Jesus Is Tried and Crucified

Luke 19:28-40; 23:1-49



Jesus Enters Jerusalem on a Donkey

Jesus entered the city riding a colt in order to fulfill the Messianic prophecy in Zechariah 9:9. This was a sign that Jews had been watching for. In addition, a king riding a horse indicated that the king was going into battle, whereas a king riding a donkey was a symbol of peace.

Pilate Orders Jesus Crucified

Pilate, the Roman governor of Judea, had been less than pleasant to the Jews during his rule. He had taken money from the Temple treasury for a city water project and had brought images from the Roman Empire into the city of Jerusalem. But he knew not to go too far in his irritation of the Jews. If too many complaints about him reached Rome, he might lose his position. So he was likely feeling insecure when the Jews came to him with their request to crucify Jesus. Thus, even though it appears that Pilate felt Jesus was innocent, he was unwilling to stand up against the Jews.

It is significant that Jesus was crucified between two criminals. To the Jews, this indicated that he was a criminal. It seems likely that the religious leaders had exerted their influence to arrange for this positioning as one more way to humiliate Jesus.

Darkness Falls When Jesus Is Crucified

When Jesus died, the skies became dark from noon until 3 o'clock in the afternoon when the sun would normally have been at the height of its brilliance. There is no way to explain this darkness as a natural phenomenon. God must have darkened the sun.

The centurion mentioned in Luke 23:47 was a Roman

soldier, loyal to the emperor. Something about what happened as Jesus died made a difference in that man's life. Everyone who witnessed Jesus' death seemed to sense that something very wrong had happened (Luke 23:48).

The Jesus Connection

With all the demands on our time and attention, it's easy to forget that everything in this life is about Jesus. This one truth is woven into the very fabric of creation. What an honor to be in a loving relationship with Jesus!

Pick up a rock. What does it tell you about God? Its mere existence is a testimony to the greatness of a Creator with no beginning or end. Invest five minutes in praising God, who created you and loves you. You can write your prayer of praise here.

The People Watched

What You'll Do

Sit on the floor next to a toddler. Show him or her Jesus and the donkey. Open your Bible to Luke 19, and show the toddler the words.

Say: Our Bible tells us that Jesus sent his disciples to get a donkey. His disciples found a soft donkey for Jesus to ride. Can you help me put Jesus on the donkey's back? Allow time for the toddler to feel the felt donkey and to help place the Jesus figure on it. The donkey announced that Jesus was coming with a loud "Heehaw, heehaw."

The people who saw Jesus were happy. They pulled branches off trees and waved them. Let the toddler wave the silk leaf frond. They put their coats on the ground to show their love for Jesus. Give the toddler a fabric square to lay on the floor. Have the donkey walk across the cloth. The people shouted, "Blessed be Jesus. Praises to the King!" Jesus said, "Let the people praise," and the donkey said, "Heehaw, heehaw."

Jesus loved the people so much that he died for all the bad things they did. ▶ JESUS DIED FOR US, too.

Return the Jesus figure and the fabric squares to the Teacher Pack for later lessons.

What You'll Do

Place towels on the floor. Encourage the toddlers to step from towel to towel as you sing the following song (not on CD) to the tune of "Mary Had a Little Lamb."

Applaud and shout "Hosanna!" after you sing the last line.

Cross Reminders

What You'll Do

Call one toddler over at a time to do his or her handout.

Say: A few days after Jesus rode the donkey, he walked to a hill to die for us. When we see a cross, it reminds us that ► JESUS DIED FOR US.

Show the child how to make a cross with craft sticks. Lay down a craft stick, and encourage the toddler to put one down on top to form a cross. As you form each cross, say "Jesus." Continue forming crosses until the child's interest wanes.

Say: Jesus showed his love on the cross. Thank you, Jesus.

Blessed Is Jesus

What You'll Do

Gather the 2-year-olds on the floor next to you. Open your Bible to Luke 19, and show the words to the children.

Say: Our Bible story is about Jesus going to Jerusalem. Jesus sent his friends to get a donkey for him to ride. Jesus rode into town on the donkey. The donkey said, "Heehaw, heehaw." Can you make a sound like a donkey?

Pass the felt donkey around, and have each child make the donkey sound when the donkey comes to him or her. When the donkey returns to you, place the Jesus figure on the donkey.

Say: The people were so happy to see Jesus. They knew he was God's Son. They wanted to show Jesus how happy they were to see him. The people threw their coats on the ground for the donkey to walk on.

Give a child the fabric squares. Show him or her how to gently toss the fabric on the floor and shout "Hosanna!" Let children take turns with the fabric squares. Pass the felt donkey around again, and then walk the donkey and Jesus figure across the fabric.

Say: The people gave their happiness and praise to Jesus. Soon Jesus would give something to the people. Jesus gave his life by dying on a cross because he loved the people of Jerusalem. Jesus gave his life for the people in our town, too. Jesus died for [child's name]. Touch the craft-stick cross to each child's hand as you name each child. ► JESUS DIED FOR US. Thank you, Jesus, for dying for us.

Return the Jesus figure and the fabric squares to the Teacher Pack.

Call one 2-year-old over at a time to work on a handout.

Say: ► JESUS DIED FOR US on a cross. When we see a cross, it reminds us of Jesus' gift of love to us.

Encourage the child to use a green crayon to color the grass on the hill in the picture. Help him or her use a glue stick to glue the craft sticks in a cross shape in the middle of the picture.

Pray: Thank you, Jesus, that you loved us enough to die for us.

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Growing With Jesus

2-YEAR-OLD

Here Comes Jesus on the Donkey

Have your child be the donkey, and you hold a towel. Say the following rhyme with your child, and encourage him or her to act out the story as you go.

Here comes Jesus on a donkey. (Have the "donkey" crawl and say "Heehaw, heehaw.") The people spread their coats and sing. (Lay your towel on the floor and say, "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus!") Here comes Jesus on a donkey. (Have the donkey crawl over the towel on the floor and say "Heehaw, heehaw.") The people sing praises to the king. (Join your child in raising your hands in the air, as

hands in the air, as if cheering, and say, "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus!")

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Play Donkey Tag. Place a coat in the middle of the floor, and chase each other on hands and knees. When your child is on the coat, offer a big hug. Remind your child that people showed their love for Jesus by sharing their coats with him. Jesus showed his love by giving his life.
- Each time you see a cross this week, help your child say "Jesus."


Easter Traditions
