to pair animals. You can march the animals along the paths to the pretzel ark. Pause and allow kids to move the crackers. Talk with your partner about what you like about each animal and the special things it can do. Allow kids to talk about the animals for two minutes. There are many animals that can learn to obey, and animals obeyed God when they got on the ark.

#### Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- What can help an animal learn to obey?
- What can help you and me learn to obey?
- What can we do to learn to obey God?

Pray: Dear God, thank you for putting good things in our lives, like this snack. Please help us obey you and live the way you want us to. In Jesus' name, amen. Let kids enjoy their snack.

Say: God made everything to be very good and to obey him—even animals!


GOD WANTS US TO OBEY, and we can learn how to obey him every day by practicing obeying.

# Stick Trick

#### What You'll Do

Say: God told Noah to build an ark, and Noah obeyed. Point to the ark. God said, "Bring two of each kind of animal into the ark." Show children the animal stickers. Noah obeyed and let pairs of animals into the ark.

Work together to put one animal sticker on one craft stick and the matching animal sticker on another craft stick. Pause. Then mix the sticks and lay the sticks with the stickers facing down on the floor outside the ark. Pause.

Here are the rules for the game. One at a time turn over two sticks, looking for a matching pair of animals. If you find a pair, you can put the animals in the ark and take another turn. If you don't find a pair, you'll turn the sticks over and let another person play. Continue the game until the ark is filled with pairs of animals.

After children finish the game, congratulate them on obeying the rules, too.

#### Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- What helped you follow the rules of the game?
- What helps you follow rules at home?
- What are some rules God has for us?

Say: You obeyed rules and it made our game fun. Noah obeyed God by following rules for building the ark and filling it with animals. We can obey God's rules, too.

► GOD WANTS US TO OBEY and to follow his rules always.

#### CENTER 4:

# **Thumbprint Arks**

#### What You'll Do

Help kids each write their name on the back of a paper plate "ark."

Say: You can use brown crayons to color your arks. Draw windows in the top part of the ark, too. Show children how to color the tips of their thumbs with washable markers and then make thumbprints close together on the ark. You can add details to your thumbprints and turn them into pairs of bugs, birds, animals, or people. When you're done, clean your thumbs with a wet wipe.

Allow time for kids to create their arks.

Say: God told Noah to build the ark because God knew it would keep Noah and his family safe. Noah obeyed God and built the ark. ▶ GOD WANTS US TO OBEY, too, to keep us safe.

# Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- What are ways rules can keep us from getting hurt?
- Why is it important to follow the rules that keep us safe?

Say: God loves us and wants what's best for us. GOD WANTS US TO OBEY so we can be safe every day.



# **Daily Challenges**

## What You'll Do

After the children have cleaned up the centers, bring everyone back to the circle area on the floor. Review the lesson activities and the Bible Point, and then encourage the children to share what they remember about what they learned from the Bible today.

Also use this time to challenge kids in their faith. Encourage them to choose a Daily Challenge for applying today's lesson to their lives this week. Use this challenge for encouraging your children's growing relationships with Jesus.



## Talk With Kids

Say: Today we learned that GOD WANTS US TO OBEY. I'd like each of you to choose a way to obey God this week.

Read these three ideas for children to choose from:

- Make your bed in the morning before you go to breakfast.
- Using stuffed animals, show your family what happened with Noah. Talk about how your family can obey God like Noah did.
- When your mom or dad asks you to stop doing something, stop right away without complaining.

Have kids each whisper in your ear or tell you which idea they've chosen, and then circle it on each child's My Bible Playground page. Make sure you choose a challenge as well and tell kids which challenge you chose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as theirs!

# "Help Me Obey" Prayer

## What You'll Do

Help kids think of situations where they need help obeying. Then encourage kids to share those things when instructed in this prayer.

Pray: **Dear God,** (fold hands in prayer)

Help me to obey when...(have kids raise hands and share, if they're comfortable)

I pray that you'll be pleased. (nod head)

In Jesus' name, amen. (fold hands in prayer)

Say: **GOD WANTS US TO OBEY,** and we can ask God anytime for help obeying.
