

God Speaks to Samuel

1 Samuel 3:1-21

When a baby recognizes the sound of her mother's voice, a toddler looks up at the mention of his name, or a 2-year-old responds to an "I love you," it is evidence of the child's language development. Young children learn to respond first to the sound of a parent's voice, then to tones of voice, and finally to the content of the message. Listening to God requires not the ability to process sound but rather an awareness of how God speaks through his Word and the works of people.

God Speaks to Samuel

1 Samuel 3:1-21



Samuel Thinks Eli Calls Him in the Night

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Both Samuel and Eli had gone to bed for the night when God called out to Samuel. Perhaps Samuel was accustomed to calls for assistance from Eli, who was losing his eyesight (1 Samuel 3:2). At first, Eli might well have thought Samuel had been dreaming when he heard a voice calling his name. First Samuel 3:7 explains that Samuel "did not yet know the Lord." This doesn't mean that Samuel didn't understand who the Lord is or hadn't really been serving him; he simply had never before received a direct revelation from God. So it is not surprising that the boy continued to return to Eli when he was called.

When Eli realized that Samuel was hearing a call from God, he didn't get up, go with Samuel, and hear what God had to say. He knew that whatever God wanted to say to Samuel was between God and the boy. The prophecy Samuel received echoed the words of a prophecy Eli had received from a "man of God" earlier. Because Eli's sons had dishonored God in their priestly duties, that prophecy predicted the death of Eli's sons and their replacement by a priest who would be faithful to God (1 Samuel 2:27-36).

Samuel Shares God's Difficult Message With Eli

The prophecy given to Samuel made it clear that Eli had not raised his sons properly and that Eli would be punished. As difficult as it must have been for Samuel to pronounce judgment upon the priest he served, Samuel faithfully reported to Eli what God had said.

From 1 Samuel 3:19-21 it is clear that this was the first of many times God spoke to Samuel. Samuel grew up listening to God. The phrase "from Dan to Beersheba" (1 Samuel 3:20) was used to describe the entire Promised Land. Samuel became God's mouthpiece to the nation of Israel. He listened when

God appeared to him, and "Samuel's word came to all Israel" (1 Samuel 3:21).

The Jesus Connection

In our relationship with Jesus, God sometimes speaks to us through the Bible or God's people. When he does, he wants us to listen and obey.

What does it mean to really listen to God? What might

God be guiding you to do? Pray that your ears will be open to hear God speaking to you. You can write you prayer here.

What You'll Do

Wiggly Ears

What You'll Do

Show the teaching picture to a baby.

Say: This is Samuel. One night when Samuel was sleeping, God talked to him.

Samuel listened with his ears. Wiggle the ears on the teaching picture. You have ears, too. Touch the baby's hands to his or her ears. You can ► LISTEN TO GOD, too.



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Here I Am

What You'll Do

Hold an infant on your lap so he or she is looking up at you.

Say: There was a boy named Samuel whom God called. Cover the baby's eyes with his or her hands. Samuel? Samuel? Pull baby's hands away from his or her face while you say: Speak, Lord, your servant is listening. You can ► LISTEN TO GOD.

Repeat the game using the baby's name instead of Samuel's.

Get Up, Samuel

What You'll Do

Do this action rhyme with a baby:

Say: Samuel went to sleep. (Lay baby on his or her back.)
He thought he heard his name. (Touch baby's ears.)
He ran to the room from where the voice came. (Pedal baby's feet as if running.)
Eli said, "No, (shake head "no")
It was God who called your name. (Touch baby's mouth.)
Listen and obey God, child!" (Touch baby's hands to his or her ears.)
And [baby's name] can do the same. (Gently tickle baby's tummy.)

Sing and Celebrate

What You'll Do

Slumber Party

What You'll Do

Rest on the blankets with one or two toddlers.

Say: God tried to talk to grown-ups, but the grown-ups wouldn't listen. Put your hands over your ears. Then God spoke to the boy Samuel while he was sleeping. God called, "Samuel, Samuel!" Hold up the teaching picture, and wiggle Samuel's ears. Can you call Samuel's name? Encourage the toddlers to call out to Samuel. Whenever a child says "Samuel," wiggle the ears on the teaching picture.

Samuel used his ears to listen to God. God told Samuel he was special. Whisper into each toddler's ear: You are special, too. Then say aloud: You can ► LISTEN TO GOD, just as Samuel did.

I'm All Ears

What You'll Do

Starting with the shortest tube, hold the tube to a toddler's ear and softly speak a short message such as "You can listen to God." Let the toddler take a turn speaking through the tube next to your ear as well. Be prepared for children who will speak loudly through the tube into your ear. Continue using the different sizes of tubes, varying the volume of your voice.

Say: God speaks to us. We need to ► LISTEN TO GOD.

