Exodus 17:1-7

od shows his love for children through many people in their lives. A hug from a parent and a kiss from a grandparent are just two ways God's love comes into children's lives. Your 5- and 6-year-olds can easily make the connection that love from people who care for them is a way that God's love flows to them. Use this lesson to help kids understand that God uses people they see every day to show how much he cares for them.

God Provides Water

Exodus 17:1-7



Food and Whine

As we begin today's lesson, we find the Israelites continuing their journey toward the Promised Land. They're still getting manna every morning and quail every evening, but they can't find water at their latest campsite. It's important to take a moment to recall that the Israelites were just beginning to know God. This is the first time God had interacted with the Israelite community as a whole. Though this doesn't excuse their actions, it might give some context for us to see ourselves in more clearly.

Again, instead of calling in faith upon the God who had secured their freedom, turned bitter water sweet, and provided manna and quail, the people complained to Moses. Again, instead of trusting God, they lamented that they were going to die in the desert for lack of water. As you can see from Exodus 17:4, Moses was exasperated. God, however, proves his patience and love in this passage, giving the Hebrews the water they needed in spite of their complaining and their lack of faith.

Acting on Faith

God had a plan. His instructions to Moses must have seemed ludicrous! Moses was to take with him the leaders of the people—likely representatives from each tribe—so that they could see firsthand what God was going to do. In front of these leaders, Moses was to hit with his staff a rock that God would point out to him. And enough water would come out of the rock to take care of the needs of 2 million people. As unlikely as God's plan seemed, Moses didn't question God. He did what God told him to do, and God did what he said he would do. Moses and God gave a convincing demonstration of what acting on faith in God can do. And God was glorified when the leaders brought back their report.

Be Encouraged

The names Moses gave to the place where all this happened mean "temptation" and "murmuring." No doubt Moses' intent was to make this place a reminder of the people's unbelief but also an encouragement toward faith in the God who had provided for them.

The Jesus Connection

Think of someone who has frustrated you recently. What needs to happen to resolve the situation? A relationship with Jesus brings us forgiveness, not perfection. Pray for clarity and the opportunity to recognize when you need to extend the same type of grace and understanding that Jesus has given you. On the lines below, write a prayer for the person who has recently frustrated you.

Tip Consistently use the same signal to announce a transition to the next activity. You could flip the lights off and on, use a train whistle, have a puppet rustling inside a bag, or sing cleanup songs. Keep it simple, consistent, and fun.

What You'll Do

As the children arrive, greet each child and welcome him or her with a smile. When it's time to begin, use your signal to bring the children together in a circle. Lead kids in doing the motions and singing "We're So Glad" (track 11 on the CD).

Say: When we come to church, we can learn about God and show love to our friends here. Today we're going to learn that ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US. No matter what's going on in our lives, we have God on our side all the time. God did something pretty amazing to provide for the Israelites when they were in the desert. Let's find out more!



Giver of Good Things

What You'll Do

Have kids sit in a circle. Open your Bible to Psalm 23:1, and show children the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Our Key Verse from the Bible, Psalm 23:1, says, "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want." This means God gives us everything we need no matter what's going on in our lives. Let's practice the Key Verse together. Lead children in repeating the adapted Key Verse with you: God gives me everything I need (Psalm 23:1).

Play "Everything I Need" (track 9 on the CD). As the music plays, have kids search for cards that show something they need.

Hide the "Giving Game" cards around the room. Make sure they're located where kids will be able to find them, but not too easily.

Once kids have each found one card, have them sit in a circle on the floor. Say: **Take turns telling us a few words about the card you found**. **Explain how God's given that thing to you**. Allow several answers.

If there are more cards (there are 20 total) that haven't been found, let kids find the rest, helping them if necessary. Repeat the sharing experience for the remainder of the cards.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- How do these pictures show God loves you by giving you what you need?
- Tell about a time you needed love.

Say: It's good to know God loves us and gives us everything we need. With each way God takes care of us, we can remember that ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US. Let's hear how God loved and took care of his people in the Bible.

What You'll Do

Say: **Friends, it's time for Theo's News!** Have the children sit in a circle. Then begin "Here, Theo" (track 3 on the CD). When the CD segment ends, bring out the Surprise Box, and put the Theophilus the FaithRetriever puppet on your hand. Then follow along with the script.

Theo: Hi, everybody!

Teacher: Hello, Theo! What have you been up to this week?

Theo: I decided to learn a new trick called stacking. I'm not super good yet, but I want

to learn so bad! Check out the Surprise Box to see what I mean. **Teacher:** Let's look inside to see what Theo dug up for us today.

(Invite a child to open the Surprise Box, and have the kids pass the paper cups around the circle so everyone can see them up close.)

Theo: I saw this video on my mom's phone where people were stacking cups all fast and amazing. It made me want to learn to do that so I can show my mom and let her know I love her. Want to see me try?

