Acts 16:9-15

t's likely that a baby perceives red, blue, yellow, and green by the age of four months. These are also likely to be the earliest colors children can identify and name—though at least one study found 2-year-olds to have a penchant for orange! While you might have a few twos who can identify purple—Lydia's color—without prompting, it's common for secondary colors to be confusing to children until they are school age.

God Alters Paul's Plans

Although Paul had other plans, he didn't hesitate to change them when he had clear direction from God in a vision. The text says that they "got ready at once to leave for Macedonia." And looking back on the effect Paul's missionary journeys had on that part of the world, we see that God's strategy in leading Paul where he did only improved Paul's original plan.

Whenever Paul came to a new city, he made it a practice to go to the local Jewish synagogue on the Sabbath to see if an opportunity would arise to share the message of Jesus with the Jews meeting there. However, there must not have been a synagogue in Philippi. It took 10 Jewish males to constitute a synagogue, but Jewish men must have been lacking. Instead, a group of Jewish or God-fearing women met at an informal meeting place outside the city. Paul and his team found this meeting and told the women there about Jesus. Paul didn't hesitate to give them his time and attention. He wanted to reach everyone he could with God's message of grace.

Lydia Becomes the First European Convert

.....

Lydia, the leader of this little group, was a dealer in purple cloth. Purple dye was extremely costly, and anyone able to deal in it had to be wealthy. For a woman to be successful and wealthy on her own was unusual in that culture, and it says a lot about Lydia. This woman was the first person in Europe who Paul led to faith in Christ.

Why were all the members of Lydia's household baptized? Though Luke concentrates on the story of Lydia, that doesn't mean that others in her family weren't present and didn't believe on their own. Her children and any servants in her household likely followed her example and believed in Jesus.

The Jesus Connection

Paul didn't waste time wondering about what God wanted. He knew. As you spend time with Jesus through Bible study and prayer, sense his will for you and make it your own.

Lydia was a standout in her society, impressive by any standard. Do you feel intimidated by others and too timid to share the love of Christ with them? Even the least "needy" need Jesus. Choose one person to share God's love with in the coming week. Pray for that person. You can write your prayer here.

What You'll Do

Show one or two toddlers your Bible, opened to Acts 16. Put the Bible next to you, and put the purple cloth on your head.

Say: Our Bible tells about a woman named Lydia. Would you like to be Lydia? Lydia made purple cloth. Put the purple cloth on a toddler's head. Lydia had lots of money. Would you like to hold the money? Pass the plastic coin to one toddler at a time. Lydia also had a lot of friends. Who are your friends? Point out some of the other children. But Lydia didn't know who this was. Show the Jesus figure. Do you know who this is? Lydia needed Jesus to be her friend. Who else needs to be friends with Jesus? You do! Touch a toddler. I do! Have the toddler touch you. **EVERYONE** NEEDS JESUS!

Allow the toddler to push the Jesus figure into the can. ► EVERYONE NEEDS JESUS!

All We Need Is Jesus

What You'll Do

Gather the 2-year-olds. Open your Bible to Acts 16. Place the purple gift bag in front of you.

Say: **Our Bible tells us about a woman named Lydia.** Hold up the purple cloth. **What's this?** Allow time for children to respond. **Lydia's job was making and selling purple cloth.** Hand the cloth to a child to hold. Then show the plastic coin. **What's this?** Let children respond. **Lydia made a lot of money by selling the purple cloth.** Hand the coin to a child to hold. **Lydia also had a lot of friends who loved her very much. Let's give our friends a hug.** Help the children put their arms around their neighbors' shoulders.

Even though Lydia had an important job, money, and friends, she was missing something from her life. Show the Jesus figure. Lydia needed Jesus. Instruct the child with the purple cloth to place it back into the gift bag. Have the child with the plastic coin also place it back into the bag. These things were important gifts Lydia had. One day she met Jesus' friend Paul. Paul told her she could love and follow Jesus. Place the Jesus figure back into the gift bag. Then give the gift bag to a child.

Say: [Child's name] can love and follow Jesus. Encourage the child to carry the bag to another child. Repeat the affirmation to each child. When each child has held the bag, say:
► EVERYONE NEEDS JESUS. Have the twos join hands and walk in a circle, singing the following song to the tune of "London Bridge" (not on CD).

"I Need Jesus" Necklace

What You'll Do

Work with one child at a time, and let him or her help you use the hole punch to place a hole near the top of the poster board cross. Then let the child string the cross onto the yarn. Tie the ends, and place the necklace around the child's neck.

Say: When you wear this necklace, the cross can remind you that we all need Jesus.

Who Do We Need?

What You'll Do

Gather your twos together in a circle.

Say: I have something special to give each of you. Show the envelopes containing the pictures of Jesus. It's a picture of something that you really need.

Ask:

• What do you think it is? Allow time for twos to respond.

Say: After I have passed out all of the envelopes and everyone has one, we'll open them together. Distribute the envelopes.

Ask:

What is in your envelope? Allow time for children to respond.

Say: You have each received a picture of Jesus because we all need Jesus. Let's make "Jesus envelopes" to give to others.

Let each child fold one of the copies of the Jesus figure and place it into an envelope. Children can lick and seal the envelopes. Ask each child whom he or she can give the picture of Jesus to. Affirm that each person they mention needs Jesus.

Growing With Jesus

Lydia had plenty of money, but she still needed Jesus. Have the toddler push the plastic coin through the slit into the can. But when Lydia found Jesus, she had all she needed. Allow the toddler to push the Jesus picture into the can.

2-YEAR-OLD

"I Need Jesus" Necklace

Cut out a cross from purple poster board. Cut a 16-inch piece of yarn. Let your 2-year-old help you use a hole punch to place a hole near the top of the cross. Then let your child string the cross onto the yarn. Tie the ends, and place the necklace around your child's neck.

Say: When you wear this necklace, the cross can remind you that we all need Jesus.





We All Need Jesus

Sociologists and educators tell us that children become aware of physical differences between people as early as two years of age. Help your child learn that regardless of our physical characteristics, we are all the same in our need of a Savior.

Jesus is all we need.



Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Gather several magazines. Cut out pictures of diverse people. Help your child glue the pictures onto a sheet of poster board. Point out the different people, and talk about each one. As you talk about the differences between each person, say, "We are all different, but we all need Jesus."
- Show your love for Jesus by sharing your Bible with your child. Show the differences between your Bible and your child's Bible. Remind your child that you need to learn more about Jesus, too.
