Mark 16:1-8

The Resurrection is a difficult concept for young children to comprehend. While the children in your group don't understand what death is, they do understand what it means to celebrate and be happy. Each time you show your children a picture of Jesus, help them do a finger play, or sing a song to them, you can make the abstract truth of the Resurrection concrete by expressing your joy and excitement about the fact that Jesus is alive. God is spreading his message through you.

Jesus Is Alive!

Mark 16:1-8



Four Views

The first question skeptics ask about Jesus' resurrection is, Why do the Gospel writers all give different accounts? To answer that question, think about an exciting event in your life at which several people were present. If you asked them to tell about the events of that day, would all their versions of the day be exactly the same? Of course not. We all see things from different perspectives and remember different details of what we see.

That's exactly what happened with the Gospel writers' telling of Jesus' resurrection. All seeming contradictions arise out of their slightly different views of events and can easily be resolved when one accepts that truth. In fact, if all the accounts were exactly the same, a critic would say that the authors had collaborated to make up a convincing story. And thanks to these different viewpoints, the accounts we have—as orchestrated by God—give us a more nearly complete picture of what happened than if only one Gospel had been written.

Especially Good News

The angel's proclamation "He has risen!" was the most wonderful news anyone could have given to Jesus' followers. He was alive, and they were to meet him! Why did the angel mention Peter specifically? Peter—the bold one—had fearfully denied Jesus three times the night of Jesus' trial and then had broken down and wept (Mark 14:66-72). Now that Jesus was alive, Peter would likely wonder if Jesus would accept him. The angel left no doubt of Jesus' forgiveness by telling the women at the tomb, "Go tell his disciples and Peter."

Death Defeated

Why do we celebrate Easter? The Apostle Paul eloquently tells us, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins...The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:17, 56-57). What more could we ask? "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15).

The Jesus Connection

We don't serve a dead leader the way most other religions do. Jesus is alive! Because he lives, we can each have a dynamic and growing relationship with him.

How can you thank God for the indescribable gift of Jesus and the world-rocking, sin-shattering, life-revolutionizing power of his resurrection? Make this Easter Sunday special. Turn from distractions, and focus instead on the real gift of Easter: new life through Jesus' death and resurrection. Start now by talking to God about what Easter means to you. As crawlers are playing on the floor or as you hold an infant, show the Jesus figure from the "Jesus Is Alive" teaching picture.

Say: Look, this is Jesus. Jesus is smiling. Let me see you smile. Smile at the baby, and coax him or her to smile back at you. ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE. Jesus has a nose. Where's your nose? Touch the baby's nose. Jesus is alive. Jesus has a mouth. Where's your mouth? Touch the baby's mouth. Jesus is happy. Jesus is alive!

Alive and Well

What You'll Do

Lay a baby on his or her back on a blanket on the floor. Sing "You're Alive!" (not on the CD) to the tune of "If You're Happy and You Know It" as you do the actions in the parentheses.

You're alive and I know it 'cause you clap! (clap the baby's hands together) You're alive and I know it 'cause you kick! (make baby's legs kick) You are growing every day as you eat and sleep and play. (raise baby to a supported standing position)

You're alive and I know it 'cause you laugh! (nuzzle baby until he or she giggles)

Say: God made us, and we're alive! We can celebrate because we're alive and because ► JESUS IS ALIVE!

Alive! Easy Prep

Cut out the Jesus and angel figures. Carefully cut the rock from the center of the picture. Then tape the rock over the hole so it lifts like a flap.

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What You'll Do

Gather one or two toddlers together. Open your Bible to Mark 16:1-8. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book. Put the Bible next to you, and hold up the teaching picture "Jesus Is Alive." Hide the Jesus figure in your Bible, your pocket, or your lap.

Say: Our Bible tells us about some women who wanted to find Jesus. Find the women in the picture. Point to them. Wait for toddlers to respond. The women were sad because Jesus had died. The women thought Jesus was in the cave behind this rock. Let's see if Jesus is there.

Invite the children to lift the rock and put their hands through the hole you cut in the cave. Some children may want to peek through the hole.

Say: **The women didn't find Jesus there, either. Where could Jesus be?** Bring the Jesus figure out of the hiding place.

Say: Here's Jesus. The women couldn't find him because he wasn't in the cave. Jesus wasn't in the cave because ► JESUS IS ALIVE. Jesus was walking. You can walk. Show me. Jesus was talking. You can talk. Show me. Jesus is alive, and the women were happy. Let's celebrate. Let's say, "Hooray!" Lead the toddlers in saying "Hooray!" and clapping their hands.

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I'm Alive

What You'll Do

Say this poem aloud as you and the toddlers in your group do the actions mentioned:

I can walk, walk, walk. I can stomp, stomp, stomp. I can clap, clap, clap. I'm alive.

I can jump, jump, jump. I can stretch, stretch, stretch. I can clap, clap, clap. I'm alive.

I can hug, hug, hug. I can tiptoe, tiptoe, tiptoe. I can clap, clap, clap. I'm alive.

Say: You are alive. God made you alive with a body that can move and breathe and laugh and eat. JESUS IS ALIVE, too. We celebrate Easter because Jesus is alive.

I can walk. (make your fingers walk)
I can talk. (make talking motions with your hands)

The Happy Women

What You'll Do

Gather your 2-year-olds together. Open your Bible to Mark 16:1-8. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book. Hold up the teaching picture.

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Say: The women in this picture are looking for Jesus. Where do you think Jesus is? These women were very sad because Jesus had died. They thought he was in the cave. And they worried because they knew they couldn't move the big rock that was in front of the cave. The rock was so heavy. But when the women got there, the heavy rock was gone. Lift the rock from in front of the tomb. The women were surprised. They went inside the cave to see if Jesus was there. Let's see if Jesus was there.

Invite children to put their hands through the hole to see if Jesus is there. Some children may want to peek through the hole.

Say: The women were surprised—Jesus wasn't there. But there was someone there the women weren't expecting to see. Move the angel figure through the hole to the front of the tomb. The women saw an angel inside the cave. The angel was dressed all in white. The women were scared when they saw the angel. But the angel told them not to be afraid. The angel said to them, "Jesus isn't here. He's alive." And it was the truth. ► JESUS IS ALIVE. And he's alive today. Let's celebrate by clapping. Lead the children in clapping and saying, "Jesus is alive!"

What You'll Do

Show children the bottom section of their "Image of Jesus" pages. Point out Jesus' face, and ask children what's missing.

Say: Today we're going to make pictures of Jesus. Give each child a short length of yarn. Jesus is alive. Let's use our yarn pieces to make Jesus smile. Encourage the children to arrange the yarn into a smile on Jesus' face. We're alive, too. Let's show each other our happy faces.

▶ JESUS IS ALIVE. Sometimes Jesus is sad. Let's use our yarn pieces to make Jesus frown. Encourage the children to arrange the yarn strands into a frown. We're alive, too. Sometimes we're sad. Let's show each other our sad faces.

I like it better when we're happy. Let's make our Jesus pictures smile again. Encourage the children to arrange the yarn strands into smiles on their handouts. Let's show each other our happy faces once more. We can be happy because ► JESUS IS ALIVE.