Big Ears

What You'll Do

Work with one toddler at a time.

Say: Samuel used his ears to listen to God. Let's make listening ears for you! Help the child tape a chenille spiral to each ear cutout. Then bend the wire, and adjust it over the child's head so that the paper ears cover his or her own. Let the child look in a mirror.

You can use your ears to listen to Mommy. You can use your ears to listen to me. You can use your ears to listen to Daddy, and you can use your ears to ► LISTEN TO GOD.

Night Noises Easy Prep

Night Noises

What You'll Do

Place the CD player in the story area, and invite the twos to come and lie down on the blankets together. Open your Bible to 1 Samuel 3.

Say: Our Bible story is about a boy named Samuel. Let's pretend to be sleepy Samuel, who lived in God's house. At night he might have heard many noises. Listen to these noises and tell me what you think they are.

Play the "Night Noises" segment (track 8), and let the children guess what the noises are. Pause the CD after the first time Samuel's name is called.

Say: Samuel thought his friend, Eli, had called his name. He got up and ran to Eli's room. Walk across the room to where the "Samuel Hears God's Voice" poster is hanging, and ask the children to follow you to "Eli's room." Have the kids form a line in front of the poster.

Say: I'll bet it was really dark and hard for Samuel to see Eli. Let's take turns closing our eyes and pretending it's really dark as we look for Eli.

Help the first child in line close his or her eyes and feel on the poster for the flannel blanket covering Eli.

Say: Find the soft blanket covering Eli. Good job-now wake him up. Eli! Eli!

Give each child a turn looking for Eli in the dark.

Say: But it wasn't Eli who called. Eli said, "Go back to bed!" Have the children return to the blankets. Continue the track to the next time Samuel is called, and then pause the CD again. Samuel was sure it was Eli this time. Have the children follow you back to Eli's room. But Eli didn't call Samuel. Eli told Samuel that God was talking to him. He told Samuel to go listen for God. Have the children lie on the blankets again, and play the last segment of the track. Samuel sat up and said, "Speak, God. I'm listening."

Ask:

Who is listening to me?

Say: I want to tell you something special. Whisper into each child's ear: God loves you. Then say aloud: God talked to Samuel and told him special things. You can listen to me, and you can LISTEN TO GOD, too.

Verse Rehearse

What You'll Do

Have the children lie down again on the spread-out blankets. Have the children listen for you to call their names. When you call each child's name, have him or her jump up and say, "Speak, Lord, I'm listening" and then return to a sleeping position. You may need to say the words with the child whose name is called. Repeat this process until every child has had a turn.

Say: You're learning to listen as Samuel learned to listen. You can ► LISTEN TO GOD.

Listening Ears

What You'll Do

Give each child a paper plate, and encourage the children to draw faces on their plates with crayons. Give each child two ears.

Ask:

Where are your ears?

Say: Let's tape these ears in the right place on our paper-plate faces. We can remember that Samuel's ears were in the right place at the right time. Samuel listened to God. You can ► LISTEN TO GOD, too.

Help the children tape the ears to the sides of the paper plates.

Growing With Jesus



Way to Grow

Young children learn to respond first to the sound of a parent's voice, then to tones of voice, and finally to the content of a message. Spiritual awareness progresses in much the same way. First your child will learn from you what God is like, then he or she will form an impression of God's Word, and finally your child will understand the content of God's messages. Each step is crucial in the lifelong process of knowing God. our child learned to listen to God (from 1 Samuel 3:1-21). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

Here I Am

Hold your infant on your lap so he or she is looking up at you.

Say: There was a boy named Samuel whom God called. Cover the baby's eyes with his or her hands. Samuel? Samuel? Pull baby's hands away from his or her face while you say: Speak, Lord, your servant is listening. You can listen to God.

TODDLER

I'm All Ears

Collect cardboard tubes of different lengths, such as a paper-towel tube cut in two, a full-size tube, and a wrapping-paper tube. Starting with the shortest tube, hold the tube up to your toddler's ear and softly speak a short message such as "You can listen to God." Let vour toddler take a turn speaking through the tube next to your ear as well. Continue using the different sizes of tubes, varying the volume of your voice.

Say: God speaks to us. We need to listen to God.

2-YEAR-OLD

Verse Rehearse

Have your child lie down on a spread-out blanket on the floor and listen for you to call his or her name. Then have him or her jump up and say, "Speak, Lord, I'm listening" and then return to a sleeping position. Repeat a few times.

Say: You're learning to listen as Samuel learned to listen. You can listen to God.



Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Help your child record his or her voice on a digital recorder. Record a message yourself. Play the recordings back, and ask your child to identify who is speaking. Tell your child you hope that he or she listens to hear God's messages, too.
- Read a Bible story in a whisper. Remind your child that Bible stories help us hear God's voice.