(Pause for kids to respond to Theo. Then have Theo do his best to stack the cups but knock them over.)

Teacher: Theo, I think if you keep trying, you'll get better. I'd bet the people you saw on your mom's phone took a long time to learn their new skill. There are lots of ways to use paper cups! These paper cups are a clue about what we'll be learning from the Bible today. Does anyone have any ideas?

Theo's News Easy Prep

Place the paper cups in the Surprise Box, and hide the box where it's easily accessible.



(Pause for kids to answer your question. Give kids time to guess what they'll learn from the Bible today.)

Teacher: We'll be learning about a time Moses and the Israelites were very thirsty and needed a drink, but there was no water anywhere. God did something amazing and took care of his thirsty people in the desert.

Theo: Wow! God must've loved his people a lot.

Teacher: Yes, he did. And ▶ **GOD ALWAYS LOVES US**, too.

Theo: Have fun, boys and girls. I have to go practice my cup-stacking skills!

Teacher: Let's say goodbye to Theo.

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe place for next week's use.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Tell about a time you wanted to impress someone the way Theo wanted to impress his mom.
- What do you think is the best way to show people that you love them?
- Which people in your life help you remember that God loves you? Explain.

Say: Theo helped us find out about today's Bible passage. God did some big things to show the Israelites that he loved them. He did everything possible to show them he loved them so much that he would do impossible things to care for them. ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US, and we can trust him to be there for us in everything we face.

Bible Time: Rockin' Water Splash

What You'll Do

Set the baking pan with the rocks and balloon in the middle of your group. Sit in a circle. Open your Bible to Exodus 17:1-7, and show kids the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Last week we learned that God provided food for the Israelites and that God gives us what we need. The Bible tells us that ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US.

Before you read the passage summary below to the children, explain that they'll hear the words "The Israelites said..." Each time they hear these words, they'll respond by saying, "We're so thirsty." Practice this a few times before you begin reading.

Say: The Israelites had been traveling a long time. They were hot and tired and very cranky. They were also very thirsty because the place where they were camping didn't have any water. At all.

All day the Israelites said...(children respond). They got angry at Moses, and the Israelites said...(children respond).



Bible Time: Rockin' Water Splash Supplies

BALLOON WARNING

To avoid choking hazards, be sure to pick up pieces of any broken balloons promptly. Balloons may contain latex.



Say: Moses felt bad and didn't know what to do. He asked the Israelites, "Why are you so angry with me?" But the people wanted to be grumpy. *The Israelites said...* (children respond).

So Moses asked God, "What can I do for these people? I'm afraid they might hurt me if I don't give them something to drink." Choose a willing child to hold the wooden skewer. This child will be Moses. Have the other kids tell "Moses" they're thirsty.

Say: God heard when the Israelites said...(children respond). God told Moses to take his walking stick and hit the rock in front of him. So Moses did what God told him to do. Ask Moses to poke the rock pile with the wooden skewer. Help Moses poke through the rocks if that's difficult. Say: When Moses hit the rock, lots of water came out of the rock!

The Israelites were thankful because God gave them water that came out of the rocks. God gave the Israelites everything they needed because he loved them.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What surprised you about "Moses" poking the rock today?
- Describe what it's like to be really thirsty.
- What was your reaction the last time someone gave you water when you were really thirsty?
- Explain whether that reaction is like or unlike your reaction to God's love for you.

Say: The pile of rocks that we had sure had a lot of water in them. God made the rock in the Bible give enough water for all of the Israelites to have enough to drink. That's a lot of water! God showed his love and care for the Israelites by giving them water when they needed it.

GOD ALWAYS LOVES US and cares for us, too! We can be thankful and follow God's directions for us when God shows us his love. We can love God, too.



WEAVING FAITH

INTO LIFE

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. Then circulate among the children as they create and explore. Encourage them to make connections between their activities and the Bible by asking them the questions included with each center's description.



CENTER 1:

Water to Drink

What You'll Do

Say: God made water come out of a rock just to show his love for his people. He could have led them to a lake, but instead he did something amazing and reminded them that he was taking care of them. Let's paint some delicious water for the Israelites to help us remember what God did.

Distribute the My Bible Playground student pages, and have kids write their names on their papers. Then give kids paintbrushes and small cups containing ½ teaspoon of blue powdered-drink mix and 1 teaspoon of water. Encourage the children to paint water onto the rocks on their pages. As the children paint, say: The Israelites didn't seem to remember that God loved them. They whined and complained about being thirsty. God did something amazing to provide for their needs. God loved the Israelites very much, and

GOD ALWAYS LOVES US, too.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What do you think of the Israelites' complaining?
- Tell about the last time you complained about something.
- What's one thing you can do instead of complaining next time?

Say: It makes God sad when we whine and complain like the Israelites did, but ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US. We can make God happy when we treat each other nicely and are thankful to God for the ways he shows us love. God provides for our needs, gives us our families, and helps us each day. We can show him love, too.

