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

Samson Receives Strength From God

Judges 15:9-16; 16:4-30



The Nazarite Vow

Before he was born, Samson was set apart to live the life of a Nazarite (Judges 13:2-7). A Nazarite abstained from wine, never used a razor, and avoided contact with any dead body.

Even though Samson was declared a Nazarite, he likely adhered only to the second of these practices. In fact, an examination of his life as described in Judges 14–16 reveals that he was not a particularly religious or even morally upright person. Even so, God selected him and used him mightily in delivering Israel from the Philistines.

Samson's Great Victories and Failures

In spite of his great victories for Israel, Samson is especially known for his failure. He could have led Israel to a position of great strength. He could have led people back to God. He could have wiped out the Philistines, preventing them from ever bothering Israel again. Instead, he confided in the foreign woman whom he apparently loved, but who was set on his destruction. Even so, the New Testament doesn't remember Samson as a failure. In Hebrews he is listed among those who faithfully served God (Hebrews 11:32).

In spite of his failings, Samson had kept his vow to keep his hair long. When he told Delilah the secret of his strength and his hair was cut, everyone could see that God was no longer working in Samson's life.

Samson, Humiliated by Philistines, Is Redeemed

The temple in which Samson was mocked was not only a temple to the god Dagon, but it was also an entertainment center. Thousands crowded into the temple to see Samson in disgrace. They even gathered

on the roof to see the spectacle below. Archaeological evidence has revealed that one type of ancient temple was supported by two central wood pillars on marble bases. His strength renewed by God, Samson was able to push those pillars off their bases, thereby collapsing the whole roof and killing everyone under and on top of it.

The Jesus Connection

It's great to have a friend in Jesus! When we mess up, he's always there to forgive us.

Samson had unbelievable strength that he started

out using for God. But then he messed up—big time!
When have you felt you've really messed up? How
has that failure affected your serving God? Talk to
God about that. You can write your prayer here.

Always With Us

What You'll Do

Take out the "God Is Always With Us" cards from the Teacher Pack, and separate them and place them face down in a pile in front of you.

Have children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to Isaiah 41:10, and show the children the words.

Say: Our Key Verse from the Bible says, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God." This means that we should not fear, because God is with us. Let's say our verse together. Lead the children in repeating the adapted Key Verse: "Do not fear; God is with you."

Ask:

Can you tell me about a time you were scared or worried about something?

Say: The Bible tells us that no matter where we are or what is going on in our lives, God is with us and taking care of us. So we don't have to be afraid; we can trust God to help us. I've placed a pile of cards in front of me. Together with a partner, I'd like you to choose a card and act out the situation drawn on the card. The rest of us will try to guess the situation on the card. Remember that in each of these situations, God is with us.

Choose partners for the kids. If you have an uneven number of kids, be a partner yourself. Give children ideas about how to act out the gifts. For example, a pair who chooses the running card could jog in place, or children who choose the ladder card could mime climbing a ladder. There are 10 cards. If you have more than 20 kids, you can either reshuffle the cards to use again, or have the kids form groups of three instead of two. After the class has guessed all of the situations, collect the cards and place them in a pile in front of you.

Say: Our Key Verse tells us not to fear, because God is with us. No matter where you are or what you are doing, God is with you and taking care of you. You can pray to God or sing to him when you feel alone or scared. He loves you and will always listen to you and give you strength in those situations. Let's say "thank you" to God for being with us all the time.

Hold up the cards, one at a time, and show the kids. Have them thank God for being with them in each particular situation shown. Then place each card in the gift-wrapped shoe box. Help kids come up with their own examples of times God is with them.

Say: Every day you are in new places and new situations. Our Key Verse today says that God is with us during those times and all the time. This is one of God's gifts to us! He loves us and is always with us. Hold up the gift box. We can pray to God and talk to him, and he will always listen to us and take care of us. In today's story we will see how God was always with a man named Samson.

What You'll Do

Say: **Friends, it's time for Theo's News!** Have the children sit in a circle. Then begin "Here, Theo" (track 2 on the CD). When the CD segment ends, bring out the Surprise Box, and put the Theophilus the FaithRetriever puppet on your hand. Then follow along with the script.

Theo: Hi, everybody!

Teacher: Hello, Theo! Tell us what interesting news you've dug up about our Bible story.

Theo: I hid it in the Surprise Box.

Teacher: Let's look inside to see what Theo found for us today.

(Choose a child to open the Surprise Box, and have the kids pass the hand weight around the circle so the rest of the class can see it up close. Give the children time to guess what the Bible story might be about.)

Teacher: Theo, why did you hide an exercise weight in the Surprise Box?

Theo: Well, there's a man in the story who was very, very strong.

Teacher: Kids, what are weights used for?

(Pause for kids to tell you what they know about weights and exercise.)

Theo: People exercise with weights to make themselves strong. In today's Bible story, a man named Samson didn't need to use a weight like this to become big and strong—

God just made him that way!

