Genesis 6:5-22

abies don't yet understand what it means to obey. Many toddlers understand that the word *no* means to stop what they're doing, but they, too, have a lot of growing up to do before they can comprehend the larger concept of obedience to God's rules. Young children take their cues for appropriate behavior from their parents and other important caregivers. When caregivers demonstrate right actions, children will eagerly imitate them. As directions are given and followed, children slowly learn what it means to obey.



Noah Builds the Ark

Genesis 6:5-22



A Drastic Solution to a Huge Problem

God's statement in Genesis 6:7 grew out of pain and was a sorrowful acknowledgment that to make things better, most of the earth's population would have to die. The people that God created had so turned against him that he had to start over with the few who remained faithful.

Fortunately, one righteous man still loved God. The word translated "righteous" in verse 9 indicates that Noah sought both to worship and obey God and also to live in fairness with his human neighbors who didn't share his values. Noah was a shining example of goodness in a dark world.

Consider the immensity of the task Noah undertook. The ark was one and a half times the length of a football field, as wide as a high-school basketball court is long, and as tall as a five-story building. There were to be three decks inside and many rooms to house all the different animals. All of this was to be built of a particular kind of wood (which we can't identify precisely) in an arid area where wood likely was not plentiful.

A Unique, Sea-Worthy Vessel

Obviously no one had ever built a floating zoo of that size. Fortunately, God knew what he was doing. Modern shipbuilding experts have confirmed that the dimensions given in the Bible would be ideal to ensure that a large wooden vessel would remain intact and upright while adrift in heavy seas.

In addition to caring for his family, Noah was given the responsibility of housing and feeding two of every kind of animal in the ark (Genesis 6:19, 21). In an amazing miracle, God led all the animals to the ark at just the right time. And the reason there were seven pairs of certain animals was so that Noah would have animals

to sacrifice in worship without wiping out a species (Genesis 7:2-3).

We don't know how often Noah was discouraged or if his neighbors and family ridiculed him. But we do know that he "did everything just as God commanded him." And that's a great example of faithful obedience for all of us.

The Jesus Connection

Jesus obeyed God in every turn and detail of his life. When we look to Jesus and follow his example, we're obeying God. What a beautiful way to live!

When has God directed you to do something? It can sometimes seem scary, but it's also exciting because God reveals his faithfulness and strength when we obey him in the things he asks us to do. Take comfort in knowing that when you obey, God will give everything you need to carry out his plans. Ask God what he wants you to do. You can write your prayer here.

Animals on Parade

What You'll Do

Gather a group of toddlers around the "Big Boat" teaching poster. Open your Bible to Genesis 6:5-22, and tell children this is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells us God asked a man named Noah to build a big boat called an ark.

Ask: Can you make a hammer with your fist? Show toddlers how. Pound, pound, pound with the hammer. Noah obeyed God.

Then God told Noah to find the animals. Noah obeyed God and found lots of animals.

Let's find the animals on our poster. Let children point to different animals.

Play "Animal Sounds" (track 8 on the CD). After each animal sound, say the name of the animal and have toddlers point to the animal on the "Big Boat" poster.

Pass around the fleece.

Say: This fleece is soft. Do you see any animals with soft fur? Let kids point to soft animals. Then put the fleece away.

God told Noah to get two of each animal to follow him. Hold up two fingers.

Ask: Can you stand up and follow me, like the animals followed Noah? Parade around the room, encouraging the toddlers to follow you.

Say: Noah obeyed God. You obeyed me. ► GOD WANTS US TO OBEY. Good job! Encourage children to applaud themselves.

Set out large crayons or washable markers, the nature stickers, and copies of "The Ark" page. Let each child place an animal sticker on his or her page. Then help children find matching stickers for the animals they already placed. Then let children color their pictures.

Say: Noah obeyed God. The animals followed Noah. They obeyed, too. ▶ GOD WANTS US TO OBEY.

What You'll Do

Turn a table on its side to create an ark. Have children go behind the table.

