Isaac Is Born

Genesis 21:1-6



God Promises a Child to Abraham and Sarah

God keeps his promises. In the first two verses of this passage, three times we read that God did what he said he would do. For Abraham and Sarah, it was the miraculous fulfillment of an amazing promise: the birth of a son to 90- and 100-year-old parents who had never before been able to have a child! And it was really their child—the son of both Abraham and Sarah—as confirmed in Genesis 21:2-3. The shame of childlessness that had haunted them for decades was finally erased. God brought a kind of joy to Abraham and Sarah that they had never known.

Isaac Means "He Laughs"

Isaac, the name Abraham gave his son, means "he laughs." God had told Abraham to give the child that name a year or more earlier (Genesis 17:19).

The circumcision of Isaac when he was eight days old wasn't done just in obedience to God's command. It was a sign of the covenant between God and Abraham, a sign that this child was one of God's chosen people (Genesis 17:10-14).

Genesis 21:6 contains a play on words that's pretty obvious even in English. Through the child named "he laughs," God had brought laughter to Sarah and to all who knew her. In those days, any birth of a healthy child brought great joy, even more so if it was a boy. But a firstborn son, born to such elderly parents, was certainly a laughing matter! Sarah could hardly contain her happiness. Who could blame her?

Twenty-five years had passed since Abraham had left his home in Haran to follow God and since God first promised to make Abraham's descendants into a great nation. Twenty-five years had passed since a childless couple of 65 and 75 years of age first believed God's promise that they would have

descendants. What a fantastic mountaintop in Abraham and Sarah's faith journey! "He laughs" was born!

The Jesus Connection

What You'll Do

As crawlers are playing on the floor or as you hold an infant, show the Abraham, Sarah, and Isaac figures from the "Baby Isaac" teaching picture.

Say: The Bible tells us GOD MAKES US HAPPY. See the daddy? Touch the daddy. He's happy because God gave him a baby boy named Isaac. See the mommy? Touch the mommy. She loves baby Isaac, too. Touch the baby. The baby is happy to have Abraham as his daddy and Sarah as his mommy.

What You'll Do

Tie small stuffed animals or other soft toys to the ends of the rainbow ribbons. Dangle the animals in front of a baby's face. Then jerk the rainbow ribbons to make the animals bounce.

Say: Jump up, toy! Jump for joy! ► GOD MAKES US HAPPY!

Happy Puppets

What You'll Do

Use the spoon like a puppet to talk to a baby. Hold the happy face near the baby's face.

Say: We love God! ► GOD MAKES US HAPPY! Make the puppet come alive by bouncing it up and down. Pull the puppet away, and then return it to the baby's range of vision. If the baby laughs at this activity, affirm the emotion. God gives us laughter, [baby's name]. ► GOD MAKES US HAPPY!

What You'll Do

Gather a group of toddlers together, and show the Abraham and Sarah figures from the "Baby Isaac" teaching picture. Open your Bible to Genesis 21:1-6, and tell children this is God's special book.

Say: The Bible says Abraham and Sarah were sad because they didn't have any children. Show the sad face on the paper plate. Boo-hoo. Can you touch the tears on this sad face? Let's rub our eyes to wipe away the sad tears.

Abraham and Sarah were so sad. But then one day God gave them a baby boy. Hold up the Isaac figure. Let's touch the baby. Abraham and Sarah named the baby Isaac. They were so happy! Show the happy face on the paper plate. Hip, hip, hooray! Clap your hands, and say, "Hooray!" ▶ GOD MAKES US HAPPY, and he made Abraham and Sarah happy when they had a baby boy.

Say: The special guests told Abraham and Sarah that they'd have a baby. I brought some baby things with me today. Can you tell me about some of these things?

Hold up baby-care items, such as blankets and bottles, one at a time. Help children identify each item and tell how it's used. Open your Bible to Genesis 21:1-6, and tell children this is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells us that God promised Abraham and Sarah they would have a baby even though they were very old. God gave them a baby boy, and they named him Isaac. Hold your arms like you're holding baby Isaac. Let's rock the baby.

While children are rocking their pretend babies, walk around and briefly hold the Isaac figure over each child's rocking arms.

Say: ► GOD MAKES US HAPPY. Abraham and Sarah were so filled with joy they laughed. Show me how you laugh. Wait for the children to laugh. That's such a happy sound. I like to hear you laugh. I'm glad ► GOD MAKES US HAPPY!



Pretzel Smiles

What You'll Do

Set out a large bowl of pretzels. Have children clean their hands.

Say: What do you look like when you're feeling sad? Show me a sad face. Let children make sad faces. Now I'd like to see what you look like when you're happy. Show me your happy faces. Let children demonstrate smiles. We can smile because ▶ GOD MAKES US HAPPY. Let's use these pretzels to make a big happy face on our table.

Help children take turns adding pretzels to make eyes, a nose, and a large smiling mouth on one end of your table or work area. Then distribute copies of the "Happy Family" page.

Say: What's missing on the faces of the baby and the daddy and the mommy? Their smiles are missing. Abraham and Sarah were so happy to have baby Isaac. Let's use some pretzel pieces from our happy face to make smiles for Abraham, Sarah, and baby Isaac. Help children place the pretzel smiles on their pages. Say: ▶ GOD MAKES US HAPPY! Then let kids eat the pretzels.

Smile! God Loves You

There's nothing quite like the joyous gurgle of an infant or the contagious giggles of a toddler. Little things bring them great joy. While they may not yet fully comprehend the joy our loving God brings, they're not too young to sense how good it feels to laugh and smile. When you encourage laughter and create happiness in your home, you're helping your child feel God's love.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Day 1: Show your child his or her first baby pictures. Tell your child how happy you were to have a baby.
- Day 2: Dance with your child to joyful praise.
- **Day 3:** Chase your child around his or her bedroom. When you catch your child, say, "God makes us happy!"
- **Day 4:** Gently tickle your child—or let your child tickle you. Enjoy God's gift of laughter together.
- **Day 5:** Repeat a nonsense phrase or word combination that makes your child laugh.
- **Day 6:** Sing your favorite upbeat hymn or chorus to your child as he or she accompanies you on errands.
- **Day 7:** Every time you catch your child smiling or laughing, say, "I see [hear] that you're happy."
