

# People Build a Tower at Babel

Genesis 11:1-9

nfants and toddlers are dependent on adult caregivers to meet even their most basic needs. If these needs aren't met, young children perceive the world as a scary, unfriendly place, and they'll likely have trouble believing that God can meet their needs. But if babies experience loving care and, as a result, perceive the world to be a safe and caring place, their faith development is secure. The trust they put in their loving caregivers will eventually lead them to trust God for what they need.



# People Build a Tower at Babel

Genesis 11:1-9



#### People Turn Away From God Again

The pattern continues. Just a few generations and likely only 100 to 200 years after the miraculous saving of Noah's family in the ark, the descendants of those ark dwellers turned away from God. After Noah came out of the ark, one of God's commands to him was to "fill the earth" (Genesis 9:1). It appears that God wanted people to spread out across the earth, but some people decided to group together in a city, making a name for themselves and keeping themselves from being scattered. They showed no concern for glorifying or obeying God. And Noah lived to see all of this happen—Genesis 9:28 tells us that Noah lived 350 years after the Flood!

The people's intent in building a tower was not to reach heaven, as some have suggested, but to build something showy that would bring them recognition. People from all around would see the tall tower that seemed to reach into the heavens. Others would marvel at what they had done, and the builders would be proud. In essence, they tried to make themselves look more important than God.

# The Tower Was Just the Beginning

If these people were able to do such a self-serving, God-defying thing as to build this tower, what other evil things were next on the horizon? How long would it be before none were left who honored God? Out of concern for keeping people from further evil, God put a stop to what was happening by causing people to speak different languages.

# God's Still in Charge

It's interesting to think about how God might have used this incident to differentiate various races.

By selectively giving certain individuals the same language, God could have directed which people clustered together, and their gene pools could have resulted in races with very different physical characteristics, such as exist today.

Some ancient reports indicate that an unfinished tower stood—perhaps for centuries—just outside the city of Babylon. God took something that evil people intended as a monument to themselves and turned it into a monument to his power and sovereignty. God wants us all to remember what he's done for us and how much we need him!

#### **The Jesus Connection**

In all our decisions and experiences, we need God. God meets our needs through Jesus, who fulfills our greatest needs for mercy, love, and eternal life. Jesus is our everything!

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# Sing and Celebrate

#### What You'll Do

Sing "We Need Jesus" (track 10 on the CD) to the tune of "Do Lord" to the babies anytime during the lesson. Sing as you rock, feed, or play with the infants. Hold a baby close, and rock side to side as you sing the words "We all need Jesus." Lean the baby backward and then draw the baby close as you sing "oh, yes."

### Higher and Higher!

#### What You'll Do

As crawlers are playing on the floor or as you hold an infant, show the "Tower" teaching picture.

Say: Look. See the people? They're building a tower all by themselves. People in the Bible built a tower. They thought they didn't need God. Gently pound a baby's fists together. The tower is getting higher...and higher...and higher! Raise the baby's hands up into a stretch. Indicate higher and higher with your voice. Then God said, "No more!" Quickly lower the baby's hands. Our Bible tells us WE NEED GOD.



#### No Tower!

#### What You'll Do

Make a tower of up to five blocks, and show a baby how to knock them over. As you build, say "tower," drawing out the word. As you knock the blocks down, quickly say, "No tower!" Then start the game all over again. By about 9 months, some babies can stack two to three large blocks by themselves.

Say: ► WE NEED GOD.

### **Build a Tower**

#### What You'll Do

Use this action rhyme to help build babies' growing muscle-control skills:

**Build a tower to the sky.** (make baby's hands into fists and alternate one on top of the other as you say these two lines)

Build it taller, high, high, high.

**Don't forget 'bout God's great love.** (cross baby's right arm toward the left shoulder; then cross the left arm toward the right shoulder)

Praise God's name in heaven above! (raise baby's hands above his or her head)

### **Bend and Lift**

#### What You'll Do

Gather a group of toddlers together, and show the "Tower" teaching picture. Open your Bible to Genesis 11:1-9, and tell children this is God's special book.

Say: See the people? Our Bible tells us people worked together to build a tower with *big* blocks, all by themselves. They bent over and lifted the big, heavy blocks, and then they put them down, one on top of the other. Let's pretend we're building the tower with them. Oh, these blocks are so heavy. [Name of toddler], will you help me lift this block?

Encourage toddlers to pretend to strain as they help each other lift pretend blocks and raise them high.

Say: The people in the Bible thought if they tried hard enough they could build a tower without God. But God said, "No more!" and the people couldn't work together anymore. The people should have asked God for help. ▶ WE NEED GOD.