Teacher: Let's see how Samson used his gift of strength to serve others.

Theo: Have fun, boys and girls! **Teacher:** Say goodbye to Theo.

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe place for next week's use.

Bible Time

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Judges 15, and show the children the words.

Say: Today's Bible story tells us that **DOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS.** Have kids repeat the Bible Point after you. Then set the four gift bags in front of you, and tell kids that you'll be using the bags to tell the Bible story. Hold up the "Samson" poster as you begin the story.

A long time ago, there was a man named Samson. Samson had very long hair. God gave Samson a special gift of strength! Show me how you can make big muscles! Have children stand up and show their strong muscles. The Philistines were mean people who didn't like Samson and wanted to put him in prison! Samson's people, the people of Judah, were afraid of the Philistines, so they went to find Samson. Lead children in marching in place and looking around.

When the people of Judah found Samson they said, "Samson! What have you done to us?" Have children repeat, "Samson, what have you done to us?" The people of Judah were afraid Samson was going to get them all in trouble, so they took Samson to the Philistines so they would all be safe. Set aside the "Samson" poster for use later in the story.

Choose a child to open Gift Bag 1 and hold up the string licorice.

Say: The people of Judah tied Samson up and led him to the Philistines. Help the children loop the licorice around their wrists so everyone is connected. Loop the licorice around your wrists last. The Philistines came running and shouting. Lead kids in stomping their feet and shouting while their wrists are still connected with licorice.

Bible Time Easy Prep

On the head of Samson, glue at least one strand of 12-inch brown or black yarn per child. Allow the yarn to hang below the edge of the poster. Number four brightly colored gift bags. Place the following items in the bags: Gift Bag 1: string licorice, Gift Bag 2: the Paper Heart, Gift Bag 3: play money, Gift Bag 4: safety scissors.



Say: But ▶ GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS, and he gave Samson a burst of strength to break the ropes! Have kids take the licorice off their wrists. Let the kids eat the licorice as they experience the rest of the story. Samson was so strong, he picked up the bone of a donkey and struck down 1,000 men!

Later on, Samson fell in love.

Choose another child to open Gift Bag 2 and hold up the Paper Heart. Have children place their hands on their hearts and say "Ahh."

Say: But the girl, Delilah, only wanted to trick Samson. Lead children in "booing." The mean Philistine rulers wanted Delilah to find out why Samson was so strong. If Delilah found out, they'd give her something.

Choose another child to open Gift Bag 3 and hold up the play money. Have the children rub their fingers together and say "Gimme money! Gimme money!"

Say: Money! So, Delilah nagged and nagged at poor Samson to share his secret. One day, Samson shouted, "Enough!" Lead children in shouting "Enough!" Samson told Delilah that if someone cut his hair, he'd lose his strength. Lead children in fluffing their own hair.

One night, Samson fell asleep. Have everyone snore. Then whisper, "Guess what happened?"

Choose another child to open Gift Bag 4 and hold up the safety scissors. Show kids the "Samson" poster.

Say: Snip! The Philistines cut off all Samson's hair. Give each child a turn to take the safety scissors and cut off one strand of the long yarn. When they have finished, cut off any remaining strands of yarn. Samson lost his strength, and his enemies took him to prison. Have children stand in a straight line in front of you. Have each child hold onto the waist or shoulders of the person in front of him or her. Hold the hands of the first person in line and lead the line of children to "prison." While Samson was in prison, the Philistines wanted Samson to entertain them in a large place.

Let me show you what happened! Have the children create a wall by standing side by side in a straight line. Have kids move far enough apart in the middle of the "wall" to leave a doorway. Samson was brought in, and he stood between two large posts. He prayed for God to give him the gift of being strong again! He wanted to use his gift to serve others. Stand in the "doorway." Samson put one arm on each post, and he pushed with all his might! Gently nudge the children on either side of you, and lead them in crumbling to the ground. The walls crumbled, and the whole building fell on top of the enemies! Have kids sit in a circle.

Samson used his gift of strength to conquer the mean Philistines. Just like he gave good gifts to Samson, ▶ GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS to you so you can serve others.



Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was the gift God gave Samson?
- How do you think Samson felt when he lost his strength?
- What would you do if you were strong like Samson?

Say: God gave Samson the gift of strength so that he could conquer the Philistines and show how powerful God is. God gives each of us good gifts so that we can serve others, too.



WEAVING FAITH

INTO LIFE

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. Then circulate among the children as they create and explore. Encourage them to make connections between their activities and the Bible by asking them the questions included with each center's description.

CENTER 1:

My Special Gift

What You'll Do

Distribute the Lesson 2 My Bible Playground student pages. Set out gel pens and gift bows.

Say: God gives everyone special gifts that they can use to serve others. Look at the different gifts around the page and think about what your gifts might be. Then, in the blank gift package, draw yourself using that gift in a way that makes God happy. For example, you could draw a picture of yourself patting the back of a friend who is crying, or you could draw a picture of yourself singing a song for your grandparents.


