

Ruth Is Faithful

Ruth 1:1-22

he first step for children in building friendships is known as parallel play. In parallel play, children play side by side without true interaction. Children in your nursery will still be in this stage, but that doesn't mean that they won't interact with your encouragement. Place babies face to face, and allow them to touch each other gently under your supervision. Hold two toddlers on your lap at the same time. Play passing games with twos. Call classmates friends. These are the "baby steps" to rich relationships.

Ruth Is Faithful

Ruth 1:1-22



Naomi Loses Her Husband and Sons

With her husband and sons dead, Naomi was in a bad situation. In that day, widows were often ignored or mistreated and were nearly always poor. Naomi had no male relatives in Moab to take care of her, so after she heard that the famine in Israel was over, she must have decided that her chances were better there. This journey must have been prompted by desperation, because Israel and Moab were bitter enemies. The Moabites had refused Israel passage through their land during the exodus from Egypt. In addition, Moab was one of Israel's oppressors during this time.

Naomi's insistence that Orpah and Ruth remain in Moab was extremely selfless. After all, she could have used their help. She was not a young woman, and she was setting out on what was likely a difficult journey through rugged terrain around the southern end of the Dead Sea.

But she knew that it would be easier for them if they stayed in their homeland. The chances were good that Ruth and Orpah would be treated as outcasts in Israel.

Ruth Refuses to Abandon Her Mother-in-Law

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When Naomi first told her daughters-in-law to return to their families, Orpah refused (Ruth 1:10). When Naomi insisted, however, Orpah agreed to turn back (Ruth 1:11-14). Ruth, on the other hand, persisted, perhaps because she had put her faith in the God of Israel (Ruth 1:16-17; 2:12).

Naomi's bitterness (Ruth 1:13, 20-21) no doubt grew out of the severe hardships she had faced. At that point in her life, she had apparently not realized the power and provision of the God she served. But God took care of her anyway! This story of friendship and loyalty is especially heartwarming when it is considered in the context of the times, when killing, immoral living, and the rejection of everything right was the norm. Ruth demonstrated true love and friendship to Naomi at a time Naomi desperately needed them.

The Jesus Connection

Jesus is a faithful friend to us, and he's pleased when we seek to be like him by being faithful to our friends—and loving them no matter what.

When have you been tempted to abandon a friendship for your own advantage? Reread Ruth 1:16-17. Have you ever had a friend like that? Ask God to help you live out that kind of loyalty in your friendships. You can write your prayer here.

Sing and Celebrate

What You'll Do

3 WEAVING FAITH

Toy Squeak

What You'll Do

Hold a squeaking toy in your hand.

Say: I have a toy to share with you. Squeak the toy near your face, and laugh at the sound. Then gently touch baby's tummy with the toy. Now you have the squeaking toy. Would you share it with me? Return the toy to the position near your face, squeak it, and then laugh. Repeat this, laughing and smiling as an encouragement for baby to laugh with you. You are learning to share. You are learning to be a good friend. ► GOD WANTS YOU TO LOVE YOUR FRIENDS. I love you! Hug baby.



Make a Friend Happy

What You'll Do

Say: The Bible tells about Naomi and Ruth. They were friends. Friends make each other happy. Gently bounce baby on your knees as you say the following poem:

Make a friend happy, laugh and play. Make a friend happy all the day. Smile and pat, pray and sing. Make a friend happy in everything! (*Tickle baby.*)

Friends like to laugh together. Maybe Ruth and Naomi laughed together. Naomi and Ruth loved each other. ► GOD WANTS YOU TO LOVE YOUR FRIENDS, too.

Friends Who Shared

What You'll Do

Gather one or two toddlers. Open your Bible to Ruth 1.

Say: Ruth and Naomi were on their way to Naomi's home. They were probably thirsty as they walked in the hot sun. What do you drink when you're thirsty? I have some water to share with you. Pour a small amount of water into a cup for each toddler. Ruth and Naomi may have shared their water because they were friends. Point to Ruth and Naomi in the teaching picture. I have a water bag for them. It's soft like the ones in the Bible. Touch it. Hold the piece of felt in your hand, and let each child stroke it. Then attach it to a hand in the teaching picture. Friends share. Move the felt to the other person's hand. Naomi and Ruth shared everything. Sharing shows that we love someone. GOD WANTS YOU TO LOVE YOUR FRIENDS.

What You'll Do

Take one or two toddlers by the hand.

Say: Let's take a walk like Ruth and Naomi did. We will need food and water for our journey. I have a bottle of water and a bowl for food. Lead the way along the path. Repeat the journey until every child who wants to walk the path has had a turn.

Hand each child several wheat cereal squares, and help children glue the cereal squares onto their bowl pictures. Then say: Ruth and Naomi shared their food as they traveled. They shared because they were friends, and friends love each other. ► GOD WANTS YOU TO LOVE YOUR FRIENDS.

A Heart of Love

What You'll Do

Gather the twos, and open your Bible to Ruth 1.

Say: Naomi and Ruth walked together toward Naomi's home. Ruth loved her friend Naomi. Naomi loved her friend Ruth. Show the children the teaching picture. Hearts remind us of love. Let's put hearts on our picture to remind us of the love these friends shared. Let children attach the hearts to the hands in the picture. They can move the hearts back and forth to demonstrate the shared love.

Ask:

- How can we show love to our friends? Affirm children's answers.
- Say: **GOD WANTS YOU TO LOVE YOUR FRIENDS.**

Pray: Thank you, God, for teaching us to be loving friends. In Jesus' name, amen.

Happy Faces and Smiles

What You'll Do

Help the children sit in a circle around you. Press three or four smiley-face stickers on the back of each child's hand and on your hand.

Say: Naomi was happy that Ruth was her friend. Maybe Naomi smiled. This smiley-face sticker reminds me to smile. Take a sticker from your hand and press it on the hand of a child. Here's a sticker, and here's my smile. Smile broadly. Now I think I'll give a sticker and a smile to someone else. Can you share a sticker and a smile with the person sitting by you? Guide children in pressing their stickers on other children's hands. Be sure that each child has some stickers and that no one is overlooked.

Say: You made your friends smile. SOD WANTS YOU TO LOVE YOUR FRIENDS.

Grain Sharing

What You'll Do

Say: ► GOD WANTS YOU TO LOVE YOUR FRIENDS. Ruth and Naomi were friends, and they shared everything. Ruth gathered grain so that they could eat special meals together. Let's make a special grain meal you can give to a friend to show your love.

Help each child tear open a packet of instant oatmeal and pour it into a resealable plastic bag. Let him or her add a spoonful of sugar and a sprinkle of cinnamon, and then zip the bag closed. Tape the oatmeal packets to the outside of the plastic bags so that parents will know how much water to add to the cereal. When the children have finished the project, encourage them to give their "grain" to friends in the class, making sure everyone receives cereal to take home.

INFANT

Make a Friend Happy

Say: The Bible tells about Naomi and Ruth. They were friends. Friends make each other happy.

Gently bounce your baby on your knees as you say the following poem: Make a friend happy, laugh and play. Make a friend happy all the day. Smile and pat, pray and sing. Make a friend happy in everything! (Tickle baby.)

TODDLER

Take your toddler by the hand.

Say: Let's take a walk like Ruth and Naomi did. We will need food and water for our journey. I have a bottle of water and a bowl for food. About halfway through your walk, give the bowl and water bottle to your child. You will need food and water on the trip, too. I want to share with you because you are my friend.

Complete the second half of your walk.

Draw smiley faces on five or six circle stickers. Press two or three smiley-face stickers on the back of your child's hand and on your hand.

Say: Naomi was happy that Ruth was her friend. Maybe Naomi smiled. This smiley-face sticker reminds me to smile. Take a sticker from your hand and press it on the hand of your child. Here's a sticker, and here's my smile. Smile broadly. Now I think I'll give another sticker and smile to you. Can you share a sticker and a smile with me? Guide your child in pressing his or her stickers on your hands.

That makes me smile! God wants you to love your friends, too.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:


