God Makes a Covenant With Abram

Genesis 15:1-18



God Reveals His Plan to Abram

Abram had just returned from defeating a coalition of kings to rescue his nephew, Lot, and God appeared to him in a vision. Notice that in Haran God simply spoke to Abram; later in Canaan God appeared before Abram; now God appeared in a lengthy vision. With each meeting, God's plan for Abram became a bit more clear.

God's first words to Abram were words of comfort. What was bothering Abram was Abram's continuing lack of a son to be his heir. In response to God's words of comfort, Abram poured out his heart pleading with God to bless him in this one area he'd not yet received God's promised blessing.

Abram Displays Faith in God

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When God assured Abram by restating his promise that Abram would have his own son, Abram responded in faith. He believed God, and God declared him righteous because of his faith! Nothing that Abram could *do* in obedience to God could make him righteous, but his faith in God did!

To give Abram complete assurance, God made a covenant with him. In those days a covenant was a very serious thing. The cutting in half of animals described in Genesis 15:10 was to signify that the same would happen to any party breaking the covenant. Notice, however, that Abram wasn't asked to pass between the animals, which would have sealed his commitment to the covenant. Only God, symbolized by the smoking firepot and blazing torch, passed and sealed God's commitment to the covenant. Only God was required to fulfill the covenant.

God Promises to Bless Abram's Descendants

Another interesting note is that each type of animal that was sacrificed was later used in particular cleansing ceremonies and sacrifices.

God's listing of all the things that were to come for Abram's descendants accomplished at least two things: First, it confirmed that God's promise would come true because God could see the results more than 400 years in the future. Second, it assured Abram that even though his people would endure hardship, they would eventually possess the land as God had promised.

Sing and Celebrate

What You'll Do

Sing "Count the Stars" (track 14 on the CD) to the tune of "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star" to the babies anytime during the lesson. As you sing, make "twinkle stars" by opening and closing your fingers in front of babies' faces.

What You'll Do

As crawlers are playing on the floor or as you hold an infant, hold the Abram figure in front of the star paper.

Say: Look at all the stars! God promised Abram he would have more children than the stars. You are like a shining star! You're a blessing to your mommy and your daddy and to me! ► GOD HAS GOOD PLANS FOR US, little [baby's name].

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Way Up High

What You'll Do

Hold a baby firmly around the tummy, and raise him or her high above your head. Make eye contact with the baby as you sing "Baby, Way Up High" (not on the CD) to the tune of "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star." After you sing, bring the baby in close for a big hug.

Baby, baby, way up high, God has plans for you to try. God made you in a special way— You're growing bigger every day! Baby, baby, way up high, God has plans for you to try.

Say: **GOD HAS GOOD PLANS FOR US.**

What You'll Do

Turn on a small flashlight, and move it from side to side in front of the baby. Watch the baby track the light with his or her eyes as you say the rhyme:

Starlight, star bright, Could Abram count the stars that night?

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Too many stars in Abram's sight, Though he tried to count with all his might.

Say: **GOD HAS GOOD PLANS FOR US.**

Sing and Celebrate

What You'll Do

Sing "Count the Stars" (track 14 on the CD) to the tune of "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star" anytime during the lesson. As toddlers sing, encourage them to reach up as though they're pulling stars out of the sky.

Look up high and count the stars, Shining brightly from afar. All these stars can show God's love, Reaching down from heaven above. Look up high, and count the stars, Think of God wherever you are. (*Repeat.*)

Afterward, say: **GOD HAS GOOD PLANS FOR US.**

Sing "Count the Stars" (track 14 on the CD) to the tune of "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star" anytime during the lesson. Encourage 2-year-olds to reach up high and even stand on their tiptoes as they sing.

● Look up high and count the stars, Shining brightly from afar. All these stars can show God's love. Reaching down from heaven above. Look up high, and count the stars, Think of God wherever you are. (Repeat.)

Lead children in counting as high as they can count. Then have them shout: **GOD** HAS GOOD PLANS FOR US.

God's Covenant With Abram

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What You'll Do

Gather children together. Set the gift bows nearby. Open your Bible to Genesis 15:1-18. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book. Hold up the Abram figure from the "Baby Isaac" teaching picture.