Help children write their names on the gift-tag portion of their pages. When children finish, have them each place a gift bow onto the drawing to remind them that ► GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS!

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What good gift do you think God has given you?
- How can you use that gift to serve others?

Center 3: Gifts Made for Sharing Easy Prep

Cut up a large piece of poster board into six to eight puzzle pieces of various shapes and sizes, one per child. Say: Figure GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS so we can serve others. Remember to thank God for all the gifts he's given you!

CENTER 2:

Good 'n' Plenty Gifts

What You'll Do

Have children wash their hands (or use wet wipes) and then sit in a circle. Give each child a two-foot length of yarn. Fill a large bowl with large fruit-flavored cereal rings. Tell kids that we serve others when we say nice things to them. Have kids work in pairs and take turns saying nice things about their partners, such as "You tell funny jokes" or "You have a great smile." As each child receives a compliment, have him or her "thread" a cereal ring onto his or her piece of yarn. Continue with the compliments until everyone has lots of rings on their yarn pieces. Help children tie their yarn pieces around their necks to make necklaces.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- How did it feel to say nice things about your friends?
- How did it feel to have your friends tell you nice things?
- How can you serve others by saying nice things to them?

Say: We can serve others by telling each other nice things. Nice words are sweet, like the cereal on our necklaces. Our words are also powerful like Samson. Words can either hurt people or make them feel better. So let's remember to serve others by telling each other nice things.

CENTER 3:

Gifts Made for Sharing

What You'll Do

Give each child a puzzle piece and several washable markers. Ask the children to think about one of their gifts from God and draw a picture on their puzzle piece of themselves doing the action. For example, they could draw a picture of themselves playing nicely with friends. Or they could draw a picture of themselves waving to new neighbors. When kids finish, have them work together to assemble the giant puzzle. Then have the children look at the completed puzzle and see how all their good gifts fit together perfectly to serve others.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why do you think God gave each of us different gifts?
- How can you work together with a friend to serve others?

Say: God gives each of us good gifts, just like he gave Samson a good gift. When we all work together to use our gifts, we can be powerful like Samson! We can work together to make puzzles or sing songs or welcome new friends. When we serve others together, just think what we can do for God!

CENTER 4:

"Giving" Mobile

What You'll Do

Say: Samson received a special gift from God; he received the gift of great strength. ▶ GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS. He's given all of you gifts, too. Let's look through magazines and find some good gifts that God has given to us.

Have the children look through magazines and cut out four pictures that represent good gifts that God gives them such as homes, food, parents, friends, and church. (Younger children may need assistance.) Then have the children each glue a picture of one "good gift" to a square of construction paper. Punch a hole in the upper part of the square, and tie a piece of yarn to it. Help kids tie the other end of the yarn to one of the holes you punched in the outside edge of the pie tins (or plates). Do this with the other three pictures as well. Tie the squares at different lengths to make each mobile more interesting. As the children work, talk about the many good gifts God gives them.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What are some of the gifts God has given you?
- How can you say "thank you" for the good gifts God has given you?

Say: ▶ GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS because he loves us. Samson used his good gift to serve God; we should also use our gifts to serve God and other people. Take your mobiles home with you to remind you of the good gifts God has given you.



Center 4: "Giving" Mobile Supplies

1 pot pie pan or small paper plate per child 4 different colored sheets of construction paper per child yarn paper punch magazines glue 1 pair of safety scissors per child yarn needle

Center 4: "Giving" Mobile Easy Prep

Prepare a pot pie tin (or paper plate) for each child by using a yarn needle to poke a piece of yarn down through the center and then back up, to tie a loop for hanging. Then punch four holes around the outside edge of each tin with a paper punch. Cut four 12-inch pieces of yarn and four 3-inch squares of any color construction paper for each child.

What You'll Do

After the children have cleaned up the centers, sit with kids in a circle on the floor. Review the lesson activities and the Bible Point, and then encourage the children to share what they enjoyed learning from the Bible today.

Also use this time to challenge kids in their faith. Encourage them to choose a Daily Challenge for applying today's lesson to their lives this week. Use this challenge to encourage your children's growing relationships with Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Say: Today we learned that ▶ GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS. I'd like each of you to choose one of these Daily Challenges to think about how God gives good gifts.

Give kids these three Daily Challenge ideas to choose from:

- 1. Flex your muscles for a friend and tell him or her how God gave Samson a gift to serve others. God wants you to serve others with his good gifts, too.
- 2. Serve others by telling them nice things. Say one nice thing to a friend or family member each day.
- 3. Serve a couple of friends by helping them pick up their toys.

Say: If you want to flex your muscles, circle choice number 1. If you want to serve others, circle choice number 2. If you want to pick up toys, circle choice number 3. Check that each child circled a choice on his or her My Bible Playground page. Make sure you tell kids the challenge you choose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as in theirs!
