Paul's Jailer Believes in Jesus

Acts 16:16-34



Paul Casts a Demon Out of a Girl and Ends Up in Jail

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When Paul cast the demon out of the girl, she lost her ability to tell fortunes. Therefore, her owners saw Paul's actions as an attack on their property. They saw Paul and his companions as Jews propagating outlandish beliefs. On the basis of the owners' accusations, Paul and Silas were flogged and put in jail.

This time when God freed his servants from jail, he essentially freed everyone in the jail. Why didn't everyone flee? Perhaps they stayed because of the impression Paul and Silas had on them when they were singing hymns at midnight in spite of their chains!

The Romans dealt severely with jailers who were unable to deliver their prisoners at the appointed time. Assuming that all the prisoners had escaped as a result of the earthquake opening the gates, the jailer thought he would die at the hands of his superiors. Taking his own life seemed a better choice at that point. Only a shout from Paul stopped him. When the jailer realized that all the prisoners were still there, he was ready to accept Paul's message. And Paul's message was clear: "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved."

The Jailer Takes Paul and Silas to His Home

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It was not against any rule for the jailer to take Paul and Silas to his own home. The jailer was commissioned only to produce the prisoners when they were called for. After what had happened that night, he probably didn't fear that they would try to escape. Instead, he took care of their wounds from the flogging, gave them some good food, and rejoiced in the salvation he had received. Paul and Silas undoubtedly realized that the flogging and imprisonment they had endured were worth the joy that salvation had brought to the Philippian jailer!

The Jesus Connection

Paul and Silas were the real deal. Their actions matched their message. Your genuine relationship with Jesus is capturing the attention of others around you.

Jesus Saves the Jailer

What You'll Do

Hold a baby on your lap, and hold the teaching picture in your hands.

Say: Paul and Silas told others about Jesus. That made some people mad. Paul and Silas were put in prison. But God wanted them to keep telling people about Jesus, so God shook the jail and opened the doors. Gently shift your legs to simulate the earthquake. Bounce your knees as you say this fun rhyme.

"No!" said the jailer, "Don't run away!

I believe in your God this day."

Then Jesus saved the jailer. (Stop the "earthquake," and hug the baby.)

The Doors Flew Open!

What You'll Do

Hold an infant on your lap, and do this action rhyme.

Paul and Silas were locked in a room. (Cross the baby's wrists.)
All of a sudden, they heard a big boom! (Put baby's hands over his or her ears.)
The doors flew open, and the chains were unlocked. (Open baby's arms wide.)
The jailer grabbed his sword, but Paul said, "Stop!" (Hold up one of baby's hands.)
"How can I be saved?" the jailer asked Paul. (Hold both of baby's hands out to baby's side as if shrugging.)

"You must believe in Jesus, that is all." (Hold one of baby's hands up, and point up with one of your fingers.)

Let Jesus Come In

What You'll Do

Sit on the floor near an infant, and do this finger play.

This is the jail where Paul was kept. (Link fingertips, and then close hands around them, like in the finger play "Here Is the Church.")

The men were awake, but the jailer slept. (Turn hands over and wiggle fingers; then lean head over and close eyes for "the jailer slept.")

When the earthquake came, the building did shake. (Keep fingers linked together, and shake clasped hands back and forth.)

The doors came open, and the jailer did awake. (Unlink fingertips, move hands apart, and open eyes wide on "awake.")

"Save me, too," said the jailer just then. (Link fingertips again, and close hands around fingers; then hold up one finger and wiggle it for "jailer.")

"Open your heart, and let Jesus come in." (Turn hands over, unlink fingers, and fold hands in prayer.)

Paul's Jailer Believes

What You'll Do

Show a few toddlers your Bible, opened to Acts 16. Put the Bible and the teaching picture next to you.

Say: Our Bible tells us about a man named Paul and a man named Silas. These men told others about Jesus. That made some people mad. Some of the people put Paul and Silas in jail. One night while Paul and Silas were singing and praying, God sent an earthquake to shake the jail. Shake the teaching picture back and forth.

The earthquake made the doors of the jail come open. Let toddlers pull off the self-adhesive notes. The jailer was frightened, but Paul told him the prisoners were still there. The jailer asked Paul how he could be saved. "Believe in Jesus," Paul told him. The jailer and his whole family believed in Jesus. Jesus saved the jailer and his family. ▶ JESUS SAVES US, too.



Quake and Shake

What You'll Do

Invite a child to pretend to be Paul or Silas. Lower the side of the box you prepared, and allow the child to climb inside and be seated. Close the side of the box, and say the following rhyme.

Paul and Silas, locked in chains,

Prayed to God, and an earthquake came! (Shake the box very gently at first to make sure the child thinks it's fun. Stop shaking the box and continue the rhyme.)

Jesus saved Silas, Jesus saved Paul,

And Jesus saved the guard who watched over all.

Jesus saves all who believe.

Enjoy this finger play with your toddlers. Hold up the correct number of fingers for each line.

Paul and Silas in Jail

What You'll Do

Gather the 2-year-olds together. Open your Bible to Acts 16.

Say: The Bible tells us about a man named Paul and a man named Silas. I need you to help me tell the story of Paul and Silas. I'll tell you what I need you to do during the story. Paul and Silas loved Jesus. Show me what your face looks like when you love someone. Encourage the children to smile and look happy. Paul and Silas told other people about Jesus. Look at your neighbor and say, "Jesus loves you." Pause until each child has responded. Some people didn't want to hear about Jesus. Can you put your hands over your ears and pretend to be those people? Pause for children to cover their ears.

Some of the people got so mad that they had Paul and Silas put in jail. Can you show me a really mad face? Observe each child's mad face. Paul and Silas had chains put on their feet, and the doors were closed tight. Help me slam the doors. Have children open their arms wide and give a loud, exaggerated clap.

One night Paul and Silas were singing and praying to God. Let's sing with them. Sing "la, la, la" in a singsong voice with the children. And let's pray with them. Have the children fold their hands and bow their heads.

All of a sudden, a mighty earthquake came. God sent an earthquake to shake the jail. Show children how to shake, rock back and forth, and bounce up and down. The doors flew open. Put your hands together in front of you, and then throw them open wide. Have the children do the same. And the chains came off.

The guard was really afraid! He thought the prisoners had escaped. He would be in big trouble! Show me a scared look. Look at children's scared faces. But Paul said to the jailer, "Do not be afraid. We are all still here." The jailer asked Paul how he could be saved, too. Paul told him he must believe in Jesus. Jesus saved the jailer and the jailer's family.

JESUS SAVES US, too.
