Acts 10:1-44

# **Peter Visits Cornelius**

Acts 10:1-44



# Meet Cornelius

This passage begins at the home of Cornelius, a Roman centurion in Caesarea, the headquarters for the Roman occupation of that area. As a centurion, Cornelius would have been in charge of a unit of about 100 men, and he was considered a man of noble character.

For a non-Jew to have been considered God-fearing meant that Cornelius followed the Jewish religion to some degree, possibly to the greatest extent he could as a non-Jew. His vision of the angel at about three in the afternoon likely means that he was following Jewish religious practices since that was a regular time of prayer for the Jews. And it is to Cornelius' credit that when an angel of God spoke to him, he didn't hesitate to do what he was told.

#### God Speaks: A Tale of Two Visions

Peter was following normal Jewish religious practices, among which was the strict adherence to the dietary restrictions spelled out in Leviticus 11. Many of the forbidden animals described there were included in the sheet suspended before Peter in his vision. Being told to kill and eat "unclean" animals shocked Peter.

The challenge to Peter's beliefs didn't end when the sheet disappeared. It was obviously no coincidence that Cornelius' servants appeared just as Peter's vision ended. Peter was thinking through the meaning of his vision when he was summoned to go to the house of a non-Jew. The servants said that an angel had told Cornelius to send for Peter to hear what he had to say.

And God made it clear to Peter that the servants' arrival was connected to what God was trying to teach him. God told him that the men were there, that he had sent them, and that Peter was to go with them.

Peter knew that the vision concerned much more than food.

# The Jesus Connection

Peter took a huge risk in following God's leading to reach out to Cornelius and his family. Peter followed God's leading without hesitation because Jesus was the cornerstone of his life.

Peter set an example for us by taking advantage of an opportunity to tell someone unexpected about his faith. We dare not ignore that example; rather, we must be willing to tell anyone who is interested about what God has done for us through Jesus. Pray and ask God to show you how you can share your faith and God's love. You can write your prayer here.



### God Made and Loves Me!

#### What You'll Do

As you hold a baby, or as infants are playing on the floor, begin to gently touch their arms, legs, heads, and tummies.

Say: This is your arm. God made your arm, and he loves you very much. Touch another body part, and repeat your affirmation of God's love. Help baby touch another baby in a similar way. God made [child's name]'s arms. Jesus loves your friends. TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS. Smile at the baby.

Say: **God made my arms to hold you and show you that he loves you.** Give the infant a big hug.

### Jesus Is for You and Me

#### What You'll Do

Gently pick up a baby in your arms. Take the baby over to a mirror. Call the baby's attention to the face in the mirror.

Say: Look who's in the mirror. Is that you? Yes, that's [child's name], and Jesus loves you. Have the baby wave hello to his or her reflection in the mirror.

Next carry the baby over to another baby. Hold the babies so they can see each other.

Say: This is [child's name]. Pat the baby. And this is your friend. Pat the second child. Jesus is for you (point to one child), and Jesus is for you (point to the second child). Have older infants give each other a hug. TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS.

Carry the baby around to introduce him or her to several other infants in the room.

#### What You'll Do

Play this action-rhyme game with babies throughout the session:

I am not a spider. (creep fingers up baby's arm)
I am not a flea. (creep fingers up baby's other arm)
I'm a precious baby, (clap baby's hands together)
And Jesus is for me! (pat baby's hands against his or her chest)

### Who Does Jesus Love?

Who Does Jesus Love? Supplies

Bible

#### What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Acts 10:1-44. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book. Use these finger actions to help tell the Bible passage.

Say: Today the Bible tells us about a friend of Jesus who listened to God. This man's name was Peter. Peter will be our pointer-finger puppet.

Hold up your pointer finger. Say: **Wiggle your pointer fingers.** Have the children wiggle their pointer fingers. **God told Peter to tell a man named Cornelius about Jesus. Cornelius will be our thumbs.** Hold up your thumb. **Wiggle your thumbs.** Have the children wiggle their thumbs.

Say: Then there was an angel. Angels have wings that flutter when they move. Make angel wings with me. Have children make wings by waving their fingers. As you read the passage below, wiggle your thumb every time you say "Cornelius," wiggle

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your pointer finger every time you say "Peter," and flutter your fingers each time you say "angel." Allow time for the toddlers to move their thumbs and fingers, too.

Say: Cornelius (wiggle thumb) loved God and wanted to know more about God. He was sad because no one would talk to him about Jesus. Have children make sad faces for Cornelius. One day as Cornelius (wiggle thumb) was praying, an angel came to visit him. Flutter your fingers for angel wings. The angel (flutter your fingers) told Cornelius (wiggle thumb) to find Peter. Wiggle pointer finger. At first Peter (wiggle pointer finger) didn't want to go with Cornelius (wiggle thumb) because Cornelius (wiggle thumb) was different from him.

