## **Jesus Appears to Mary**

John 20:1-18



### Mary, John, and Peter Discover an Empty Tomb

It is obvious from Mary's response and from that of the disciples that no one expected Jesus to rise from the dead.

The "other disciple" mentioned in verse 2 was John himself. Even though he arrived at the tomb first, he didn't go in immediately. Bold, impetuous Peter arrived after John and burst into the tomb to see what had happened. The body was gone, but the grave clothes were still there. In fact, the wrap that had been on Jesus' head was folded up, not tossed carelessly as a grave robber might have done. We aren't told of Peter's response, but we see that when John followed him in and saw the position of the grave clothes, John believed.

Peter and John left the tomb, but Mary couldn't. For her, the disappearance of Jesus' body was still a mystery. As she stood outside sobbing, she peered into the tomb and saw two angels sitting there. In her grief, it didn't register who or what they were. Her response to the angels' inquiry indicates that she hadn't grasped what had happened. She was sad because she thought Jesus' body had been taken away. She had no comprehension that Jesus had risen.

# Mary Doesn't Recognize the Risen Jesus

Why did Mary not recognize the Lord she was looking for when she turned around and saw him? Several factors probably contributed to her lack of recognition: She knew he was dead and was not expecting him to be alive, she may not have raised her eyes to really look at him because she didn't want to show her tears, she may not have seen clearly through her tears anyway, and Jesus was now in his glorified body—he may have looked very different from when she had last seen him.

It is interesting that Jesus repeated the same question the angels had asked Mary. The angels and Jesus were both trying to help Mary understand what had actually happened. But she just couldn't comprehend it until Jesus called her name. She knew the voice of Jesus and recognized him.

### **The Jesus Connection**

The same voice Mary heard calls to us, inviting, assuring, welcoming us into a full life with him—a timeless relationship with Jesus.

It was the resurrection of Jesus that changed everything and gave the disciples the courage they needed to face death unafraid. How is the resurrection of Christ changing the way you live? What questions do you have for God? Ask him right now. You can write your prayer here.

### Where's Jesus?

### What You'll Do

Form the Mary finger puppet around your finger, and tape the ends in place. Hold a baby on your lap so he or she can see the book.

Say: One day Mary (show the finger puppet) couldn't find Jesus. She looked in a garden to find him. Let's try to find Jesus with Mary. Lift the first sheet of bathroom tissue.

#### Ask:

Is Jesus here? What is this? Identify the objects on the page. Repeat the same process with each page until you find Jesus.

Say: Mary looked for Jesus in the garden. Can you find Jesus' picture? Help the baby sort through the plastic eggs and find the Jesus figure. When the Jesus figure is found, say: **JESUS IS ALIVE. Hooray!**

### **Egg-citing News!**

### What You'll Do

Form the Mary finger puppet around your finger, and tape the ends in place. Place the egg (with the hidden angel puppet) with several others on the floor near you. Then open your Bible to John 20, and gather a few toddlers.

Say: Last week we learned that Jesus died for us. But on Easter, we celebrate that **> JESUS IS ALIVE! Hooray!** Clap and shout.

Jesus' friend Mary (show the finger puppet) thought that she would never see Jesus again. She was very sad. But then she found two angels who asked her why she was sad. Let's see if we can find an angel. Help the toddlers open the plastic eggs until you find the angel finger puppet. Look at the sparkling angel! The angels said, "Don't look here! Jesus is alive!" How does it make you feel to know that ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE? Encourage the children's celebration.



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### **Glory Shakers**

### What You'll Do

Say: When Mary knew Jesus was alive, she was very happy. Let's make some happy noisemakers to celebrate that ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE.

Help toddlers, one at a time, pour a small handful of uncooked rice through a funnel and into one half of an empty plastic Easter egg. Do this over newspaper for easy cleanup. Before snapping the egg together, apply a line of glue around the rim. Tape around the edge so children can use the "maracas" immediately. Then demonstrate how to make music by shaking the egg. Play the song "His Great Love" (Romans 5:8) (track 7) on the CD, and have children dance and shake their maracas to the rhythm.

Say: We give glory to God on Easter because ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE.

### I've Found Him!

### What You'll Do

Give one child at a time a copy of the "Mary at the Tomb" handout. Show him or her the Mary finger puppet.

#### Ask:

■ How did Mary feel when she couldn't find Jesus? Allow the toddler to respond.

Say: Mary was very sad and worried. But then she found Jesus, and they talked together. Can you look for Jesus in this box? When the child finds a picture of Jesus, say: > JESUS IS ALIVE! Let's glue his picture next to Mary. Help the child put glue on the back of the picture of Jesus and place it next to Mary on the handout.

