## Barnabas Encourages Christians in Antioch Acts 11:19-26

n this lesson, children will learn about helping each other love Jesus. When teaching young children, it's important not to focus on abstract concepts that they won't comprehend and instead to key in on concrete actions that infants, toddlers, and 2-year-olds can observe, experience, and imitate. This lesson focuses on helping and will give young children lots of ideas for ways they can help others love Jesus, such as kind actions, nice words, praying for others, and telling others about Jesus' love. This study emphasizes that helping is fun—and it can make others happy and help them love Jesus.

# Barnabas Encourages Christians in Antioch



Acts 11:19-26

### BIBLE BACKGROUND

## Reason to Praise

In the chapters leading up to today's passage, God revealed to Peter that the message of Christ is not only for Jews but for non-Jews as well. Peter then took that message to the household of Cornelius, a Roman centurion, and God poured out the Holy Spirit on these non-Jews who then came to faith in Christ. The Jerusalem church had a hard time accepting that non-Jews could become believers in Christ, but after Peter explained everything that had happened, they praised God that he had granted even the Gentiles eternal life through Jesus (Acts 10:1–11:18).

## Reason to Scatter

In today's passage, we see that the early followers of Christ had been scattered from Jerusalem because of the persecution that began after Stephen was killed. The Jews had stoned him after he accused them of killing the Messiah, Jesus. But everywhere the scattered followers went, they told people about Jesus (Acts 7:1–8:4).

### **Spreading the News**

The believers who were scattered to Antioch, at that time the third largest city in the Roman Empire, began sharing the message of Christ not only with the many Jews who lived there, but also with the non-Jews. When Jerusalem's church heard that a great number of people had turned to the Lord, they were ready to accept these non-Jewish believers, and they sent Barnabas (whose name means "Son of Encouragement") to see what was happening and to contribute to the spreading of the gospel message.

Barnabas invited Saul (whom we know as the Apostle Paul) to Antioch for a year to help teach because the church was expanding so quickly. Barnabas had befriended Saul and defended him before the apostles

in Jerusalem after Saul had met Christ on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:1-30).

What happened in Antioch was significant because it was, apparently, the first time Jewish and non-Jewish Christians joined together in fellowship. People there were accustomed to rubbing shoulders with people of different backgrounds and of different ethnic groups. The church in Antioch set a wonderful example for churches to follow in centuries to come.

### The Jesus Connection

As the text tells us, Jesus' followers were first called Christians in Antioch. It's significant that in Antioch this diverse group of followers took on a name that means "like Christ." As they lived out Jesus' example and encouraged others in the faith, people noticed. What a compliment it would be for others to consider us to be like Jesus!

Pray about how your life can reflect Jesus in a way

that would help draw others to God. You can write

### **Help in Action**

### What You'll Do

Sit next to a baby, and demonstrate a simple action, such as bending to touch your toes.

Say: Look, I'm touching my toes.

Then help the baby do the same action (with an older baby in a sitting position or with a younger baby lying on his or her back and raising baby's feet to his or her hands).

Say: Let me help you touch your toes.

Repeat this pattern of demonstrating and then helping the baby do simple actions such as reaching hands up high, clapping, covering eyes with hands, or making circles with legs.

Say: Let me help you [name of action].

Just like I helped you, God wants us to help each other. We can help other people feel happy because of God's love. Barnabas helped others love Jesus. I can help you love Jesus by saying "Jesus loves you." God wants us to ▶ HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS.



## **Happy Helpers**

### What You'll Do

Hold a baby facing you on your lap. Make eye contact with the baby, and maintain a blank facial expression. Then suddenly break into a huge smile and giggle. Repeat this several times in an effort to get the baby to copy you by smiling and giggling.

Say: [Baby's name], you make me feel so happy. I love when you smile!

Continue making your face blank and then smiling and giggling.

Say: You can help others feel happy! Your smile helps people feel happy. Your smile can ▶ HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS!

## You Can Help

### What You'll Do

Sit with a baby on the floor. Set the toy and overturned bowls in front of you. Let the baby watch you as you "hide" the toy under one of the bowls.

Say: You can help me find the toy. I need your help.

Select the bowl that has the toy under it.

Say: **Is it under this bowl?** Help the baby lift up the bowl to look under it, or lift it yourself so the baby can see.

Say: Yes it is! Thank you for helping!


