Paul Describes Living by God's Spirit Romans 8:9-17

n Romans 8:9-17, Paul describes living by God's Spirit. While little ones do not understand what "living by God's Spirit" means, they can live for God in small ways. Begin by teaching them kindness, sharing, and praise as ways to live for God. Create an atmosphere of enthusiasm as you talk to each child about living for God and being God's child. Children should perceive living for God as exciting. Emphasize that by living for God, they're living as God's children.

Paul Describes Living by God's Spirit

Romans 8:9-17



The Holy Spirit Helps Us Resist Sin

In Romans 8:5-8, Paul gives a description of living by the sinful nature—which ends in death. That's where today's passage picks up: Paul describes what it looks like to live according to the Holy Spirit. He begins by making it clear that Christians have the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God, living in them. And with that Spirit within, we can resist the pull of the sinful nature (Romans 8:9).

In Romans 8:11, Paul points out that the Holy Spirit not only helps us keep from sinning but also brings us resurrection from the dead—eternal life. If God raised up Jesus and God's Spirit is dwelling in us, God can raise us up as well!

Our Response to the Holy Spirit

Paul changes gears somewhat in Romans 8:12-13, turning from what God does for us through the Holy Spirit to what our responsibility is in response to what God has done for us. If we follow the leading of the Holy Spirit in our lives rather than our sinful nature, we will live. The death to sin that God has accomplished for us doesn't mean that we don't have to worry about sin in our lives; instead it makes it possible for us to turn from sinning and even obligates us to do so!

Romans 8:15-17 turns back to what God has done for us. When we live by God's Spirit, not only are we able to turn from sin and be cleansed from sin through Jesus' sacrifice, but we also are adopted as children of God himself! And in first-century culture, an adopted child wasn't in any way inferior to a natural child. In fact, the adopted child was deliberately chosen by a father for the purpose of carrying on his name, which was a great honor.

We can call God *Abba*, an Aramaic word by which children would lovingly address their fathers.

The Jesus Connection

Great freedom comes when, after every effort imaginable, you realize nothing you do on your own can win right standing with God. It can be found only by accepting a gift with humility and gratitude. The gift? A relationship with Jesus.

Pray this prayer today: "God, you did more than forgive me. You accepted me. I can hardly believe you think of me as your child. Make this so real to me that I am changed through and through." You can write your prayer here.

Finding God's Child

What You'll Do

Lay an infant on a blanket in front of you. Have the mirror hidden behind you. Hold the infant's hand.

Say: **Paul wrote a letter to his friends.** Trace imaginary letters on the baby's palm as you speak. **He said, "You can live for God, and you can be God's child.** Gently cross the baby's arms over his or her chest in a hug. **God's Spirit can help you live for him.** Point to the sky with the baby's arm. **You do not have to be afraid.** Cover the infant's eyes with his or her hands, and then quickly remove them. **You are God's child; you can call him Father.** Clap the baby's hands together.

Let's look for God's child.

Put the mirror to the left side of the infant's head. Slowly move it to catch the child's attention until it is directly in front and the child is looking at the reflection.

Say: I see God's child! [Child's name] is God's child! [Child's name] can live for God! Repeat the activity starting at the right side of the infant's head.

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Showing Love

What You'll Do

Hold an infant on your lap. Place a doll near you.

Say: **We can live for God by showing love to others.** Show the doll to the infant. **Can** [child's name] **show dolly that you love her?** Help the infant wrap his or her arms around the doll and give it a hug.

That was nice. Hugging is a good way to show love. I will show love to [child's name]. Give the baby a gentle hug.

God loves [child's name], too, and God is happy when we live for him by showing love to others. We can live for God.

Where Is God's Child? Supplies

Where Is God's Child?

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Romans 8:9-17. Lay the mirror facedown on your Bible. Work with one or two toddlers at a time.

Say: Paul wrote a letter to his friends. He said, "Now that you belong to Christ, you do not have to be bad. God's Spirit will help you live for God. You will be called God's child because you are part of God's family. God will share his treasures with us, and we can live for God."

Sing the following song, "Where Is God's Child?" (not on CD), to the tune of "Where Is Thumbkin?"

• Where is God's child? Where is God's child? (Put your hand to your forehead as if searching for someone.)

Here he [she] is! Here he [she] is! (Put the mirror directly in front of a toddler's face.) We can live for God! We can live for God! (Point to sky.) I found God's child—here he [she] is! (Point to toddler.)

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What Do I Wear?

What You'll Do

Work with two toddlers at a time. Play a game with the children, having them guess what they need.

Say: God's children need something to wear on their heads. What can you find for God's children to wear?

Encourage the toddlers to choose the hat and take turns putting it on. Then repeat the question, naming another part of the body one of the items can be worn on. Continue until the toddlers have worn all the items.

Say: God wants his children to wear something on their faces, too—a big smile! Use your fingers to push your mouth into a big smile.

When we smile, we make other people happy. We can live for God, making others happy and showing love. Encourage toddlers to show you their smiles.

Going to God's House

What You'll Do

Work with two or three toddlers at a time. Teach the children this rhyme, and do the motions with them.

We can go to God's house (put fingertips together to represent a house) To sing and praise and pray. (Wave arms; then fold hands in prayer.) But we can live for God (point to the sky) At our house every day! (Count on fingers; then throw hands open.)

Give each child a copy of the "Going to God's House" page, and let kids put smiley-face stickers inside the church to represent happy children in God's house.

Say: We can live for God by going to his house.

Who Do You See?

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Romans 8:9-17.

Say: Paul wrote a letter to his friends in Rome. He said, "Dear friends, when you have Christ living in you, you belong to him. You do not have to keep doing bad things. God's Spirit can help you. You don't have to live in fear; you can live for God. You will be called God's children, and God will share his treasures with you. You can call God 'Father' because you are now part of his family."

Show the children the box.

Say: **WE CAN LIVE FOR GOD** and be called his children. Look in the box, and you'll see one of God's children.

Ask:

Who did you see?

Say: Yes, you saw [child's name]! You are God's child. You can live for God.

Hide 'n' Pop Up

What You'll Do

Let the children take turns hiding under a bedsheet. (They don't have to cover their faces if they don't want to.) Walk around the sheet with the other 2-year-olds as you sing this song to the tune of "Oh Where, Oh Where Has My Little Dog Gone?" (not on CD):

• Oh where, oh where has [child's name] gone? Oh where, oh where can he [she] be? Oh where, oh where has [child's name] gone? It's God's child that I'd like to see!

Encourage the hiding child to pop up and say, "Here I am!" Play until each child has a turn to hide and pop up.

Thumbodies in God's House

What You'll Do

Work with one 2-year-old at a time. Help a 2-year-old press a thumb on the ink pad and then on the inside of the church from the "Going to God's House" page. After helping the child make several prints, clean the thumb with the wipes. Let the child hold a fine-tipped marker as you use your hand to guide it. Draw faces, arms, and legs on the thumbprints. Ask the child to identify his or her parents among the thumbprint people, and label them as such. On the picture, write, "Thanks for taking me to church."

Say: We're making children in God's house.

Ask:

What can you do in God's house?

Say: God is happy when his children come to his house. VE CAN LIVE FOR GOD by going to his house.

Be sure children take their "Going to God's House" pages and give the pages to their parents as a thank-you for bringing them to church.

Encourage your hiding child to pop up and say "Here I am!"





Pleasing Pointers

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To very young children, living for God means learning to be what God wants them to be-such as good, kind, and loving. Their best role models are the ones they see in their own homes every day. Affirm that kindness and goodness are part of your family's identity: "Because we love Jesus, this is how we act in our family." Don't teach from only wrongdoing, but rather, try to find positive examples. When your child puts away a toy, say, "I like the way you're living for God by being a good helper." Your child will learn the most when your teaching connects with what he or she does and is interested in.
