Jesus Tells the Parable of the Lost Son

Luke 15:11-32



The Younger Son Demands His Inheritance

In Jewish law, the oldest son received two-thirds of the inheritance, and the rest was divided among the other children. Since it appears that there were only two sons, the younger would have been entitled to one-third of the father's holdings. However, Jewish law did not allow a person to sell his father's land inheritance because it had been given by God. So in asking his father to give him the land early, the younger son was maneuvering against the law. Any Jew would have seen what the son was doing and would have refused to buy the land. It was also against the law to sell such land to a Gentile. Since that must have been what the younger son did, the Jews listening to this story would have been appalled.

The Son Squanders His Inheritance

The next part of the story isn't hard to predict. The younger son foolishly spent his inheritance and was left with nothing. At that point, he realized how wrong he had been and decided to return to his father, hoping only that the father would accept him back as a hired hand. He was convinced that he had sacrificed his right to be his father's son. He now decided to do what he knew was right.

The Humiliated Father Forgives the Son

Because a family would not normally forgive a son for such a sin, Jesus' listeners would have been extremely surprised and angry to hear that the man ran out to meet his returning son. What Jesus described was a father intent on getting to his son before the neighbors did. Even though the son had turned away, sinned willfully, and disgraced the family name, the father was waiting to forgive his

son and save him from the death he deserved. What a wonderful picture of our God, who watchfully waits, ready to forgive us when we return to him in repentance!

The Jesus Connection

Picture a God anxious to meet you even when you feel ashamed. Know his love for you, and cherish the relationship you have with Jesus.

Say: This is a daddy, and this is his boy. One day the boy decided he didn't want to listen to his daddy anymore, so he left home. Move the boy figure far away. The daddy was very sad. He cried and cried that his boy wasn't home. Frown and then

What You'll Do

Seat a baby on your knees facing you as you do the following action rhyme together.

There was a little boy (place baby's hands on his or her knees)

Who would not do right. (Shake head, and wave baby's hands.)

He said "no" to his dad and ran into the night. (Gently bounce baby on your knees.) The boy felt sad.

The boy felt low. (Gently lay baby on his or her back.)

But his daddy soon forgave (raise baby to sitting position)

'Cause he loved his boy so! (Hug baby.)

Say: ▶ GOD IS LOVING AND FORGIVING, too.

Lost in the Pigpen

What You'll Do

Shape the Prodigal Son finger puppet around your index finger so a different picture is on each side of your finger. Tape the edges. Open your Bible to Luke 15.

Say: What do you think is in my box? Listen for a clue.

Play "Pig Sounds" (track 5); then open the box.

Say: There are little pink pigs! Our story today is about a boy who found himself living with pigs. Show the "clean boy" side of the finger puppet. This boy had a daddy who loved him very much. But the boy didn't want to obey his daddy, so he left home. The daddy couldn't find his son. Hide the finger puppet.

Ask:

How do you think the daddy felt?

Say: For a while, the boy was happy. But then he ran out of money. He didn't have enough food to eat or a place to sleep. Show the "dirty boy" side of the finger puppet. He decided to go work for a pig farmer.

Play the "Pig Sounds" again. Encourage the children to make pig sounds. Place the finger puppet in the box with the pink cotton balls, and then shake the box to cover the puppet.

Say: Poor boy, lost among the little pink pigs! How do pigs smell? Was that a nice place to live? Can you find the boy? Let a toddler dig through the cotton balls to find the puppet. That boy decided to get out of the pigpen and go home. His daddy ran out to meet him. The daddy forgave him for running away. He gave his son clean clothes and good food. The boy was happy again. God is like that daddy.

GOD IS LOVING AND FORGIVING when we make bad choices.





Father's Love

What You'll Do

Encourage one toddler at a time to hide from you as you "seek" him or her. Sing the following song to the tune of "Oh Where, Oh Where Has My Little Dog Gone?" (not on CD).

Oh where, oh where did my little boy go?
Oh where, oh where could he be?
He did something wrong,
And doubts he belongs.
Oh where, oh where can he be?

Oh there's my boy! Have you come home? How happy we will be. I'll give you a hug and all my love. How happy we will be!

Say: God is like that father! ▶ GOD IS LOVING AND FORGIVING.

Cleanup Work

What You'll Do

Give each child a copy of the "Prodigal Son" page. Put about two tablespoons of whipped topping on the boy in the picture, and encourage toddlers to "finger-paint" the boy.

Say: At home the boy was clean. When he went away, he got dirty from his bad choices. Remember how he lived in the dirt with the pigs? Sprinkle some cocoa powder over the top of each picture. Yucky! When the boy went home, his daddy forgave him and cleaned him up. Can you clean up the boy? Give each child a paper towel, and help him or her wipe the handout clean. God is like that daddy.

GOD IS LOVING AND FORGIVING. God cleans us up when we ask him to.



Tale of Two Farms

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Luke 15. Say: **Jesus told a story about a father and a son. The father loved his son very much. He took very good care of his son.**

Ask:

How do your parents take care of you? What are some rules at your house?

Give twos time to respond.

Say: The son did not want to listen to his father's rules. He decided to leave home. The father gave him a lot of money (shake the bank) and let him go, even though it made the father sad. Let's run like the son who ran away from home. Let the children run in place as you remove all the coins from the bank and place them out of the children's reach.

Shh! Listen! What's in the bank? Shake the bank. Nothing! The son lost all of his money. He sat down and cried. Have the children sit down and pretend to cry. Wait! I hear something else. Turn on the CD to "Pig Sounds" (track 5). What's that sound? The son had no money, no food, and no place to live. He was so poor that he had to live with pigs!

Ask:

■ How would you like to live with pigs? Give twos time to respond.

Say: The son was sorry he left home. He decided to go back home and ask his father if he could work on the family farm. While the son was still walking, someone came running to him. It was his father! He wanted to have a party because he was so glad to see his boy. Blow the party horn.

Spread the "Lost Son Returns" poster on the floor.

Say: Let's put some party confetti on this poster to show that the father wanted to throw a party when his son came home.

Place several dots of glue on the poster, and give each child a few pieces of confetti or bits of paper. Help kids put their confetti on the glue to decorate the poster.

Say: The father forgave his boy and hugged him tight. God is like that father. When we do bad things, God wants to forgive us because he loves us. Let's make some party noises to celebrate that ▶ GOD IS LOVING AND FORGIVING. Blow the party horn, and encourage the twos to shout and clap.



Hide!

What You'll Do

Gather the children.

Say: The boy in the story did something wrong. The boy knew he was in big trouble, so he stayed away from his father for a long time. You can hide from me in one of the boxes while I count. I'll be waiting for you. When you're ready, come to me so I can show you how the father loved his son.

Counting on a Caring God



Loving Patience

Your calmness helps your child to regain composure and to receive the powerful message, "I will care for you no matter how you act." As little ones mature, positive responses can help them learn to accept the forgiveness that Christ offers.



- Play a game of Hide-and-Seek. When you find your child, remind him or her that the father was happy when he found his lost son and that he was waiting to forgive the boy. Hug your child, and tell him or her how happy you are to see good choices.
- Take a trip to a farm or a zoo. Show your child the pigs. Remind him or her how the lost son lived with the pigs and got all dirty, but the father forgave his son for leaving home and gave him new, clean clothes.