### **Empty Tomb**

### What You'll Do

Gather the twos, and show the children John 20 in your Bible.

Ask:

Who has gone for a walk in a garden? What are some of the sounds you heard? Give twos time to respond.

Say: **You may have heard some birds like this.** Play "Morning in the Garden, Part 1" (track 9).

Say: After Jesus died, his friends put his body in a tomb in a garden. Mary went to the garden to care for Jesus' body. Let's pretend to take a walk through the garden with Mary. We'll hold hands and walk in a circle. As soon as the children have started walking, turn on the CD player to "Morning in the Garden, Part 2" (track 10).

Say: Jesus' body wasn't in the tomb! Mary walked around the garden looking for him. She felt sad. She heard the birds singing, but something was happening that she couldn't hear. Let's find out what happened.

Have children hold hands and stand still as you play "Morning in the Garden, Part 3" (track 11). At the end, you will hear a voice call "Mary."

#### Ask:

■ Who said that? Let children respond.

Lead kids to the "Mary Sees Jesus" poster. Say: **Let's see who was calling Mary in the garden.** Let kids take turns lifting the piece of cloth on the poster to look at Jesus' picture underneath.

Say: Mary was so happy! She wanted everyone to know that ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE. We want to tell everyone, too. Let's step to the center of our circle, holding hands, and raise our arms together as we shout "Jesus is alive!" Step in and out, repeating "Jesus is alive!" We can tell our mommies, "Jesus is alive!" Step back. We can tell our daddies, "Jesus is alive!"

Repeat this process several times, naming different people who are important to twos.



### **Easter Parade**

### What You'll Do

Hold up the streamers you made earlier.

Say: Let's have an Easter parade. People have parades with noise and music on special days. Easter is a special day because Jesus is alive.

Play "His Great Love" (Romans 5:8) (track 7) on the CD. Show the children how to wave their streamers in the air as they march around the room. When the music stops, lead them in cheering ▶ "JESUS IS ALIVE!"

### **Empty-Tomb Necklaces**

### What You'll Do

Set out the pairs of egg halves you drilled earlier on a table, open end down. Work with one child at a time to poke each end of the length of yarn into the holes, using a sharpened pencil as necessary to help feed the yarn through the holes. Tie a knot at the ends of the yarn to prevent it from coming out of the holes. Let the child put the egg together (on the yarn), and hang the necklace around his or her neck.

Say: When Mary went to the tomb, there was nothing inside. Open your "empty-tomb necklace" and tell me what's inside. Encourage or help the child to open the egg and tell you what's inside. There's nothing in the tomb because JESUS IS ALIVE!

Repeat this process several times with the child.

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## **Growing With Jesus**



our child learned Jesus is alive (from John 20:1-18). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

#### **INFANT**

### Shell-ebrate!

Fill an Easter basket or a large bowl with several colorful plastic Easter eggs. Draw a simple picture of Jesus on a piece of paper, and hide the paper under the eggs. Set the basket on the floor in front of your baby.

Say: Mary looked for Jesus in the garden. Can you find Jesus' picture? Help the baby sort through the plastic eggs and find the Jesus picture. When the Jesus picture is found, say: Jesus is alive. Hooray!

#### **TODDLER**

### Glory Shakers

Make a happy noisemaker to celebrate with your toddler that Jesus is alive.

Using a funnel, help your child fill half of a plastic Easter egg with uncooked rice (or several jelly beans, if you prefer). Before snapping the egg together, apply a line of glue around the rim. Tape around the edge so your child can use the "maraca" immediately. Demonstrate how to make music by shaking the egg. Sing a song, and have vour toddler dance and shake his or her maraca to the rhythm.

Say: We give glory to God on Easter because Jesus is alive.

#### 2-YEAR-OLD

### Easter Parade

Cut a 2-foot piece of colored crepe paper streamer.

Say: Let's have an Easter parade. People have parades with noise and music on special days. Easter is a special day because Jesus is alive.

Play some cheery music as you show your child how to wave his or her streamer in the air as he or she marches around the room. When the music stops, lead your child in cheering "Jesus is alive!"



### Joyful Phrases

Your child may have picked up some new language while learning about the celebration of the Resurrection. Words like hosanna and phrases like "Jesus is alive" can be reviewed throughout the year as you listen to praise music or finish a prayer time. These words, and the context in which your child learned them, foreshadow the lifelong joy we can experience as followers of our resurrected Lord.

### Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Using a blanket, play Peekaboo. Tell your child that Jesus appeared to Mary and told her that he is alive.
- Decorate Easter eggs. Explain that the empty shells baby chicks leave behind remind us of the empty tomb Jesus left behind.
