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Samson Receives Strength From God

Judges 15:9-16; 16:4-30

The Nazarite Vow

Before he was born, Samson was set apart to live the life of a Nazarite (Judges 13:2-7). A Nazarite abstained from wine, never used a razor, and avoided contact with any dead body.

Even though Samson was declared a Nazarite, he likely adhered only to the second of these practices. In fact, an examination of his life as described in Judges 14–16 reveals that he was not a particularly religious or even morally upright person. Even so, God selected him and used him mightily in delivering Israel from the Philistines.

Samson's Great Victories and Failures

In spite of his great victories for Israel, Samson is especially known for his failure. He could have led Israel to a position of great strength. He could have led people back to God. He could have wiped out the Philistines, preventing them from ever bothering Israel again. Instead, he confided in the foreign woman whom he apparently loved, but who was set on his destruction. Even so, the New Testament doesn't remember Samson as a failure. In Hebrews he is listed among those who faithfully served God (Hebrews 11:32).

In spite of his failings, Samson had kept his vow to keep his hair long. When he told Delilah the secret of his strength and his hair was cut, everyone could see that God was no longer working in Samson's life.

Samson, Humiliated by Philistines, Is Redeemed

The temple in which Samson was mocked was not only a temple to the god Dagon, but it was also an entertainment center. Thousands crowded into the temple to see Samson in disgrace. They even gathered on the roof to see the spectacle below. Archaeological evidence has revealed that one type of ancient temple was supported by two central wood pillars on marble bases. His strength renewed by God, Samson was able to push those pillars off their bases, thereby collapsing the whole roof and killing everyone under and on top of it.

The Jesus Connection

It's great to have a friend in Jesus! When we mess up, he's always there to forgive us.

Samson had unbelievable strength that he started out using for God. But then he messed up—big time! When have you felt you've really messed up? How has that failure affected your serving God? Talk to God about that. You can write your prayer here.

What You'll Do

Sing or listen to "I Wanna Shout!" (track 4) to the tune of "John Jacob Jingleheimer Schmidt" anytime during the lesson. Sing as you rock, feed, or play with infants. As you sing, point the baby's hands toward him or her on the word "me." Place his or her hands by the mouth when you sing "shout," and raise baby's arms up high on "hooray."

When singing, lay an infant on his or her back. On the words "Say, say, oh friend," roll the baby's hands one over the other. On "trust," place one of baby's hands over his or her heart, and on "God," raise the same hand toward heaven.

Sing and Celebrate

What You'll Do

Sing "I Wanna Shout!" (track 4) to the tune of "John Jacob Jingleheimer Schmidt" anytime during the lesson. As you sing, help toddlers do the hand motions suggested in the parentheses. Repeat the song several times, and help toddlers move their hands and arms.

God gave some special gifts to me. (Pretend to hold a gift.) Watch and you'll see! (Make "binoculars" over eyes.) Oh, when I think about (point to temple) My gifts I wanna shout, (cup hands around mouth) "Hooray! Our God gave these gifts to me!" (Pretend to hold a gift.) Tra-la-la-la-la-la-la! (Repeat.)

Sing "Say, Say, Oh Friend" (not on CD) to the tune of "Say, Say, Oh Playmate" anytime during the lesson. Hold a toddler on your knee, facing you. Set the Samson picture on a table.

Say: Samson was a mighty man. God gave him a good gift of strength. Can you show me your strong muscles?

Samson used his strength to protect God's people from enemies. Here are some enemies of God. Stack two or three blocks to create the enemies. The bad men wanted to stop Samson, but God made Samson stand strong. Move the Samson picture on the box to topple the blocks. Samson used his good gift to keep God's people safe. God gives you good gifts to help others, too! Stack the blocks again, and let toddlers take turns moving Samson to topple the enemies. ► GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS.

Give each child a copy of the "God's Good Gifts" handout, and set out crayons. Have children each draw a picture of their family on the front of the gift picture. Sing and Celebrate

What You'll Do

Sing "I Wanna Shout" (track 4) to the tune of "John Jacob Jingleheimer Schmidt" anytime during the lesson. Before you sing, show the children how to do the suggested motions in the parentheses.

God gave some special gifts to me. (Pretend to hold a gift.) Watch and you'll see! (Make "binoculars" over eyes.) Oh, when I think about (point to temple) My gifts I wanna shout, (cup hands around mouth) "Hooray! Our God gave these gifts to me!" (Pretend to hold a gift.) Tra-la-la-la-la-la-la! (Repeat.)

Sing "Say, Say, Oh Friend" (not on CD) to the tune of "Say, Say, Oh Playmate" anytime during the lesson. Group the children in pairs. Let the children hold hands and wiggle around on the line "Say, say, oh friend." On the word "trust," have each child place a hand over his or her heart. For "God," have the children raise their hands above their heads. On "forevermore," have the children hold hands again and jump up and down.

Say, say, oh friend, Trust God in all you do. Trust God in work and play. Trust God in night and day. Say, say, oh friend, Trust God to be with you. Trust God; his word is true forevermore!





Blown Away

What You'll Do

Gather the children, and show them the picture of Samson.


Say: God gave Samson a good gift. God made Samson a very strong man. Samson protected God's people. Bad people got angry with Samson and wanted to take him away. Have the children pretend that the lunch sacks are the bad people. Have them stand the sacks up all around Samson.

But strong Samson chased the bad people away. Show the children how to blow on the sacks and knock them over. All the enemies were gone. Samson got rid of them as easily as you did. Samson used his gift to protect God's people from their enemies. Gather the children around you, and have them sit in a circle. Place the "Samson" poster in the middle of the circle. Hand each child one or two strands of yarn.

God gave Samson a great gift of strength. God promised Samson that he would be strong for his whole life if he never, ever cut his hair. Since Samson didn't cut his hair, it grew and grew and grew! Let's glue this yarn onto the picture of Samson so he'll have really long hair.

Use a glue stick around Samson's head, and then help the children stick their yarn strands onto the wet glue.

Say: Look how long Samson's hair is now. He must be really, really strong. God gave Samson a good gift. God gave you good gifts, too. What are you good at? Point out how each child's gifts are from God. ► GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS.

What You'll Do

Gather the children in a circle.

Say: Let's play a game called I Can. I will say a sentence like "I can sweep the floor." Your job is to act out whatever I say.

Say the following sentences, and act out motions for the children to imitate. If a child has an idea for an "I can," lead the group in acting out the idea.

- I can dust the table.
- I can hug a friend.
- I can say, "I love you."
- I can pick up toys.

Have the group sit down.

Say: You all have many things you can do. God gave you good gifts. You can use your "I cans" to serve God. ► GOD GIVES GOOD GIFTS to us all.

Show the children how to make a simple fulcrum with a yardstick and a building block. Show them how easy it is to lift stuffed toys with the fulcrum. Let the children take turns lifting the toys as you say this verse:

Say: Samson was strong, and so am I. I can lift this toy up high! Samson used his gifts; I can, too! I'll serve God in all I do.

Balanced Discipline

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As children mature, they will learn how to use gifts to effect change. We can see this skill in process as children try to change our minds by smiling at us while doing the precise things they have just been corrected for. Seek to respond to these challenges by affirming your child's uniqueness while holding firm on the issue. For example, as you remove your child from the situation, say, "You have a beautiful smile, and that's still a no-no." Affirming a gift as you offer correction will help keep your discipline balanced.

- Identify some of God's good gifts by placing gift bows on them.