Repeat the activity several times, each time making sure the baby sees you hide the object. With older babies, include looking under the empty bowls as well, but make sure at least half of your attempts will successfully find the toy. Continually emphasize that the baby is helping you.

Say: Thank you for helping me find the toy! [Baby's name], you are a great helper! Just like you helped me find the toy, you can ▶ HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS!

## Sing and Celebrate

### What You'll Do

Sing "Follow, Follow Jesus" (track 3 on the CD) to the tune of "For He's a Jolly Good Fellow" anytime during the lesson. Encourage toddlers to form a line and march, following after a leader.

Follow, follow Jesus, Follow, follow Jesus, Follow, follow Jesus, Yes, I will follow him.

I'll follow him up high.
I'll follow him down low.

Afterward, say: ▶ HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS.

Sing "God Gave the Holy Spirit" (not on the CD) to the tune of "Mary Had a Little Lamb" anytime during the lesson. Hold a child in your lap with his or her back to you so that your arms reach around to guide his or her hands. This will create a stronger connection to the comforting presence of the Holy Spirit at the end of the song.

## **Expressing Encouragement**

### What You'll Do

Invite a few toddlers to sit by you. Open your Bible to Acts 11. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Look at my face. I'm going to tell you about a man name Barnabas. As I do, I want you to copy what you see on my face. Let's practice!

Make a very sad face.

Say: I'm making a sad face. Can you make a sad face?

Let children try making sad faces. Then make a very happy face.

Say: Now I am very happy. Can you make a happy face?

Let children practice for a while. Then start telling the Bible passage.

Say: The Bible tells us about a man named Barnabas. He went to visit some people who were feeling sad. Make a sad face, and pause to wait for children to copy you. Barnabas told them about Jesus' love, and it made them feel happy! Make a happy face, and wait for children to copy you. When your friends are sad (make a sad face) you can help them feel happy (make a happy face) by smiling, saying kind words, and helping them. You can also be like Barnabas and tell them Jesus loves them. You can HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS. Make a happy face, and encourage kids to copy you.



### **Bubbles and Belief**

### What You'll Do

Invite several toddlers to join you, and show them how you blow bubbles. Blow a bunch of bubbles, and encourage children to try to catch them.

Say: Help me blow bubbles!

One at a time, help children blow bubbles. Dip the bubble wand in the soap solution yourself, and hold the wand near each child's mouth. Demonstrate how to blow and let the child try. Position your face so that you can also blow into the wand while the children try—most children will need your help.

Encourage the other children to try to catch the bubbles each toddler blows. Prompt children to shout out "Jesus loves you!" each time they catch or pop a bubble. Ensure each child has a chance to blow bubbles.

Say: Good job! Thank you for helping me blow bubbles! You helped me feel happy! Does it make you feel happy?

We can make each other feel happy by blowing bubbles together. We also make other people happy when we ▶ HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS. When you told others "Jesus loves you," you were helping them believe in and love Jesus. Good job!

## Sing and Celebrate

Give each child a block to give to a friend sitting nearby as you sing the word *gave*. This will reinforce children's understanding of giving and connect it with God giving us the Holy Spirit. Likewise, as you sing the words *with us*, have the children scoot closer to each other or toward you.

### **Point Others to Jesus**

### What You'll Do

Have children sit in a circle. Set the "Saul and Barnabas Encourage Christians" poster (from the Big Bible Poster Pack) on the floor in the center of the circle. Open your Bible to Acts 11, and show children the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book. Explain that every time you point your finger up to the sky, they are to point their fingers up also and shout "Jesus!" Make sure everyone understands, and then practice a few times by pointing with your finger and leading kids in shouting "Jesus!"

Say: Let's find out what happened. The Bible tells us about some people in a town called Antioch. They had just heard about (point and lead kids in shouting "Jesus!"). A man named Barnabas went to visit them. Barnabas told them even more about (point and lead kids in shouting "Jesus!"). He helped them to believe in (point and lead kids in shouting "Jesus!"). Barnabas helped them love (point and lead kids in shouting "Jesus!") with all of their hearts.

Just like Barnabas, you can ► HELP OTHERS LOVE (point and lead kids in shouting "Jesus!")!

There are lots of ways to help other people love Jesus. We can be nice to each other.

Make a big smile, wave at the children, and have them mimic your actions.

Say: We can help others love Jesus by showing love.

Give children hugs and encourage them to hug each other.

Say: We can help other people love Jesus by praying for them.