Say: Are the dogs in the ark? Let me hear you bark. Bark with the children. Are the worms in the ark? Let me see you wiggle. Wiggle with children. Are the cows in the ark: Let me hear you moo. Moo with the children. Are the chickens in the arkk? Let me hear you cluck. Cluck with children.

Encourage children to respond by making the appropriate sound or motion. Continue as long as children are interested.

Say: Good job! You obeyed when you made your animal sounds. Noah followed God's directions, too. That's obeying God. ▶ GOD WANTS US TO OBEY.

Build an Arky

What You'll Do

Gather children together. Open your Bible to Genesis 6:5-22, and tell children this is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells us about a man named Noah. Noah loved God so much that he did what God told him to.

GOD WANTS US TO OBEY. Noah obeyed God.

First God told Noah how to build the ark. Let's build the ark. Instruct children to place blocks on the ark outline. Help them make a simple ramp by leaning one end of a piece of cardboard on some blocks and setting the other end on the floor. Noah obeyed God by building the ark. We can obey God, too.

Next, God told Noah to put his family in the ark. Noah obeyed God by taking his family into the ark. We can obey God, too. Instruct children to hold hands and walk together into the block ark.

Then God told Noah to bring two of every animal into the ark. Instruct each child to find one or two animals. Then have children walk their animals up the ramp and into the ark as you play "Animal Sounds" (track 8 on the CD). You obeyed and brought the animals into the ark. Noah obeyed God by bringing the animals into the ark.

Show children the "Noah's Ark" poster, and let them point out the ark and Noah. Help children put some animal stickers on the ark in the poster.

Say: We learned about Noah. Noah obeyed God. We can obey God too. ▶ GOD WANTS US TO OBEY.

What You'll Do

Set out large crayons or washable markers, the nature stickers, and copies of "The Ark" page.

Ask: What's your favorite animal? Help children find a sticker of their favorite animal and put it on the ramp leading into the ark in the picture. Then have children color their pictures. If you have stickers left over, let kids put more animals on their pages.

Say: Noah obeyed God and built the ark. The animals obeyed and followed Noah, just as Noah obeyed God. ▶ GOD WANTS US TO OBEY.

Give each child a stuffed animal.

Say: Fig. GOD WANTS US TO OBEY. Let's see how well you can follow my directions as we play this game. Have children do motions with their animals as you say this rhyme:

Growing With Jesus



our child learned that God wants us to obey (from Genesis 6:5-22). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

Going to the Ark

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Place your baby on his or her tummy on a blanket, along with a stuffed animal. Pull the blanket slowly across the floor as you say this rhyme:

We're going to the ark.
We're going to the ark.
Two by two I'm pulling
you,
We're going to the ark.

TODDLER

Who's in the Ark?

Turn a table on its side to create an ark. Have your child go behind the table.

Ask:

- Are the dogs in the ark? Let me hear you bark. Bark with your child.
- Are the worms in the ark? Let me see you wiggle. Wiggle with your child.
- Are the cows in the ark? Let me hear you moo. Moo with your child.

Have your child respond by making the appropriate sound or motion, and add others (clucking chickens, hopping bunnies).

Say: Good job! You obeyed when you made your animal sounds. Noah followed God's directions, too. God wants us to obey. 2-YEAR-OLD

Animal Wiggle

Give your child a stuffed animal.

Say: God wants us to obey. Let's see how well you can obey as we play this game. Have your child do the following actions as you say this rhyme:

Hold your animal above your head. Hold your animal above your head. Hold your animal above your head. God wants us to obey.

Catch Them in the Act

It's important to develop consistent discipline in your home. In your efforts to teach your child to obey, don't overlook the power of "catching" your child doing good things. In fact, work hard to encourage and praise your child 10 times as often as you correct or discipline him or her.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Make animal sounds for your child to imitate.
- Set out an assortment of your child's favorite finger foods. Give simple instructions such as "Let's put the peas in the bowl" or "Now let's eat a piece of cheese." Then share the snack.
