Paul Teaches About Spiritual Gifts 1 Corinthians 12:4-27

nfants, toddlers, and 2-year-olds are just beginning to discover their bodies. Use this natural interest to show kids ways they can use each body part to serve God. Hold a baby in your lap, and gently wave the baby's hands. Praise the baby for using his or her hands to welcome others to church! While you play with a toddler, alternate giving each other hugs. Tell the toddler that both of you are using your arms to show love! Sit with a 2-year-old and take turns whispering into each other's ears. Whisper encouraging words or words about Jesus. Remind the child that you can use your mouth to tell others about Jesus and you can use your ears to listen to a friend! As children learn the many special ways each body part can serve Jesus, you'll be offering them a foundation to learn how each child can use his or her special gifts to serve God.

Paul Teaches About Spiritual Gifts

1 Corinthians 12:4-27



Key Points on a Key Passage

Paul begins today's passage with a key point about spiritual gifts (verses 4-7): They are diverse, but they are unified because they come from the same God. There are many different gifts, but the same God is working through all of them. And they all are for a common purpose: the good of the church.

Gifts From God

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The question may arise, What is the difference between spiritual gifts and natural talents? The difference between spiritual gifts and natural ability may not have been of concern to Paul. Every good thing, every gift comes from God. What concerned Paul was that people exercise the gifts the Holy Spirit gave them and use them to build up God's church.

Many Gifts, One Body

In verses 12-27, Paul introduces to the Corinthians the concept that the church is like a body, more specifically the body of Christ. Paul's message is a great equalizer: People with gifts that seem insignificant are actually much more important than they may think, and people with gifts that seem more spectacular aren't any more important than anyone else. A significant fact to note is found in verse 18: "God has arranged the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be."

Building God's Kingdom

In a body, if one part is hurting, the other parts feel the hurt. And if one part feels great, it makes all of the body feel better. That's how God wants the church to be! God gives different gifts for the building up of the body of Christ. We're all part of that body, and God wants us to use the gifts he's given us to fill the place intended for us in his church! That's how we'll be most fulfilled and how we'll work together with other Christians to further God's kingdom on earth.

The Jesus Connection

Your spiritual gifts are God-given opportunities to be like Jesus and build up Jesus' body.

Have you taken time to discover your spiritual gifts? Have you taken time to develop and refine your gifts? Complete a spiritual gifts inventory or ask some Christians who know you well to tell you what spiritual gifts they see in you. Ask God what your gifts might be. You can write your prayer here.

A Special Thing

What You'll Do

Gather several toddlers in a circle around you. Open your Bible to 1 Corinthians 12. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say the following rhyme:

A special gift God gives to everyone; To all who love Jesus, his Son. Each of us can do a special thing, Like pray, or read, or sing.

Some of us can smile from here to there. (have kids smile and point to each corner of their mouths)

Some of us can say a special prayer. (have kids fold their hands and bow their heads) **Some of us can make a yummy treat to share.** (have kids pretend to stir something in a bowl)

Some of us can give others loving care. (have kids give each other hugs)

Some of us can tell the world about Jesus' love (have kids point to their mouths) And about heaven, way up above. (have kids point up toward the sky) And it is true That when you use the gift God gives you, You are playing your special part To serve others and show God's loving heart.

Say: **SERVE GOD.**

Wonderful Gifts

What You'll Do

Gather a few toddlers around you. Tell them you've hidden several gifts around the room. Encourage toddlers to look around the room for the gifts. When a toddler finds a gift, have the toddler bring the gift to you. Encourage the toddler to do one of the actions from the Bible passage, such as smiling, praying, making a treat, giving a hug, or pointing to their mouths.

Say: That was a wonderful gift—thank you for sharing it with me! When we share gifts with others, we ▶ SERVE GOD. Then encourage the toddler to find another gift. Once all the gifts have been found, have kids close their eyes while you hide the gifts again. Play the game several times.

The Perfect Gift

What You'll Do

Give each toddler an "Our Gifts" page.

Say: **God gives us special gifts to use to help others.** Point to the gifts on the handout. **There are gifts on your paper.** Let children touch the gifts on their handouts.