### **Babel Blocks**

#### What You'll Do

Set out large crayons or washable markers, a box of tissues, and tape. Give each toddler a block pattern with his or her name on it to color. Explain that you'll help children fold it into a block. Let toddlers color as long as they're interested. Then collect the patterns, and fold and tape the block forms. Leave one side of each block open. Have toddlers take turns bringing you tissues to stuff into the blocks; then help toddlers tape their blocks closed.

Say: God didn't want the people to try to build the tower without him! God wants to be part of our plans. ▶ WE NEED GOD.

Encourage toddlers who want to stack their blocks into a tower. (Some may not want to surrender their blocks.) Then have the builders knock the tower down as everyone says, 

"WE NEED GOD!"

### Can't Build to Heaven

#### What You'll Do

## Sing and Celebrate

#### What You'll Do

Sing "We Need Jesus" (track 10 on the CD) to the tune of "Do Lord" anytime during the lesson. Explain to 2-year-olds that we need Jesus all the time, no matter where we are or what we're doing. Lead them in doing the motions as they sing.

## We Need God

#### What You'll Do

Gather children together. Open your Bible to Genesis 11:1-9, and tell children this is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells us that after the flood ended, Noah's family grew until there were lots of people again. They wanted to show God how great they were, so they decided to build a tower to heaven. Do you think that was a good idea? Show "The Tower of Babel" poster, and ask children to describe what they see in the picture. Give each child a craft stick and encourage children to stack the sticks on top of the tower in the poster. The people in the Bible began building a tower to show they were more important than God. God didn't like this.

• WE NEED GOD, and we need to do what God wants.

Ask: Can you tell me some things God wants us to do? Help children come up with things God wants them to do, such as obeying parents, sharing, or being kind to friends.

Say: God gave us parents to take care of us and help us do the things God wants us to do.

Ask: What kinds of things do your parents do for you? Be ready with examples such as making their lunch, tucking them in, and giving them a bath.

Say: Our parents give us food to eat, clothes to wear, a special place to live, and lots of love. We need our parents. Our parents take care of us and have a special plan for us. God has a special plan for us, too, and 

WE NEED GOD. Encourage kids to knock down the "tower" of craft sticks on the poster.

### **Building-Block Fun**

#### What You'll Do

Set out large crayons or washable markers, a box of tissues, and tape. Give each child a block pattern with his or her name on it to color. Have children color the block patterns.

Say: We're coloring blocks so we can build a tower just for fun. In the Bible, some people tried to build a tower to show they were more important than God. ▶ WE NEED GOD, but we can't build a tower to get to him.

After children have colored their block patterns, help them fold the blocks along the dotted lines and tape the blocks together. Leave one side of each block open. Give each child a handful of tissues to stuff into his or her block. Help children tape the blocks closed.

Say: You needed help to finish your blocks. We need God's help with everything we do. ▶ WE NEED GOD!

Encourage children to cooperate and build a tower with their blocks. Then let children take turns knocking the tower down. Make sure kids each get their own block back when they're finished.

### **Cracker Towers**

#### What You'll Do

Have children clean their hands. Set out square crackers, and encourage children to build towers with the crackers. After a few minutes, set out plastic knives, softened cream cheese, and napkins. (If you add a small amount of milk, the cream cheese will be easier for 2-year-olds to spread.) Show children how to spread cream cheese between the crackers to make taller, sturdier towers. Remind kids we need God to help us, just as the crackers need something in between them to stack up.

Ask children if they're worried about anything. Wait for answers. Remind children we need God, and then pray with them about their concerns. After the prayer, let them eat their cheese-and-cracker towers.

Say: God loves us, and ▶ WE NEED GOD.

# **Growing With Jesus**

#### INFANT

#### No Tower!

Make a tower of three to five blocks, and show your baby how to knock them over. As you build, say "tower," drawing out the word. As you knock the blocks down, quickly say, "No tower!" Then start the game all over again.

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Say: God loves us, and we need God.

#### **TODDLER**

#### Can't Build to Heaven

Set out various-sized boxes, and invite your child to build a tower taller than he or she is. Let your child do it his or her own way. Your child will soon learn that it works better to put larger boxes at the bottom and smaller boxes on top. Lead your child in the following chant as he or she builds with and knocks down the boxes:

#### 2-YEAR-OLD

#### **Cracker Towers**

Show your child how to spread cream cheese between the crackers to make a taller. sturdier tower. Remind your child that we need God to help us, just as the crackers need something in between them to stack up.

Say: God loves us, and we need God.



#### In Need
