

God Answers Hannah's Prayer 1 Samuel 1:1-28

The feeling of sadness usually comes about the same time a baby experiences separation anxiety. Sadness may include crying and usually includes withdrawal. Fortunately sadness usually abates, and things quickly return to normal when the primary caregiver comes back. But sadness does have a positive side—it is the precursor to empathy. Babies who have felt sad become toddlers who try to help others who are hurt or unhappy.

God Answers Hannah's Prayer

1 Samuel 1:1-28



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Unable to Have Children

To understand the pain caused by Hannah's childlessness, one must realize how important it was in Old Testament times that women provide children. A woman who couldn't conceive was an embarrassment, or even a disgrace, to her husband. Adding to Hannah's pain were the taunts of Elkanah's other wife, Peninnah, a situation that illustrates the strife that the practice of polygamy can create. Even Elkanah's love for Hannah and his words of encouragement could not comfort her.

Hannah Bitterly Prays to God for a Child

Hannah provides a great example of what we should do when we are hurting. "In bitterness of soul Hannah wept much and prayed" (1 Samuel 1:10). She poured out her heart—even her bitterness—to God. Her prayer was so anguished that Eli, the priest, assumed she was drunk! God wants to hear from us when we're hurting, and yes, even when we're bitter or angry at him.

Hannah's prayer and God's answer to it warn us of an important truth: If we make a vow to God, we must be ready to fulfill it. Hannah vowed that if God gave her a son, she would give him fully to the service of the Lord.

Hannah Gives Samuel to God

When Samuel was born, Hannah lived up to her vow. As soon as Samuel was old enough to live without his mother (sometime after he was about 3 years old), she took him to Eli at the tabernacle and gave him to the service of the Lord. Samuel grew up there, no doubt performing simple tasks for Eli.

The Jesus Connection

We all experience hurts and sadness, and Jesus experienced those things, too. We can always know that he's right there with us, listening and answering our prayers.

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Reread 1 Samuel 1:12-20. How does God respond to us when we cry out in anguish and grief? What sadness, pain, or grief do you need to pour out to God? It's great to know we serve a God who cares about our human hurts. Turn to God in prayer, and leave your pain with him today. When Baby Starts to Cry

What You'll Do

When an infant cries, pick him or her up, and sing the following song to the tune of "Give Me Oil in My Lamp" (not on CD). Use the baby's name, and do the motions mentioned. Replace "hug" with "walk," "rock," or other comforting motions and movements.

When [baby's name] starts to cry, I will hug [him or her].
When [baby's name] starts to cry, I'll pray. (Say, "Help this baby!")
When [baby's name] starts to cry, I will hug [him or her].
And I'll say some words the Lord might say:

"How I love you! How I love you! How I love you when you're feeling sad. How I love you! How I love you! How I want you to feel glad!"

Say: ► TURN TO GOD WHEN YOU'RE SAD, little one.

God Wipes Away Our Tears

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to 1 Samuel 1.

Say: Here is Hannah; she's very sad. Her eyes are full of tears. (Squeeze a couple of drops of water from the sponge onto each of Hannah's eyes.)

She wants a little baby. She's wanted one for years. (Give a 2-year-old a tissue, and let him or her wipe away the water.)

Hannah asked God for a baby, a baby that she could love. (Squeeze a couple of drops of water from the sponge onto each of Hannah's eyes.)

God sent her a baby boy, a gift from above. (Give a 2-year-old a tissue, and let him or her wipe away the water.)

Then Hannah was no longer sad. Her tears were wiped away. Hannah had a baby boy, the baby for whom she prayed.

Turn the page protector over to show the side with the child's face.

Ask:

■ What might make this child sad? As children offer suggestions, drop water from the sponge on the child's face.

Say: God can help children who feel sad. Remember what Hannah did when she was sad? Hannah turned to God. She prayed. You can ▶ TURN TO GOD WHEN YOU'RE SAD. God will help you dry your tears. Give the 2-year-olds tissues, and encourage them to dry the child's face.

Pray: Thank you, God, for caring when we're sad. Help us always turn to you. In Jesus' name, amen.

Gather the 2-year-olds, and have them form a circle. Have a basket and a doll nearby. Sing the following song to the tune of "Mulberry Bush" (not on CD), and direct children in the actions:

How does my baby feel? (Pause for the 2-year-old to answer the question.)



Time for Sadness

Sad feelings are an important part of developing empathy. If caregivers deal with sadness sympathetically and constructively, children will learn to help others likewise. Instead of rushing to alleviate sadness, help children determine what things help them get through it, such as extra hugs, quiet time, and talking to God about their feelings.

Play this game with your child using a doll.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Sing this song to the tune of "When the Saints Go Marching In" when your child feels sad:

 Oh, when you're sad and feeling blue,
 Oh, when you're sad and feeling blue,
 He will help you feel brand new!
- Create a special box filled with two or three toys that are played with only when your child needs a lift. Pray with your child about his or her feelings, and let your child tell you when he or she is ready to put the box away and go back to regular activities.