CENTER 2:

Not Another Water Trick

What You'll Do

Say: God did impossible things with lots of water to take care of his people. To help you remember the impossible things God did with water, we're going to do something really unusual with water, too.

Gather kids around a table. Distribute a cup of water and a piece of yarn to each child. Help kids each put ice in their water. Say: **Try to pick up the ice cubes using your yarn.** Allow a few minutes for kids to try to tie the yarn to their ice cubes.

Set the salt in the middle of the table. Say: **Set the end of your piece of yarn on top of the ice cube.** Demonstrate how to generously sprinkle salt on top of the ice cube and

yarn. Say: Count to eight, and then lift the yarn and ice out of the water together. Make sure kids don't submerge the ice cubes but just rest the yarn gently on top of the cubes.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was it like to try to pick up the ice in different ways?
- Tell about a time you needed help to do something.
- How does God's love help you when you can't do things on your own?

Say: The salt helped the ice cubes stick to the yarn. The salt was like God. ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US and gives us what we need. God gave the thirsty (and whiny) Israelites water to drink, and he'll help us because he loves us, too. We can trust God's love for us and know that he'll be with us all the time.

Center 3: "We're So Thirsty" Relay Supplies

1 cup of water per child rocks

CENTER 3:

"We're So Thirsty" Relay

What You'll Do

Say: Let's do a relay to remind us about God's love for us. God made water come out of a dry old rock for the Israelites, and he'll take care of us, too.

Have the children form two lines. Set cups of water on the opposite side of the room from the two teams. Explain that the kids will pretend to be the thirsty Israelites and will crawl on their bellies to the cups of water. After each child drinks, he or she will shout "Thank you, God!" and walk joyfully back to join the entire group.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was it like to get to the water?
- How do you know God loves you even if things are difficult?

Say: When you drink water, you can remember that GOD ALWAYS LOVES US and gives us everything we need. God cares for us by providing everything we need. We can thank God for all the amazing ways he takes care of us, just like the Israelites were able to thank God for meeting their needs.



CENTER 4:

Loving Reflection

What You'll Do

Say: God did miraculous things to take care of the Israelites, and he is still taking care of us today. Take some time to think about the ways God takes care of you. Maybe you notice that your home is warm and safe or that you have good food to eat each day, or maybe you're thankful for the love of your family. Take a few minutes to quietly talk to God and thank him for those things.

Create a quiet, reflective atmosphere. Dim the lights in the room, and ask kids to find a quiet space to be alone. Say: **Think about areas of your life in which God has provided for you. Take a few minutes to think about those areas of your life and thank God for how he's provided for your needs.** Play "The Heart of the Matter" (track 24 on the CD), and allow time for kids to pray.

After about 30 seconds, pause the CD and say: God provides for your needs because he loves you. God made our entire big world, and he loves you so much that he knows how many hairs you have on your head. Find a partner, and talk about the ways God loves you. Play the CD again, and allow the song to finish.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was it like to be thankful for things you don't normally think about?
- What are you most thankful for?
- Tell some ways others help you see God's love.

Say: God loves each of you, and he takes care of your needs. No matter what's going on in your life, you can be sure that ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US, just as he loved the Israelites and took care of their needs. We can be thankful and show God our love in return for the love he shows us.



Daily Challenges

What You'll Do

After the children have cleaned up the centers, sit with kids in a circle on the floor. Review the lesson activities and the Bible Point, and then encourage the children to share what they enjoyed learning from the Bible today.

Also use this time to challenge kids in their faith. Encourage them to choose a Daily Challenge for applying today's lesson to their lives throughout the week. Use this challenge to encourage your children's growing relationships with Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Say: Today we learned that ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US. I'd like each of you to choose one of these Daily Challenges to practice having a thankful heart.

Give kids these three Daily Challenge ideas to choose from:

- 1. Write a note to your grandma and grandpa, and tell them that you love them and that God loves you.
- 2. Play with dolls or action figures, and act out ways God shows his love for you every day.
- 3. Help your mom or dad make dinner for your family. When your family eats, remind them that God gives you the food you eat because he loves each of you.

Say: If you want to write a note, circle choice number 1. If you want to play with dolls or action figures, circle choice number 2. If you want to help make dinner, circle choice number 3. Check that each child circled a choice on his or her My Bible Playground page. Make sure you tell kids the challenge you choose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as in theirs!

"Love" Prayer

What You'll Do

Have kids stand in a circle and follow the motions as you read the following prayer.

Pray: Dear God,

Thank you for loving us. (have kids give themselves a hug)

You give us good things. (pretend to open a present)

We're glad you love us, and we love you, too. (reach hands into the middle of the circle and say "We love God!" as they raise their hands together) In Jesus' name, amen.

Weaving Faith at Home