God gives us gifts because God loves us. When we use our gifts to help others, we serve God. These gifts don't have any pretty wrapping paper! Let's decorate them.

Trace glue along the lines of the gifts, and help toddlers shake glitter onto the glue.

Say: These gifts will remind us that when we use our gifts to help others, we ► SERVE GOD.

Crazy Faces

What You'll Do

Have children sit in a circle, and open your Bible to 1 Corinthians 12. Show kids the words, and tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Our Bible tells us about a body. Imagine a face without eyes. Close your eyes. Encourage 2-year-olds to close their eyes or put their hand over their eyes. Oh no! Without eyes, we can't see! Let's all open our eyes. Now imagine a face without a mouth. Everyone close your mouth tight. Encourage kids to put a hand over their mouths. Oh no! Now we can't talk! Everyone, try to talk with your mouth closed. Encourage kids to try to talk through their hands. That doesn't work very well. Without a mouth we couldn't talk. Everyone pretend to eat with your mouth shut. Encourage kids to use one hand to pretend to scoop food into their mouths and the other hand to cover their mouths. That doesn't work. Without a mouth, we couldn't eat. Let's uncover our mouths. That's better. Now imagine a face without a nose. Everyone plug your nose. Encourage kids to use one hand to squeeze their nose shut. Oh no, now we can't smell anything! Try to smell. Encourage kids to try to smell through their plugged noses. Without a nose we couldn't smell anything. Let's unplug our noses. That's better! We need our eyes, our mouths, and our noses. I'm glad God gave us all those things so we can see, talk, eat, and smell.

God gives us all the different parts of our faces to do all the different jobs that a face does. God also gives each of us special gifts so that we can serve him by helping others. Some of us can sing. Have kids stand up and sing. Some of us can give great big hugs. Have kids hug each other. Some of us can make yummy snacks for others. Have kids pretend to stir a "snack" in a bowl. Some of us can tell others about Jesus. Have kids yell out "Jesus!" God gives us gifts to serve him. We ▶ SERVE GOD.

Say: God gives us gifts to help others. We > SERVE GOD by helping others.

Affirm each child by adding a gift bow to the picture.

Growing With Jesus

V our child learned that we serve God (from 1 Corinthians 12:4-27). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

Who Is a Gift?

Place a hand mirror with the reflective side up in a gift bag. Set the gift bag next to you. Hold your baby in your lap.

Say: God gave someone special a gift. I wonder who God gave a gift to. Let's see. Open the gift bag and help baby look inside and see his or her reflection. God gave a special gift to you! We serve God when we use our gifts to help others.

Wonderful Gifts

Place bows on a few gift bags. Hide the bags in a room. Encourage your toddler to look around the room for the gifts. When your child finds a gift, have him or her bring the gift to you. Encourage your toddler to do one of the following actions from this week's Bible passage: smile, pray, make a pretend treat, give a hug, or point to his or her mouth.

Say: That was a wonderful gift; thank you for sharing it with me! Then encourage your toddler to find another gift.

God gives each of us gifts we can use to serve others and serve him!

2-YEAR-OLD

Draw a simple outline of a gift. Set out wrapping paper and a glue stick on a table. Help your child use the glue stick to rub a thin layer of glue on the gift. Show your child how to decorate the gift by pressing a square of giftwrap onto the glue.

Decorating the Gift

Say: God gives each of us gifts.

Affirm your child by adding a gift bow to the picture.

Say: God gave you a special gift! We serve God by using our gifts to help others.

Giving Gifts

Infants, toddlers, and 2-year-olds don't have experience in giving and receiving gifts yet. However, it doesn't take too many birthdays and Christmas days for a child to enjoy the idea of receiving gifts. Encourage your child to give gifts to your family by being helpful. Talk about how every good thing that we have is a gift from God—and that God wants us to share those gifts by helping others. When we do that, we're serving God.



Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Surprise your child by giving him or her a small gift, such as a special treat. Tell your child how much you enjoy giving him or her a gift. Explain to your child that God likes to give gifts to his children as well.
- Bring a dust cloth with you the next time you come to church. Help your child do a little dusting when you get to church. Explain that when we help other people, we are serving God.