But Peter (wiggle pointer finger) obeyed God who said that Jesus is for everyone. Peter (wiggle pointer finger) went to visit Cornelius. (Wiggle thumb.) Peter (wiggle pointer finger) told Cornelius (wiggle thumb) about Jesus. Cornelius (wiggle thumb) and his family were so happy to hear that Jesus loved them that they threw a big party to celebrate. Have children make happy faces and clap for Cornelius.

Jesus is for all of us, too! Jesus is for big people. Clap and cheer. Jesus is for little people. Clap and cheer. Jesus is for mommies. Clap and cheer. Jesus is for daddies. Clap and cheer. No matter what you look like or how big you are, Jesus is for everyone. ▶ TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS! Clap and cheer.



## Stickers for Everyone

#### What You'll Do

Set out crayons, the "Heart" stickers, and the "Jesus Is for Everyone" pages.

Say: We learned today that Jesus is for everyone. Now we're going to see some different people who Jesus loves and put heart stickers on them. We ▶ TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS.

Give each child a copy of the page. Hold up the page, and point to the old man.

We can tell this grandpa about Jesus. Help each child put a heart sticker on the grandpa. Continue with the other people on the handout until every person has a heart sticker.

Say: Jesus loves the people in our picture, and he loves everyone in this room! We **TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS.** Let children color their pictures.

### **Peter and Cornelius**

#### What You'll Do

Gather a group of children together. Open your Bible to Acts 10:1-44. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Today we're going to hear about what happened to one of Jesus' followers named Peter and his new friend, Cornelius. As I tell what happened, make your fingers follow mine. We'll let our pointer fingers be Peter and our thumbs be Cornelius.

Mr. Cornelius was praying at night, (wiggle thumbs)
He needed Jesus so. (point to heaven)
Along came an angel with wings so bright, (hook thumbs, wave fingers)
To Peter you must go! (wiggle pointer finger)

#### Peter and Cornelius Easy Prep

Cut out pictures of people from magazines. You'll need at least 1 picture per child.



Cornelius sent his servants, (palms down, brush hand outward)
For Peter they did look. (shade eyes with hand)
Peter was on a rooftop praying (palms together, fingers pointing up)
And reading from God's book. (open palms to read)

Peter had a daytime dream, (flutter fingers like twinkle stars)
"Go and tell my people." (shake pointer finger)
So Peter went to Cornelius' house (wiggle thumbs)
And preached to all the people. (open palms to read)

The people were happy, and Peter was glad. (clap hands together)
He listened to God and did what God said. (point to heaven)
Peter shared God's Word that night, (wiggle pointer finger)
"Jesus is for everyone, we're all precious in his sight." (wiggle all fingers)

Show children the "Peter Visits Cornelius" poster.

Say: God sent Peter to tell Cornelius about Jesus. God wanted Peter and us to know that Jesus is for everyone. We ▶ TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS. Let's glue these pictures on this poster to show that Jesus is for everyone in the world. Help children glue the magazine pictures on the poster. We can tell everyone about Jesus!

#### What You'll Do ■■■■■■

Say: We TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS. He loves all the people of the world. He loves people with glasses and people who are in wheelchairs. He loves people with blond hair, people with brown hair, and even people with no hair at all! Today you can choose and make your own person. You can choose eyes, a nose, and a mouth to put together a person Jesus loves. I'll help you glue the parts on your paper.

Help children choose which features they want for their funny people. Help children stick the features on their papers with glue sticks and then color the features. As you work, comment on how the people are similar and different from the children. If time permits, let children draw hair and other features on their people.



# Jesus-Is-for-Me Jump Up

#### What You'll Do

Have the children sit on the floor around you.

Say: This is a listening-and-jumping game. Listen carefully. When I call your name and say, "Jesus is for you," jump up and wave your arms in the air. Sometimes I will say, ▶ "TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS!" When you hear that, everyone jumps up together!

Lead children in cheering for each child as he or she jumps up. When it is quiet, instruct the child to sit down, and then call out another child's name. When children start to get restless, end the game with the following.

Say: ► TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS! Have all the children stand up and cheer together.

#### **Loving Others**

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Young children may be unsure around people whose faces aren't that familiar to them. If daddy is clean-shaven and a bearded man picks up a child, tears may follow. Or if a very tall person is invited into the home of very short people, a child may feel overwhelmed! Your responses in situations like these will mold your child's opinions. It's helpful to learn to appreciate differences in people and to understand that God made us with similarities and differences. God loves us all the same, and we can tell everyone about Jesus.


#### Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:
