Mark 12:41-44

oung children can begin to understand the concept of giving to God in the sense of "try again." You can encourage your little ones to do their best for God by encouraging them to try until they succeed. Let them know Jesus is happy when they can do a new thing, like take those first steps or jump up and down-just as you and their parents or caregivers are happy. Encourage young children to "show Jesus" their accomplishments, too. Thank you for giving to God as you teach his children.

Jesus Notices a Widow's Giving

Mark 12:41-44



Watching in the Temple

While Jesus—and presumably some of his disciples sat watching in the Temple courts, numerous rich people gave large offerings of money. The disciples, who were from the lower economic classes, were probably amazed at some of the fortunes offered by these wealthy Jews.

They may not have even noticed the poor widow who dropped her two coins into the treasury box. These were the smallest coins in the Roman Empire. It took over 100 of these to make up a day's wages. In terms of today's wages, they would have been worth no more than a couple of dollars each. Yet Jesus knew how big the widow's gift was.

An Extravagant Offering

Some Christians today might consider the widow's giving foolish—she didn't have to give both coins; she didn't have to give even one coin. After all, she needed that money just to stay alive. But that kind of thinking is precisely what Jesus was teaching against. If we give only part of what we have—of what we are—to Jesus, we're holding back. Jesus wants all of us. He wants us to give him all we have and all we are and to trust him for the results.

Our Gifts

Which of the givers in this passage are you more like? As you explore this passage, challenge yourself to examine what you're giving to God. Are you giving just a small portion of your time, money, talents, and commitment to God? Is God getting the leftovers after you've taken care of all your wants? Or are you giving as the poor widow gave, risking all you have on God? The widow's choice is not an easy one, but it's one that honors God.

The Jesus Connection

Jesus isn't impressed by outward displays of wealth he looks straight into the heart at the inward wealth of faith, commitment, generosity, and trust. He knows the *real* you.

What does Jesus see in your heart? Are you fully entrusting your needs, wants, and future to God? What are you holding back? Grab a penny, and hold it as you pray about areas of your life that you need to give over to God. You can write your prayer below. Then give that penny in your church offering as a symbol to God of your commitment.

Sing and Celebrate

What You'll Do

WEAVING FAITH

I Give You My Hands

What You'll Do

Say: Give me your hands! Oooh! Those are wonderful hands. Give me your elbows. Oh, what wonderful elbows! Continue to name and touch the baby's body parts in a similar manner. God gives us everything from our heads to our toes. Similar GOD.

Give and Take

What You'll Do

Place an older baby, sitting up, either on the floor or in a highchair. Set a container of small toys between you and the baby. Have another empty container nearby. Wait for the baby to select a toy to play with. Name the toy, and ask the baby to give the toy to you. Praise the baby when this happens.

Say: You gave the toy to me. Good for you! God wants us to give to him and share with others. We \blacktriangleright GIVE TO GOD. Place the toy in the empty container, and repeat the interaction with the next toy the baby selects.

children. Open your Bible to Mark 12:41-44. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells us Jesus knew a woman who was very poor. She loved God so much that she gave him everything she had. Jesus told others that she gave her best to God. Let's look at our picture. The box is for special gifts for God. The woman has only two coins to put in the box. Would you like to put a coin in the box? Give each toddler a multipurpose disk, and show him or her how to insert it through the slot. What a great job you did! We ▶ GIVE TO GOD. Let the toddlers repeat the action if they want to.

What You'll Do

Seat a toddler on the floor with legs spread out wide. Show him or her how to roll a soft ball back and forth between you. Remind children that God wants us to share with him and with others. Praise children when they share the ball. When you're certain several toddlers have the idea, try to get two willing toddlers to sit with their legs apart and feet against each other's. With your verbal encouragement, some of them may be able to begin to play Rollies with each other.

Say: Good job sharing with each other! God wants us to give our best to him, and God wants us to share with each other. We \blacktriangleright GIVE TO GOD.

Ten Giving Fingers

Teach this finger play to your toddlers. Repeat it many times with them.

BIBLE EXPLORATION

The Gift of Laughter

What You'll Do

Gather a small group of children together. Open your Bible to Mark 12:41-44. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells us Jesus knew a woman who was very poor. She loved God so much that she gave him everything she had. Hold up the prepared teaching picture so that children can see the woman as you talk. Jesus told others that she gave her best to God. Our picture shows us the woman. We can see she feels happy. The children in the picture are excited and want to give, too. The children are waiting to put a special gift for God into the box. Would you like to put something in the box, too? Give each child a multipurpose disk to drop into the box.

Say: We can give God money, and we can give God other things, like helping other people. God wants us to give our best, as the woman did. ► GIVE TO GOD.

Sing "God Loves a Cheerful Giver" to the tune of "Pop! Goes the Weasel." Encourage the children to laugh heartily as they sing.

Giving, giving, ha-ha-ha! God loves a happy giver. I reach out and put in my coin, Ha! Happy giver!



Treasure Treats

What You'll Do

Set out the treats. Help children clean their hands, and then direct them to use the measuring cup to scoop each ingredient into a sandwich bag. As you're doing this, remind children of the widow who shared her small offering with others. When 2-year-olds have finished filling their bags, have each child give his or her bag to another. Make sure every child has a bag. Remind children that we ► **GIVE TO GOD.**

•••••• If you consider how difficult it is for children to share, you can imagine how hard it is for them to give something away! Yet the early years are when we can lav foundations to help children acquire giving hearts and learn about cheerful giving. Let your child see you giving, and when you give a gift, say, "Let's give a special gift to our friend" or "We're giving to God, so let's give our best." Provide opportunities to give small gifts such as a flower, a cookie, or even a penny. When the gift is given cheerfully, the size never matters.

Remind your child that we give to God.

Lesson 4

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Set up a bank for giving. As your child is given or finds money, encourage him or her to put some in the bank to give away.
- Play a game after mealtime. Pass a toy between family members as you say, "God loves a happy giver. Here, I give you this toy!"
- Give each of your family members the gift of time this week. Plan together how you will give time to each other.