Say: The Bible tells us that God promised Abram a very special gift. God promised Abram a baby boy! Babies are always a special gift to their families, but Abram was especially excited because he had wanted a baby for a long time. God also promised Abram more grandchildren than he could even count—more than the stars! Hold up the star paper you prepared, and let children touch the stars. Can you make twinkle stars with your hands? Twinkle, twinkle stars! Let's try to count all our stars.

Touch each child's twinkling fingers, one hand at a time, as you lead 2-year-olds in counting together.

Say: We have many stars, but God promised Abram even more grandchildren. What a great gift God gave to Abram!

What do you like best about getting a gift? I like finding the bows! Stick a gift bow on each child's back. As you place a bow on a child's back, tell something you think is wonderful about that child. That's only one reason you're a special gift, [child's name]. There are more ways than I can count!

Say: You are all special gifts, and SOD HAS GOOD PLANS FOR US.

Starry Sky

What You'll Do

Gather a few children at a time around the black construction paper "sky" you prepared. Put paint smocks or large adult T-shirts on the children. Set out yellow tempera paint and the sponge paintbrushes. Show children how to dip their paintbrushes into the paint and then paint the stars with a quick stamping motion. As each child finishes his or her painting, remove the cards from the paper to reveal the stencil design underneath. Then reposition the stencils so other children can do the activity.

Say: Say: Some of them will be surprises, just like our project was!

One, Two, Three!

What You'll Do

Before children work on their "God Has Plans" pages, lead them in motions to go with this cheer:

Say: One, two, three! God has plans for me!

Have children bend their knees and squat down. As you say "one," they should be in a fully crouched position. As you say "two," have children begin to stand up. On "three," have them jump as high as they can-way up to the stars. As you say, "God has plans for me!" have children clap their hands. Repeat the activity several times until children can say it with you.

Gather children together. Set out large crayons or washable markers and copies of the "God Has Plans" page. Help children color the biggest stars on the page. As children color their pictures, remind them that **GOD HAS GOOD PLANS FOR US.** Encourage them to repeat the cheer, "One, two, three! God has plans for me!"

Growing With Jesus

Y our child learned that God has good plans for us (from Genesis 15:1-18). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

Way Up High

Hold your baby firmly around the tummy, and raise him or her high above your head. Make eye contact with your baby as you sing "Baby, Way Up High" to the tune of "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star." After you sing, bring your baby in close for a big hug.

Baby, baby, way up high, God has plans for you to try. God made you in a special way— You're growing bigger every day! Baby, baby, way up high, God has plans for you to try.

TODDLER

Abram's Shooting Stars

Cut out aluminum foil stars, and tape them to the underside of a table. Partially cover the table with a large blanket.

Have your toddler crawl into the "nighttime sky" under the table and lie down. As your child lies under the table, shine a flashlight on the stars you've prepared. Turn the light on and off several times to create "shooting stars." Remind your toddler that God promised Abram more grandchildren than the stars.

Say: God had good plans for Abram, and God has good plans for you, too. 2-YEAR-OLD

One, Two, Three!

Draw several stars of varying sizes on a piece of paper.

Lead your child in motions to go with this cheer:

Say: One, two, three! God has plans for me!

As you say "one," have your child bend his or her knees and squat down. As you say "two," have your child begin to stand up. On "three," have your child jump high way up to the stars! As you say, "God has plans for me!" have your child clap. Repeat the activity several times until your child can say it with you.

Set out large crayons or washable markers and the picture of stars. Help your child color the biggest stars on the paper. As your child colors the picture, remind him or her that God has good plans for everyone.



Time for a Plan

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Believe it or not, your child will rapidly grow into a preschooler, then an older child, and before you know it, a preteen. Throughout their young lives, children will ponder more and more why they are here and what their purpose in life may be. Tumultuous times at any age will be much easier to weather if your child has an underlying sense that God has a good plan for him or her. Start building that sense right now, early on, by telling your young child that God does indeed have a plan and it is good.





Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Decorate your child's highchair or booster seat with star stickers or gift bows. Then serve cinnamon applesauce to "the apple of your eye."
- Make happy-face pancakes. Tell your child that he or she makes you smile every day.

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