Fold your hands in prayer, and have kids mimic your actions.

Say: We can ▶ HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS by telling them Jesus loves them.

Encourage children to place Jesus stickers or cross stickers on the "Saul and Barnabas Encourage Christians" poster. As they place their stickers, encourage them to say, "Jesus loves you!" When children are finished, have them turn to each other and say, "Jesus loves you!"

Cheer for the children.

Say: Great job! Thank you for helping me!

### **Helping Hands**

### What You'll Do

Assist children in forming pairs, and have them gather with their partners in a circle. Set several toys and objects in the middle of the circle.

Explain that children will hold hands with their partner. When it's their turn, you will name an object that's in the circle. The partners should then help each other pick up the object and hand it to you. Encourage kids to work together to pick up the object; they can hug it between them, or each hold part of the object.

Make sure kids understand the basic idea of the game and emphasize that their job is to help their partner. When everyone is ready, direct one pair at a time to help each other retrieve the object you've named and give it to you.

Say: Good job helping each other!

Lead the rest of the group in cheering for each pair as they go.

When all the pairs have gone, clap for the kids.

Say: You all did a good job helping each other. Isn't it fun to help each other? We can also ▶ HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS. We can help others love Jesus by being happy, loving, and nice. We can also tell other people that Jesus loves them.

## Help My Friend

### What You'll Do

Give each child a "We Love Jesus" page and crayons.

Say: Here are two people. One of them is you! Let's make it look like you.

Assist children in decorating one of the children in the picture by coloring it, adding yarn for hair, or gluing on a piece of fabric clothing.

While kids are decorating the picture of themselves, talk to each child individually about a special friend they have, such as another child in the class, a sibling, or a parent.

Say: The other person in the picture is a friend that you can help love Jesus. Help kids decorate their friend on the drawing by coloring, adding fabric clothing, or gluing on yarn "hair."

As children finish decorating their pictures, ask them about their special friends, and suggest ways they can help those people love Jesus, such as being kind, giving hugs, or obeying.

Say: Let's pray about our special friends.

Prompt children to fold their hands like the people in the picture.

Pray: Dear God, we want to show your love to our special friends. We want to HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS. In Jesus' name, amen.

## **Growing With Jesus**



Y our child learned that we help others love Jesus (from Acts 11:19-26). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

#### **INFANT**

### Happy Helpers

Hold your baby facing you on your lap. Make eye contact with your baby, and maintain a blank facial expression. Then suddenly break into a huge smile and giggle. Repeat this several times in an effort to get your baby to copy you by smiling and giggling.

Say: [Baby's name], you make me feel so happy. I love when you smile!

Continue making your face blank and then smiling and giggling.

Say: You can help others feel happy! Your smile helps people feel happy.

#### **TODDLER**

### Helpful Builders

Grab some wooden building blocks, and invite your toddler to join you.

Ask: Will you help me build a tower?

Work with your child to build small block towers.

Say: Thank you for helping me build a block tower! [Child's name], you are helping me build.
You can also help others love Jesus. You can help others love Jesus by being nice (stack a block), by being happy (stack a block), and by showing love (stack a block).
Thank you for all of your help!

#### 2-YEAR-OLD

### Helping Hands

Set out several toys and objects (such as a ball, a stuffed animal, a toy car, a Bible, and so on). Hold hands with your child, and explain that you need your child's help to pick up one of the objects. You'll name an object, and then you'll work together to pick it up—by hugging it between you, by each holding part of it, or using some other creative way of helping each other. Repeat the activity several times.

Say: We did a good job of helping each other. Isn't it fun to help each other? We can also help each other love Jesus.



### Your Little Helper

Young children are just beginning to learn about helping—helping a parent clean up toys, helping a friend pick up puzzle pieces, or even helping a vounger sibling with a pacifier. At this age, helping is exciting! When it's affirmed properly, helping can cause young children to feel significant and "grown up." In your daily life, emphasize that helping is fun—and it can make others happy and help them love Jesus.



- Invite your child to help you perform a task such as dusting furniture, cleaning up toys, or stirring food. Affirm your child for his or her efforts to help.
- Ask your child to name a special friend, and then pray together, telling God that your child wants to help his or her friend love Jesus.
- Draw attention to positive things your child does throughout the day and connect them to loving Jesus. For example, you could say "Thank you for being so happy! When you are happy, it helps me love Jesus" or "Good job obeying. When you obey, it helps me love Jesus."
